Introduction & Methodology

- West Mercia Police (WMP) & the Police and Crime Commissioner, John Campion, seek to obtain the views of residents, including their confidence in WMP, to inform the PCC's plan priorities and support decision making around the Safer West Mercia agenda
- WMP & the OPCC commissioned SMSR, a third party research agency, to conduct surveys over the phone and face to face with West Mercia residents and victims of crime
- The questionnaire includes key questions taken from the Crime Survey for England and Wales (CSEW) and the 2018 Report on Public Perceptions of Policing in England and Wales (PPPEW)
- Where relevant, comparisons with CSEW AND PPPEW are displayed. Comparisons with CSEW include the average score of forces included in West Mercia Police's most similar group (MSG)**. Where comparisons have been made, results have been consistently analysed in accordance with this external reporting. Comparisons with CSEW are based on the most recent results available (March 2020)
- Over the 12 month period (October 2021 – September 2022) SMSR have interviewed a representative sample of over 3000 residents – 600 across each of the 5 Local Policing Areas (LPA): Hereford; Shropshire; Telford & Wrekin and North & South Worcestershire
- Results have been weighted to accurately represent the population size of each LPA
- The report tracks changes in perception levels, identifies high performing areas and those with need for improvement

Summary – Overall Views

- The majority of residents (81%) agreed that they had confidence in West Mercia Police with the same proportion confident that they would receive a good service from the force (81%).
- Just under two-thirds (63%) felt that West Mercia Police were doing either a good or excellent job.

Visibility

- A fifth of residents (21%) report that they see an officer or PCSO at least once a week with over half (56%) satisfied with the levels of policing in their local area.
- Three-quarters (75%) said that there had been no change in the level of policing; more than a tenth (14%) believed there had been a decrease with less than a tenth (6%) that thought there had been an increase.
- Just under a fifth (17%) said that they had spoken to an officer or PCSO from their local policing team.

Interaction / Access

- Just under nine-tenths (87%) were confident that they could access the police in an emergency with two-thirds (67%) confident they could do so in a non-emergency.
- The majority (77%) said they would prefer to contact West Mercia Police by telephone for a non-emergency issue.
- Over half (55%) said that they find out about crime and policing issues from the media, with two-fifths (43%) finding out through social media. Less than half (46%) said they felt informed about what West Mercia Police is doing, with 53% that stated they did not feel informed.

Effectiveness

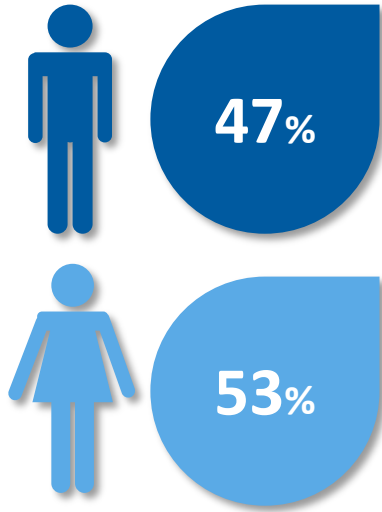
- Seven-tenths (70%) of residents felt that West Mercia Police understand the issues in their community and just over a fifth (21%) reported that they thought that crime and ASB was a problem in their area.
- Over seven-tenths (73%) thought that crime and ASB had remained the same compared to 12 months ago with over a tenth (15%) reporting an increase. Further to this, over 8 in every 10 residents (81%) agreed that West Mercia Police are dealing with crime and ASB.

Trust / integrity

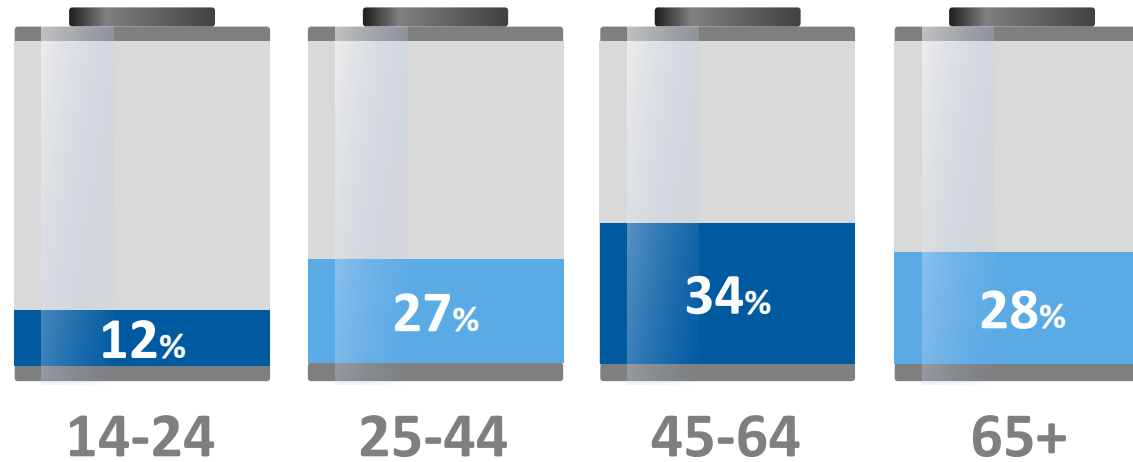
- The vast majority (93%) said that West Mercia Police have their support with just under nine-tenths that said they trust WMP (88%). Over 8 in every 10 said that they act with integrity (83%) and they believe they treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are (85%). Around three-quarters felt West Mercia Police use their powers appropriately (78%), they take people's concerns seriously (75%) and can be relied to be there when you need them (74%).
- Three-fifths (60%) are confident West Mercia Police use their stop and search power fairly and respectfully. Only 4% felt West Mercia Police did not use their stop and search powers fairly and respectfully.

