Reserves: £2.78m Council Tax: £102.3m


How the money is spent?

In 2020/21 we plan to spend £260.2m before income and use of reserves. Our day-to-day spending (net of fees, specific grants and reserves) is £233.022m. The expenditure on police services has increased by £17.3m.
