TITLE: Road Safety Cameras - Trench Lock

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Telford and Wrekin Council gave West Mercia £103k to support the installation of red light/speed cameras at Trench Lock in 2018/19. This funding has been held in the Road Safety Reserve since then.

The Force engaged Cubic Ltd to install the cameras, which have been operating since December 2018 for speed capture only

The project has not been completed as changes to the traffic lights meant that the cameras do not currently working for red lights. Cubic Ltd are awaiting final sign off of a new interface to install so that the system is working fully. Whilst waiting for this final element to be completed they have requested payment for the installation of the cameras

PROPOSAL

It is proposed that the Police and Crime Commissioner authorises draw down of the £103,000 from the Road Safety reserve to be used to pay for the installation of cameras at Trench Lock.

The works are capital in nature and so will need to be added to the Fixed Asset Register and a Revenue Contribution to Capital (from the reserve) will be required to fund the expenditure.

The force is authorised to process invoices for work undertaken to date (£100,000) and to make final payment of the balance on the completion of the project.

PART 1 – NON-CONFIDENTIAL/EXEMPT FACTS AND FIGURES

SUPPORTING REPORT

Telford and Wrekin Council gave West Mercia £103k to pay for these cameras in 2018/19.

The cameras first went live in December 2018, but due to the fact the Council upgraded the traffic light heads to LED (from Tungsten bulbs) meant that the Type Approved Interface could not be used and Cubic submitted a new Interface for Type Approval which is still awaiting sign off by the Government Agent DDSTL This meant that they were only able to operate the speed function.

Both of the cameras were detecting speed offences until the Council resurfaced the road and the reinstallation of the detection loops (by the Council) on the one site was done incorrectly, meaning that one site is non-operational. The Force are still waiting for the council to redo this, when at the same time they will revert the lights back to Tungsten so that the Police can enforce the red lights on both sites. The outstanding work is expected to be completed in March 2021.

It is requested that the reserve be released to be able to allow Cubic to invoice for the cameras, with a final payment for the installation of the new interfaces.

The funding has been made available from an external body for this purpose and covers the cost of the project.

The implementation of these cameras provides a revenue income to the Force which can be reinvested in further Road Safety initiatives

TREASURER COMMENTS

The money is available from the reserve to fund this project and it is beneficial in returning a revenue stream to the Force.