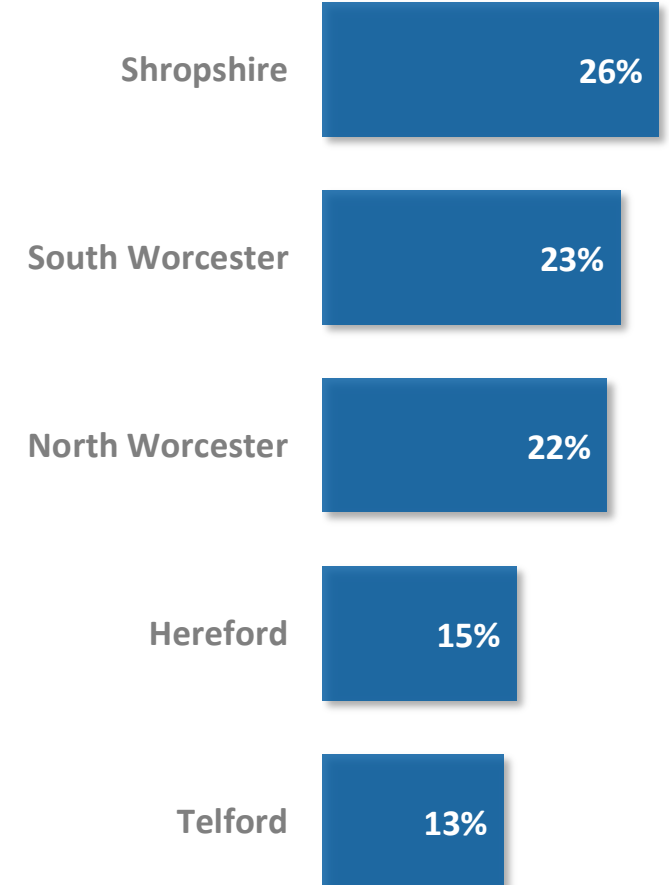

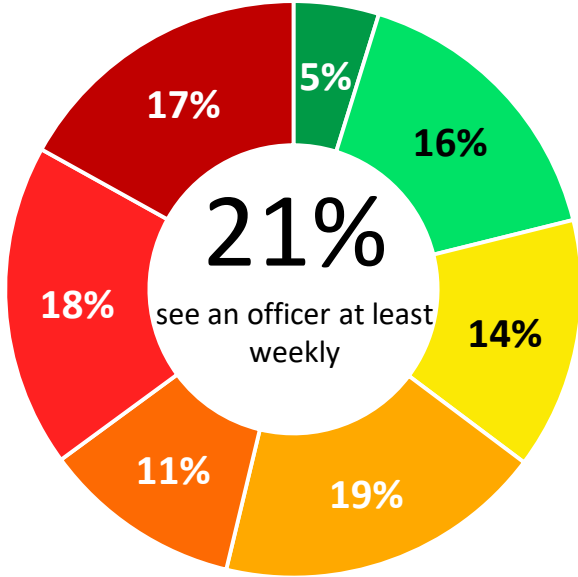

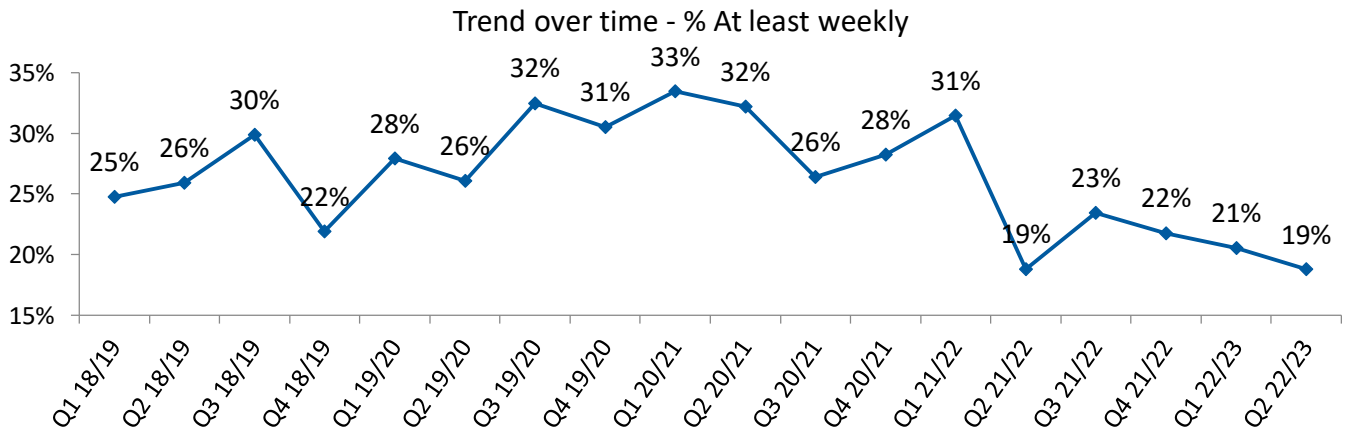
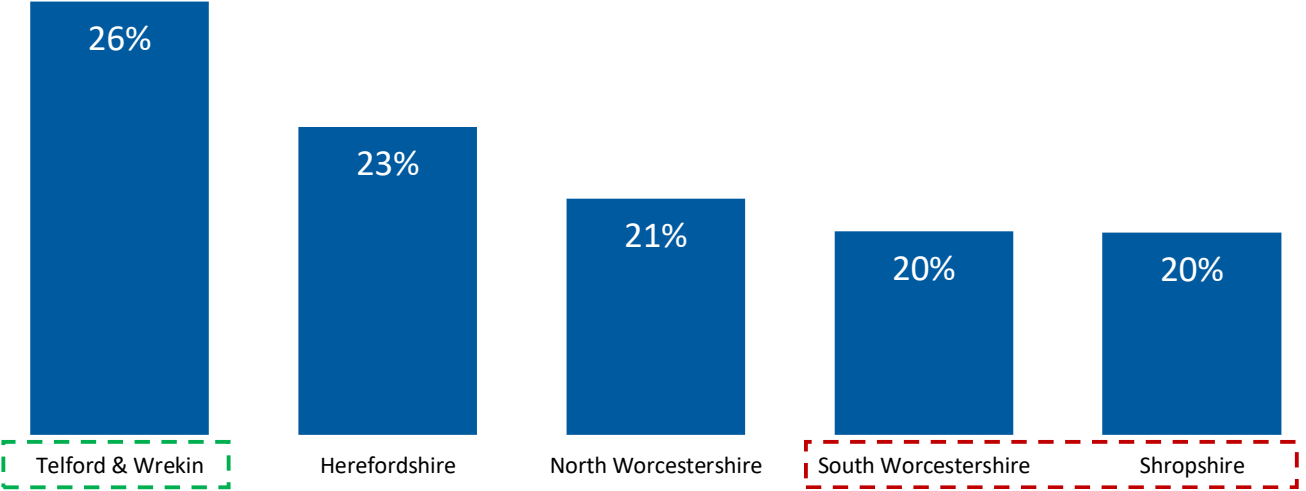

