Freedom of Information Request.

Under freedom of information legislation, I would like copies of all electronic communications received or sent by West Mercia PCC John-Paul Campion which include the word Mirror in the subject line, body of the email, text or any attachment between March 7, 2018, and the present day (13th July 2018).

Response.

Dear Madam,

I write in connection with your request for information which was received on the 13th July 2018. Please find below the response to your request:

Please be advised that the information that you have requested is not available in a readily retrievable format and would require significant amount of effort to retrieve and process it. Our office has undertaken a considerable amount of work to attempt to fulfil your request. However, it is apparent that cannot be achieved within the appropriate allocation of time and resource, as determined by legislation. This is due to the high volume of emails sent to and from the PCC, along with the sizeable content some of them contain.

Therefore the cost of providing you with the information is above the amount to which we are legally required to respond i.e. the cost of locating and retrieving the information exceeds the 'appropriate level' as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004.

In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000, this letter acts as a Refusal Notice for this request.

Complaints
