#### Public Views and Perceptions of Policing in West Mercia 2021/22 Survey Quarter 4 Results Presentation







### Section One Introduction & Methodology, Summary & Respondent Breakdown



#### Introduction & Methodology

- West Mercia Police (WMP) & the Police and Crime Commissioner, John Campion, seek to obtain the views of residents, including their confidence in WMP, to inform the PCC's plan priorities and support decision making around the Safer West Mercia agenda
- WMP & the OPCC commissioned SMSR, a third party research agency, to conduct surveys over the phone and face to face with West Mercia residents and victims of crime
- The questionnaire includes key questions taken from the Crime Survey for England and Wales (CSEW) and the 2018 Report on Public Perceptions of Policing in England and Wales (PPPEW)
- Where relevant, comparisons with CSEW AND PPPEW are displayed. Comparisons with CSEW include the average score of forces included in West Mercia Police's most similar group (MSG)\*\*. Where comparisons have been made, results have been consistently analysed in accordance with this external reporting. Comparisons with CSEW are based on the most recent results available (March 2020)
- Over the 12 month period (April 2021 March 2022) SMSR have interviewed a representative sample of over 3000 residents 600 across each of the 5 Local Policing Areas (LPA): Hereford; Shropshire; Telford & Wrekin and North & South Worcestershire
- Results have been weighted to accurately represent the population size of each LPA
- The report tracks changes in perception levels, identifies high performing areas and those with need for improvement

#### Summary – Overall Views

- The majority of residents (81%) agreed that they had confidence in West Mercia Police with a slightly higher proportion confident that they would receive a good service from the force (85%).
- Around seven out of every ten (68%) felt that West Mercia Police were doing either a good or excellent job.

#### Visibility

- A quarter of residents (24%) report that they see an officer or PCSO at least once a week with over half (56%) satisfied with the levels of policing in their local area.
- Three-quarters (76%) said that there had been no change in the level of policing; more than a tenth (13%) believed there had been a decrease with less than a tenth (6%) that thought there had been an increase.
- Just under a fifth (18%) said that they had spoken to an officer or PCSO from their local policing team.

#### Interaction / Access

- Nine-tenths (89%) were confident that they could access the police in an emergency with two-thirds (65%) confident they could do so in a non-emergency.
- The majority (82%) said they would prefer to contact West Mercia Police by telephone for a non-emergency issue.
- Three-fifths (61%) said that they find out about crime and policing issues from the media, with over a third (38%) finding out through social media. Less than half (43%) said they felt informed about what West Mercia Police is doing, with 56% that stated they did not feel informed.


#### Effectiveness

- More than seven-tenths (70%) of residents felt that West Mercia Police understand the issues in their community and a quarter (25%) reported that they thought that crime and ASB was a problem in their area.
- Over two-thirds (69%) thought that crime and ASB had remained the same compared to 12 months ago with over a tenth (14%) reporting an increase. Further to this, over 8 in every 10 residents (83%) agreed that West Mercia Police are dealing with crime and ASB.

#### Trust / integrity

- The vast majority (94%) said that West Mercia Police have their support with just under nine-tenths that said they trust WMP (89%). Over 8 in every 10 said that they act with integrity (85%) and they believe they treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are (85%). Over three-quarters felt West Mercia Police use their powers appropriately (79%), they take people's concerns seriously (77%) and can be relied to be there when you need them (77%).
- Three-fifths (60%) are confident West Mercia Police use their stop and search power fairly and respectfully. Only 4% felt West Mercia Police did not use their stop and search powers fairly and respectfully.


























Confidence amongst residents they could access the police in a non-emergency has increased by 14% from the previous quarter








Q8 Overall, how well informed do you feel about what West Mercia Police is doing in your local area?

























Q15 Compared to 12 months ago, would you say there is now more crime and ASB in the area you live in, less crime and ASB or about the same?


BAME respondents more inclined than white respondents to feel that crime and ASB has increased







#### **Key Insights**

Over 9 out of every 10 residents say that WMP have their support

Over 8 in 10 say they have trust in WMP, they believe WMP treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are and that WMP act with integrity

More than a tenth disagreed WMP can be relied upon to be there when needed and admit their mistakes

Less than half felt complaints against WMP are dealt with fairly and that WMP admit their mistakes





















Victims of crime were the most likely to experience an event that negatively affected their confidence; victims were also more likely to be affected in a positive way





Perceptions surveys typically record awareness of 8-15% based on previous research conducted by SMSR.



