LPA Comparisons - % seeing a police officer or PCSO at least weekly



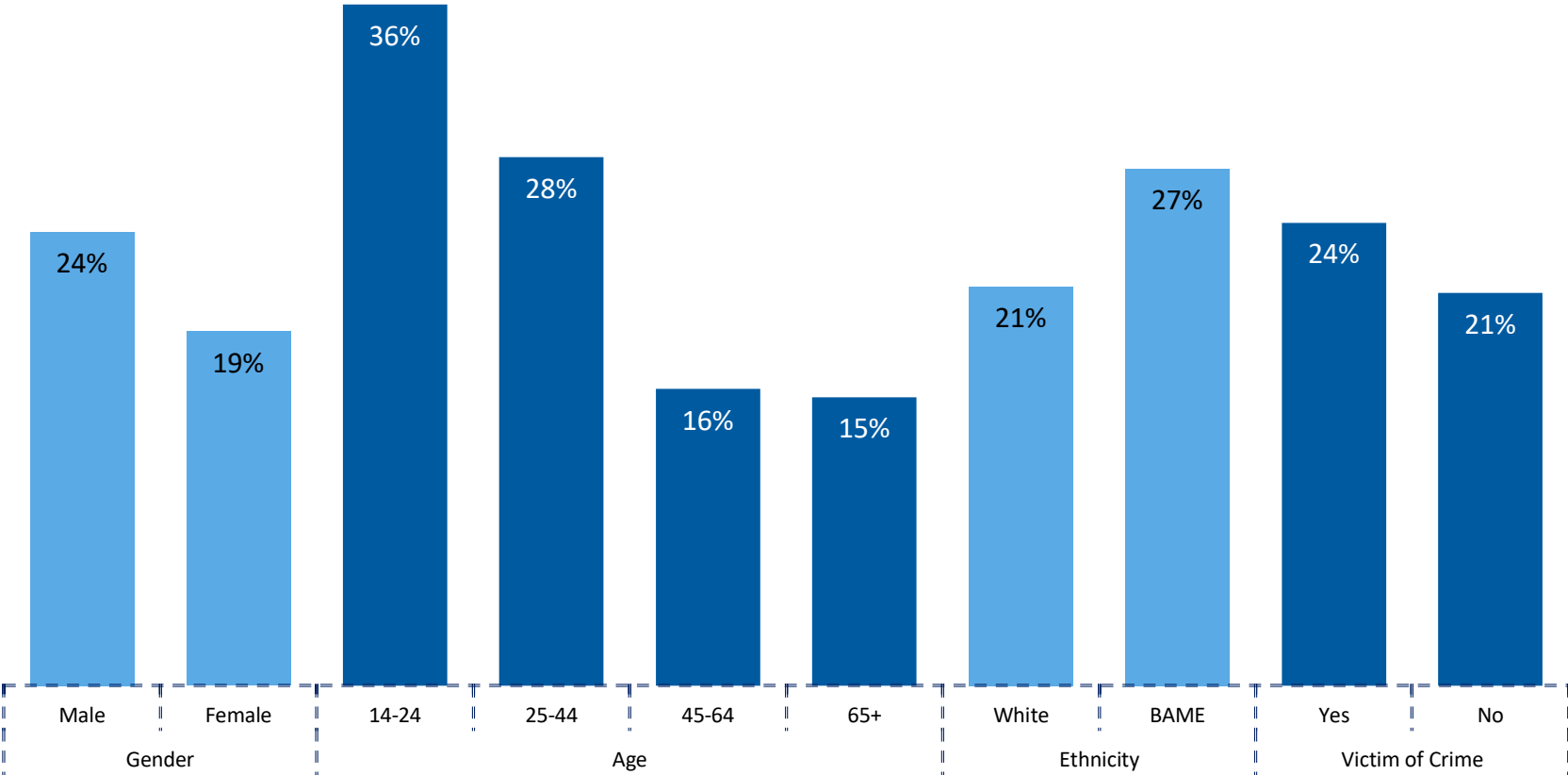

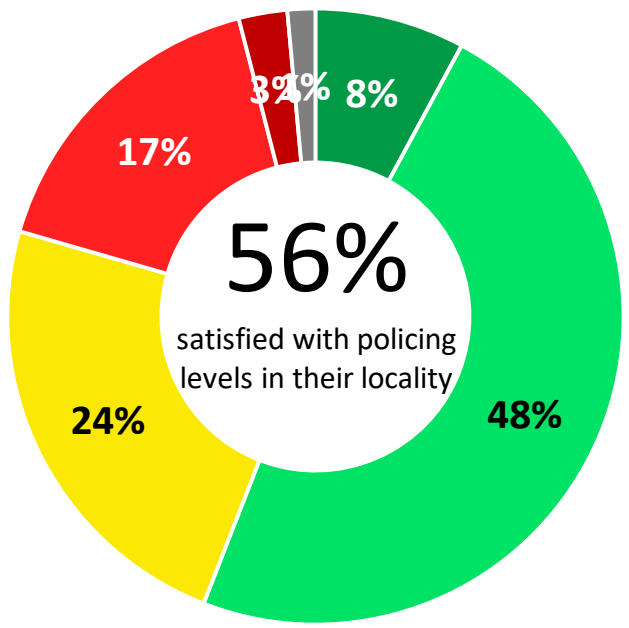
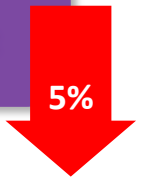

