Section One Introduction & Methodology, Summary & Respondent Breakdown



Introduction & Methodology

- West Mercia Police (WMP) & the Police and Crime Commissioner, John Campion, seek to obtain the views of residents, including their confidence in WMP, to inform the PCC's plan priorities and support decision making around the Safer West Mercia agenda
- WMP & the OPCC commissioned SMSR, a third party research agency, to conduct surveys over the phone and face to face with West Mercia residents and victims of crime
- The questionnaire includes key questions taken from the Crime Survey for England and Wales (CSEW) and the 2018 Report on Public Perceptions of Policing in England and Wales (PPPEW)
- Where relevant, comparisons with CSEW AND PPPEW are displayed. Comparisons with CSEW include the average score of forces included in West Mercia Police's most similar group (MSG)**. Where comparisons have been made, results have been consistently analysed in accordance with this external reporting
- Over the 12 month period (July 19 June 20) SMSR have interviewed a representative sample of over 3000 residents 600 across each of the 5 Local Policing Areas (LPA): Hereford; Shropshire; Telford & Wrekin and North & South Worcestershire
- Results have been weighted to accurately represent the population size of each LPA
- The report tracks changes in perception levels, identifies high performing areas and those with need for improvement

Summary – Overall Views

- The majority of residents (84%) agreed that they had confidence in West Mercia Police and more than 8 in every 10 were confident that they would receive a good service from the force (84%).
- Two-thirds (67%) felt that West Mercia Police were doing a good or excellent job.

Visibility

- Just under a third (31%) of residents report that they see an officer or PCSO at least once a week with over half (58%) satisfied with the levels of policing in their local area.
- Seven-tenths (72%) said that there had been no change in the level of policing; around a tenth (13%) believed there had been a decrease and slightly less (10%) thought there had been an increase.
- Just under a quarter (23%) said that they had spoken to an officer or PCSO from their local policing team.

Interaction / Access

- Over four-fifth (82%) were confident that they could access the police in an emergency with two-thirds (66%) confident they could do so in a non-emergency.
- The majority (80%) said they would prefer to contact West Mercia Police by telephone for a non-emergency issue.
- Just over half (52%) said that they find out about crime and policing issues from the media, with over a third (37%) finding out through social media. Three-fifths (56%) said they do not feel informed about what West Mercia Police is doing.


Effectiveness

- Seven-tenths (70%) of residents felt that West Mercia Police understand the issues in their community and around three out of every ten (30%) reported that they thought that crime and ASB was a problem in their area.
- Around three-quarters (74%) thought that crime and ASB had remained the same compared to 12 months ago with less than a fifth (15%) reporting an increase. Further to this, around 8 in every 10 residents (81%) agreed that West Mercia Police are dealing with crime and ASB.

Trust / integrity

- The vast majority (94%) said that West Mercia Police have their support. Over 8 in every 10 said they trust WMP (89%), believe they treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are (88%), felt West Mercia Police act with integrity (86%) and use their powers appropriately (82%).
- Over three-fifths (66%) are confident West Mercia Police use their stop and search power fairly and respectfully. Only 4% felt West Mercia Police did not use their stop and search powers fairly and respectfully.









Key Insights

Satisfaction with visibility has increased 5% from the previous quarter and is now at the highest level since tracking began

Under 44's and BAME respondents more likely to be satisfied with policing levels in their local area

Victims of crime less likely to be satisfied with policing levels

Residents of Shropshire and North Worcestershire least likely to be satisfied with policing levels – residents of Telford & Wrekin most likely to be satisfied









Key Insights

Those stating an increase in levels of policing 5% higher than the previous quarter – now at highest level since tracking began; those stating their had been a decrease now at lowest level

Under 24's and BAME respondents were more likely to notice an increase in levels of policing

Those aged 45+ and victims of crime most likely to notice a decrease in levels of policing

Residents of Telford & Wrekin most likely to notice an increase in policing; Herefordshire least likely

Residents of Shropshire most likely to notice a decrease in policing levels








Four-fifths confident they could access the police in LPA Comparisons - % confident they could easily speak to or access police an emergency




Q6 How confident are you, if at all, that you could easily speak to or access police services in your local area if you (or someone else) needed help in an emergency / non-emergency?

Key Insights

Confidence amongst residents they could access the police in an emergency has increased by 5% from the previous quarter; for a non-emergency it has increased by 6%


Residents in Shropshire least confident in being able to access the police in either an emergency or non-emergency; residents of South Worcestershire most confident in both situations

Those under 45 significantly more likely to have confidence they can access WMP in an emergency & non-emergency than those aged 45+

BAME respondents more confident than white respondents in accessing the police in both an emergency and non-emergency



























Less crime now than 12 months ago









Over 9 out of every 10 residents say that WMP have their support

Over 8 in 10 say they trust WMP, believe they treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are, they act with integrity and use their powers appropriately

Around a tenth disagreed WMP can be relied upon to be there when needed, admit their mistakes and have a good reputation amongst local people



Confidence in service delivery has increase by 1% since last quarter – the third consecutive increase


Those aged 14-24 most confident they would receive a good service from WMP; those aged 45-64 least likely to be confident


















Victims of crime and were the most likely to experience an event that negatively affected their confidence; victims were also more likely to be affected in a positive way

Q23 Has any particular event affected your confidence in the police in the last 12 months?



4% increase in awareness compared to the previous quarter

Higher awareness found in North Worcestershire; least awareness in Herefordshire and Telford & Wrekin

Males more aware of the PCC compared to females

The older the respondent the more likely they were to be aware of the PCC

BAME respondents less aware of the PCC compared to White respondents

Perceptions surveys typically record awareness of 8-15% based on previous research conducted by SMSR.


















