




Overall victim satisfaction for 'Whole Experience' was at 80% in March, consistent with the previous months and a small increase in the past six months.

Burglary has decreased nationally by 7% in the year to December, 2019 and there have been (actual numbers as yet unavailable) decreases as a result of the COVID-19 lockdown.

There has been activity in this area that has led to the positive identification of drug activity and offences including the identification of a number of cannabis grows and activity by the LPPTs.

It is assessed that this reduction is likely due to more accurate recording of CSE according to the definition, rather than an actual reduction. A more accurate picture of is constantly developing.

Offences Outcomed

- 79,156 offences were recorded/outcomed during 2019/20
 - 1.3% decrease compared to 2018/19 (78,148)
- 91% (79,156) of all offences recorded during 2019/20 (87,288) were assigned an outcome within the 12 month period.
 - This outcome rate remains stable with 2018/19 (91%)

Action Taken

- 12% (9,588) of offences recorded during 2019/20 (79,156) were assigned an 'action taken' outcome within the period.
 - This proportion rate remains stable with 2018/19 (12%)



 - 10% increase in the number of offences resulting in 'no action taken'







Of the 7,508 offences outcomed in March:

- 1,171 (16%) resulted in an 'action taken' outcome. This is a 23% increase in volume returning to a similar level seen prior to February.
- The proportion rate (16%) is a 2 percentage point increase on February (14%) and the highest seen since October 19 (16%).
- 2,324 (31%) offences resulted in Outcome 16 in March. This is an increase in volume and proportion compared to February (2,006, 29%).
- Outcome 16's proportion rate continues to remain stable within a range of 28% to 32% since May 19.

Total Outcomes







Of the 7,508 offences outcomed in March:

- 1,023 (14%) offences resulted in Outcome 15 in March compared to 877 offences (13%) in February.
- This is the highest monthly volume and monthly proportion rate seen across the entire time period.

- Outcome 14 has remained relatively stable in March (8.3%) compared to February (8.2%) in terms of proportion rate.
- There has been an 11% increase in the number of offences assigned Outcome 14 in March (624) returning to levels seen prior to February (564).





Violence with injury












Of the 1.565 DA offences outcomed in March:

- 218 (14%) resulted in an 'action taken' outcome. This is a 55% increase in volume compared to February (141) and the highest volume seen since August 18 (249)
- The proportion rate (14%) is a 3 percentage point increase on February (11%) and the highest proportion rate seen since May 19 (15%)

 60% (940) of DA offences resulted in Outcome 16 in March. This is a 13% growth in volume but a decrease in the proportion rate compared to February (832, 64%)






Of the 1,565 DA offences outcomed in March:



South Worcestershire Child at Risk




The continuing increase in reporting is possibly due to an increased focus on the correct application of keywords and a change in the dissemination of cyber crime by the NFIB with the addition of the national aim to investigate all cyber offences.





Call Handling - 999









10,512 calls on the 999 system were received in March; a decrease compared to February (11,339). The abandoned rate improved slightly from 1.6% to 1.1%.

The proportion of 999 calls answered within 10 seconds in March (92%) has increased compared with February (89%) and is above the target (90%). Current performance is 3% above the baseline (89%).

Call Handling - 101







33,082 non-emergency calls were received in March, a decrease compared to February (38,341). The abandoned rate (11%) improved slightly compared with the previous month (8.0%).

The proportion of calls answered in 30 seconds has increased to 78% in March compared to 64% in February but remains below the expected standard (80%). Current performance is 17% above the baseline (61%).