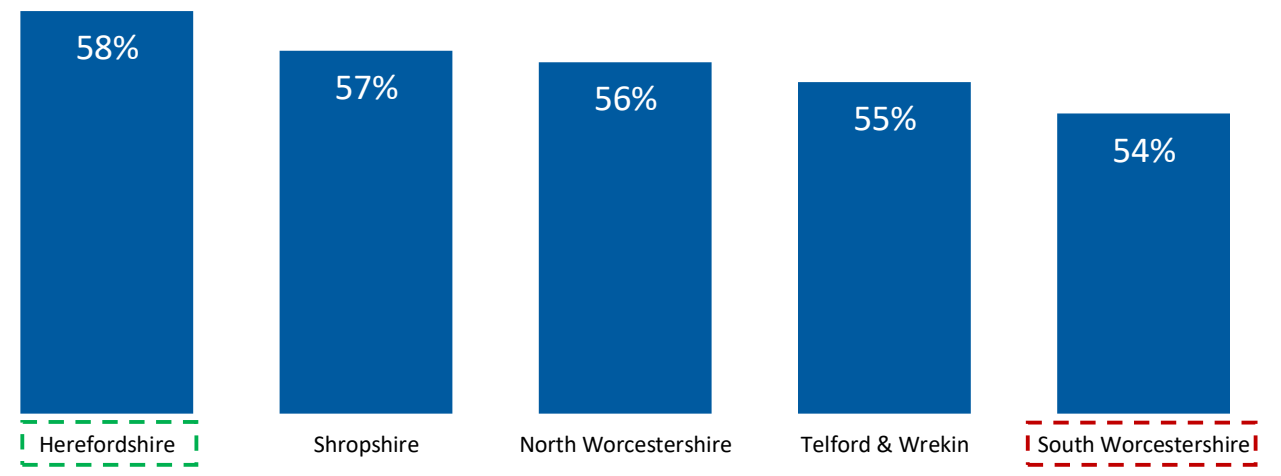

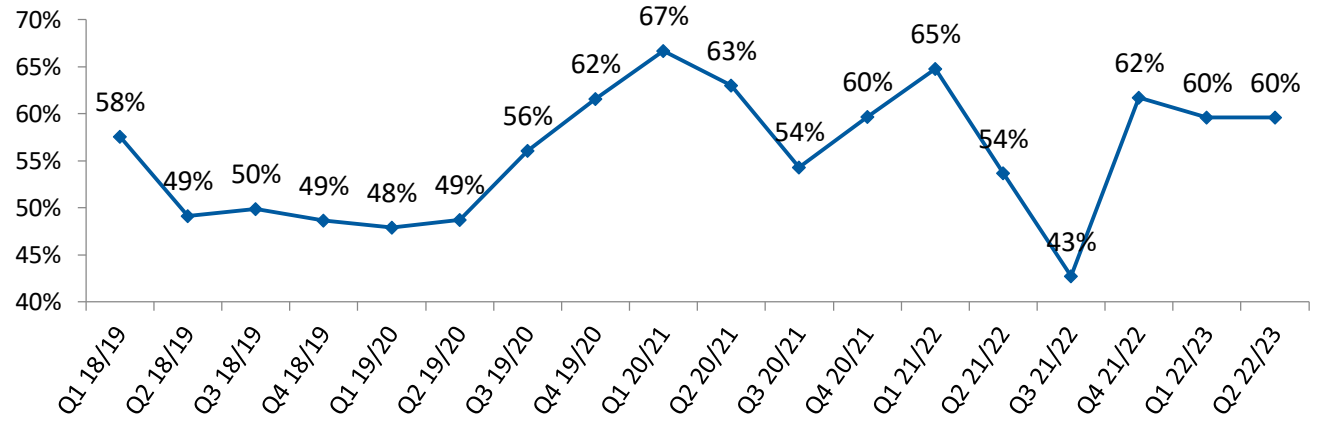

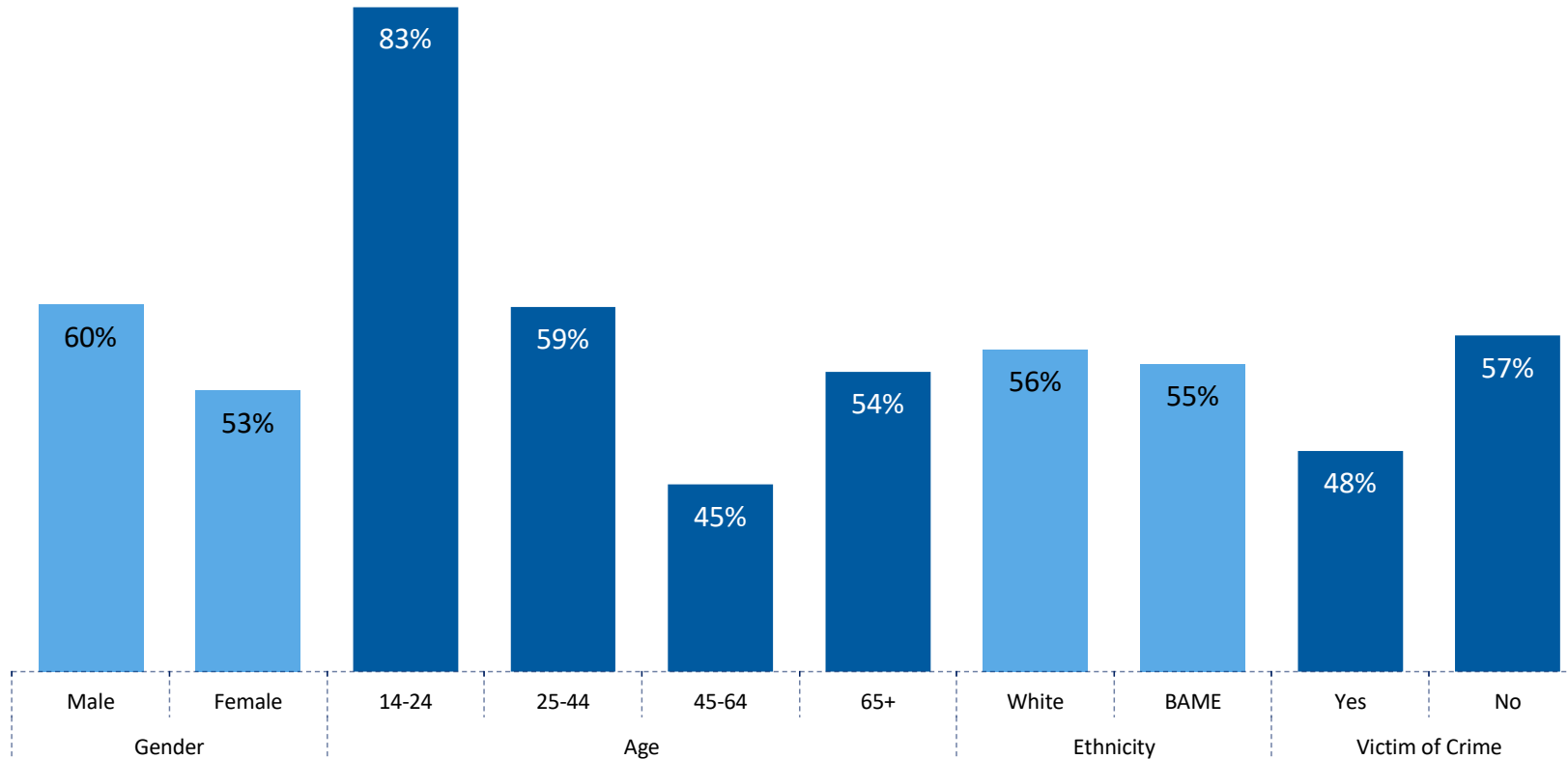


Trend over time - % Satisfied

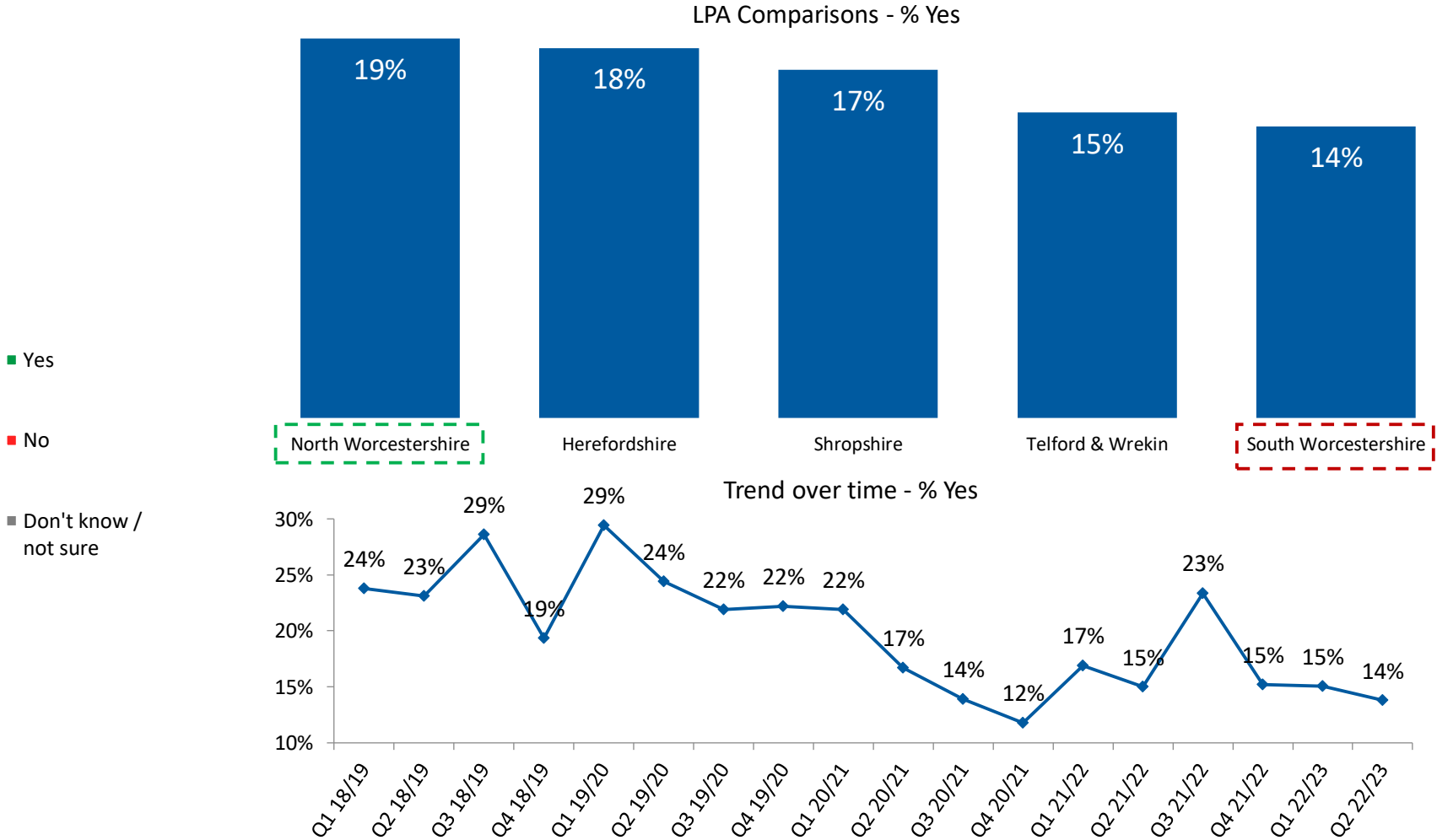

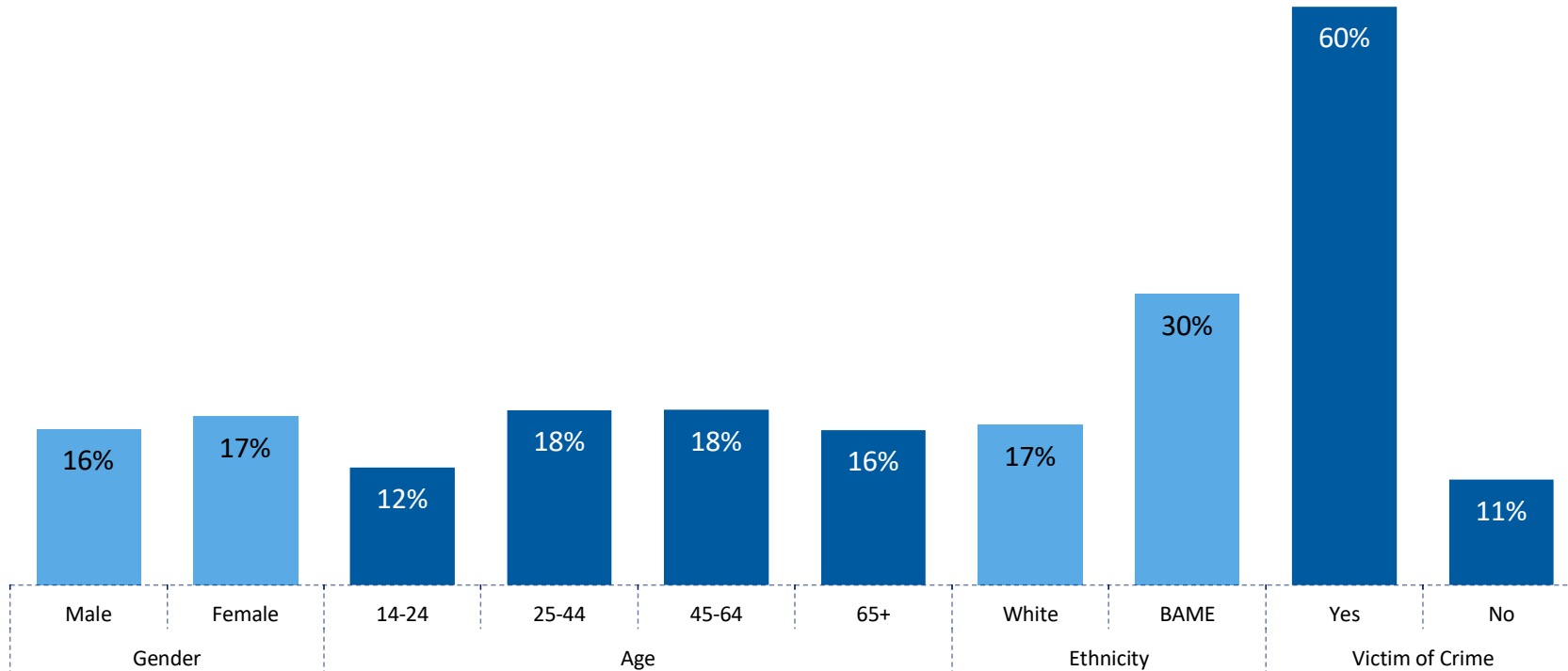

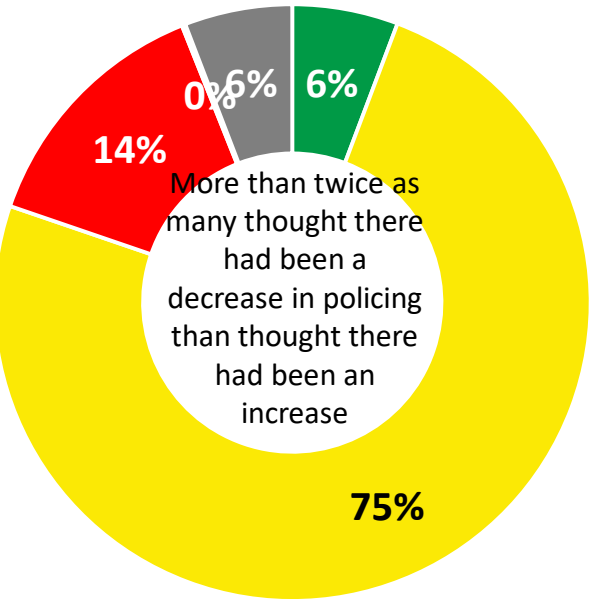

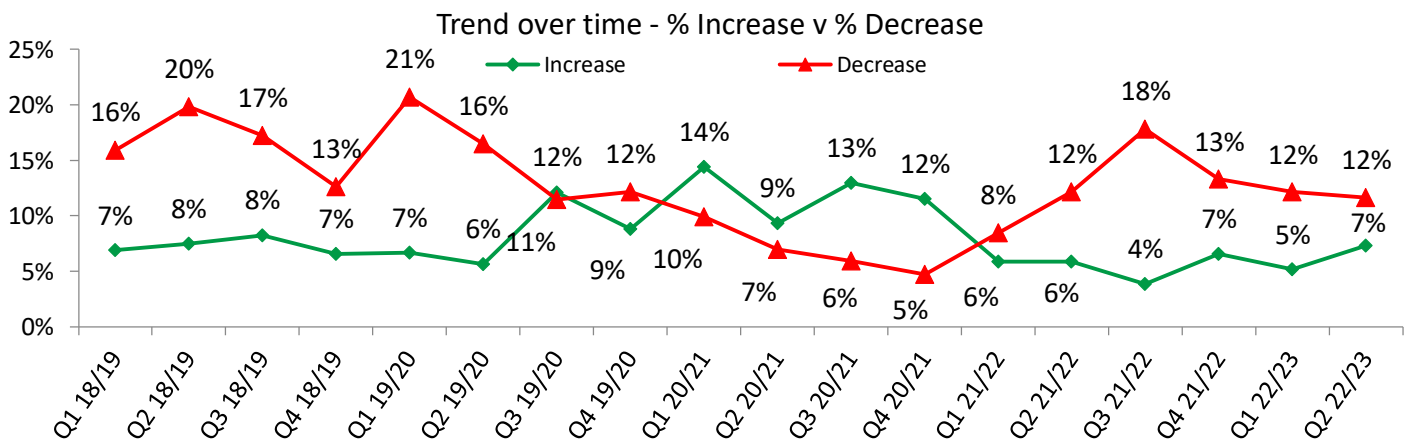
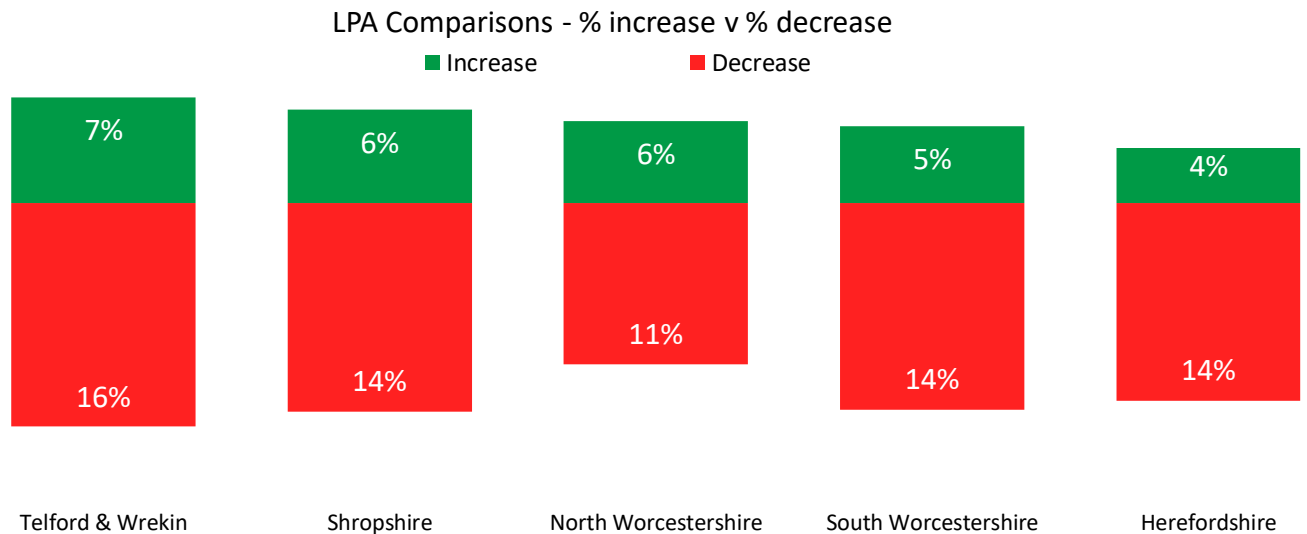

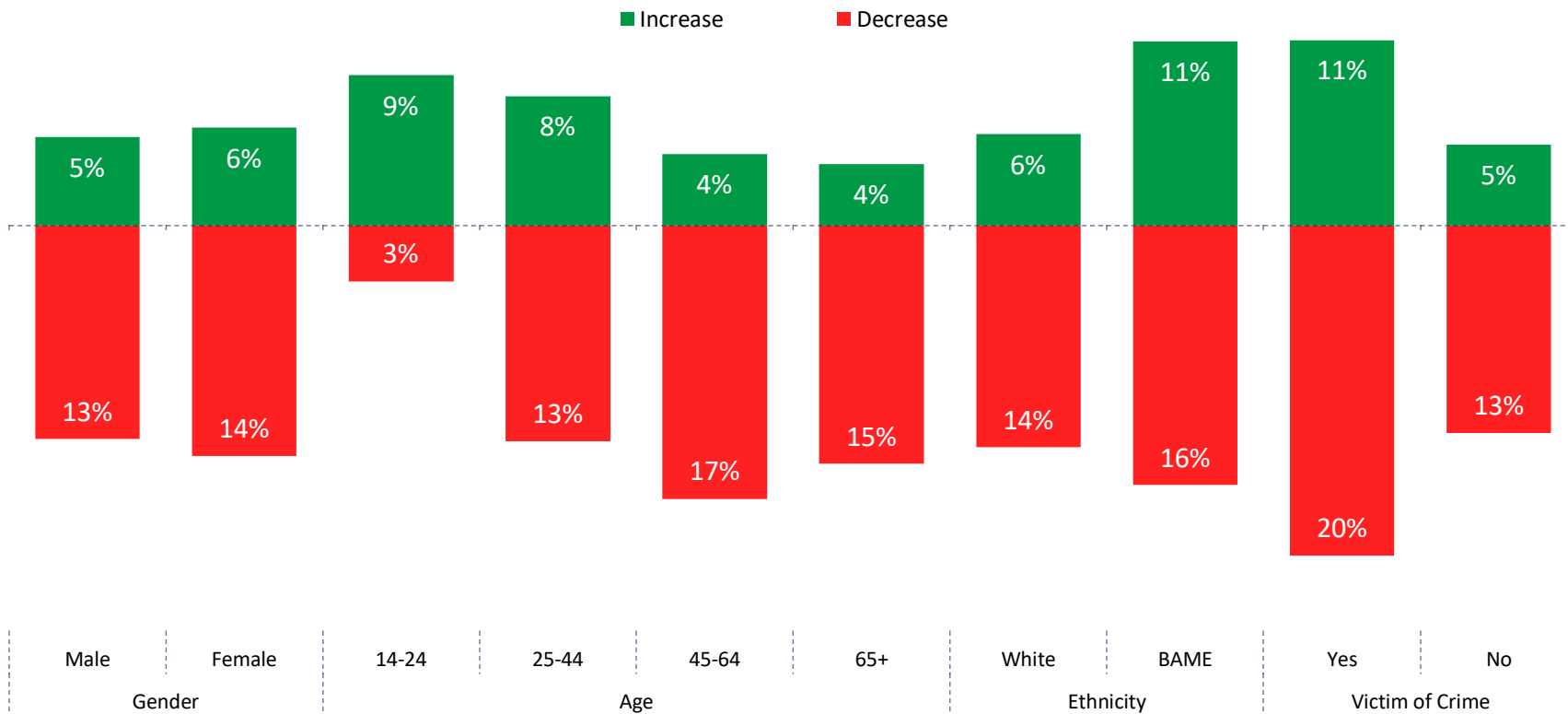

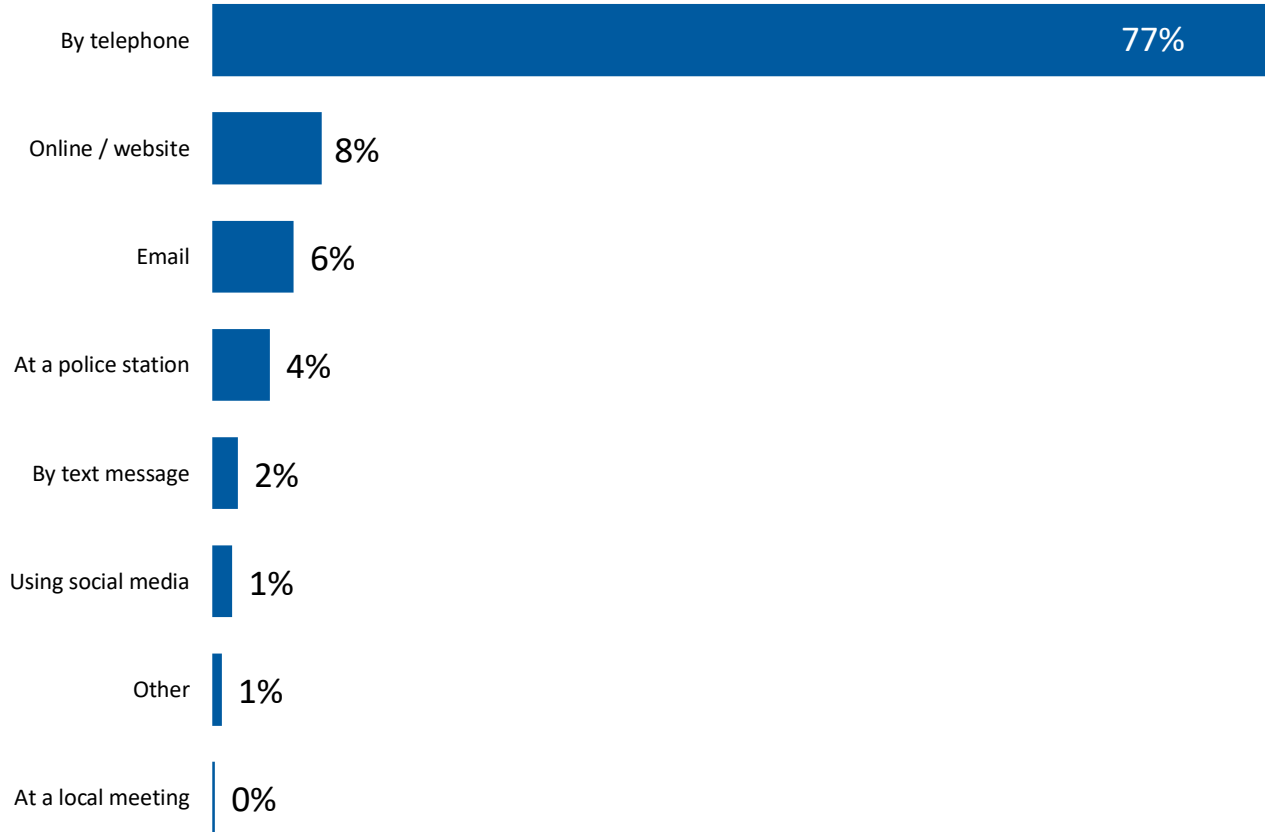

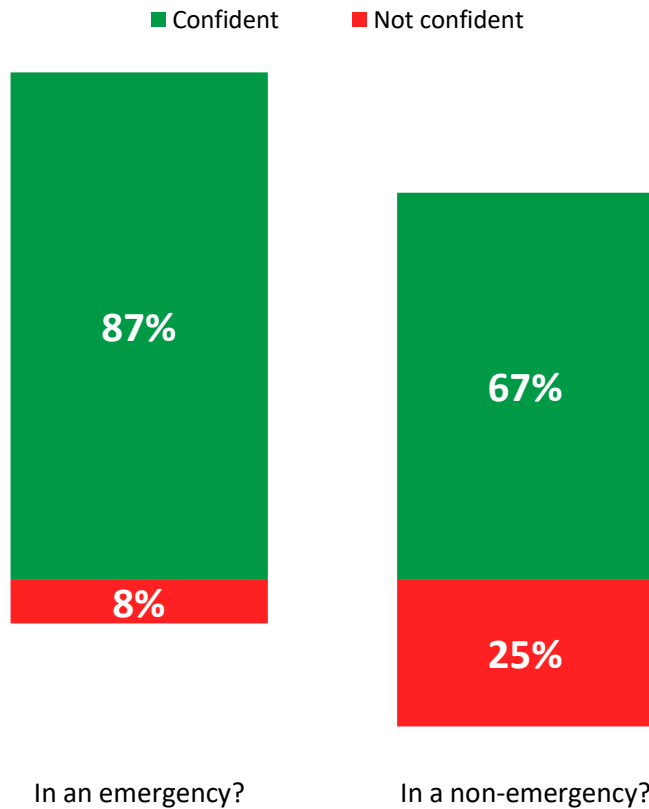

Preference of telephone contact increases with age but by far the most preferred method overall

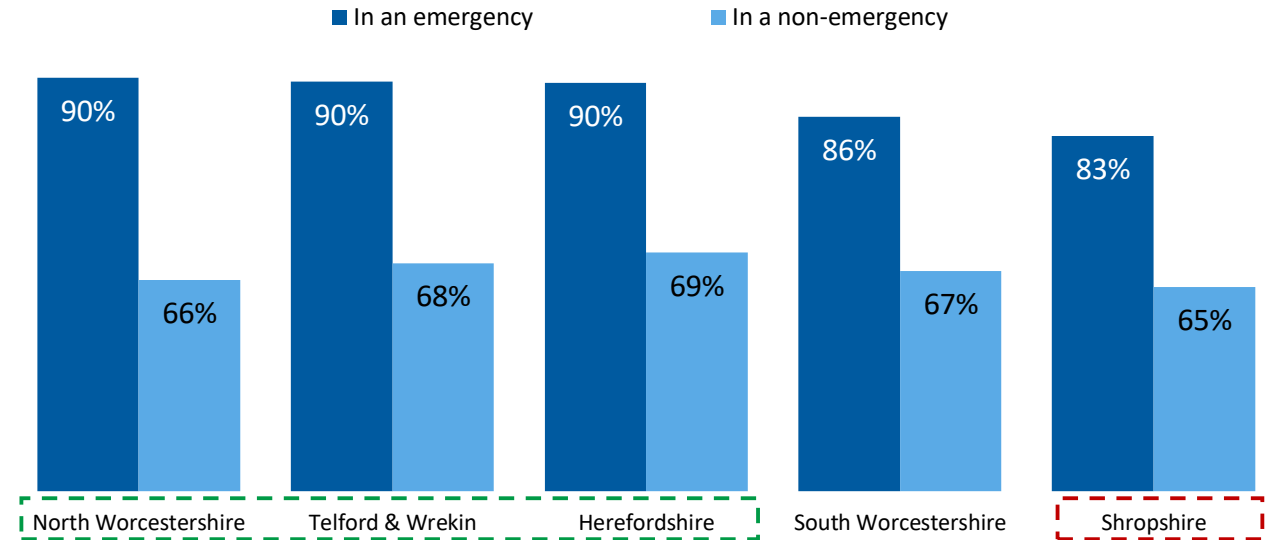

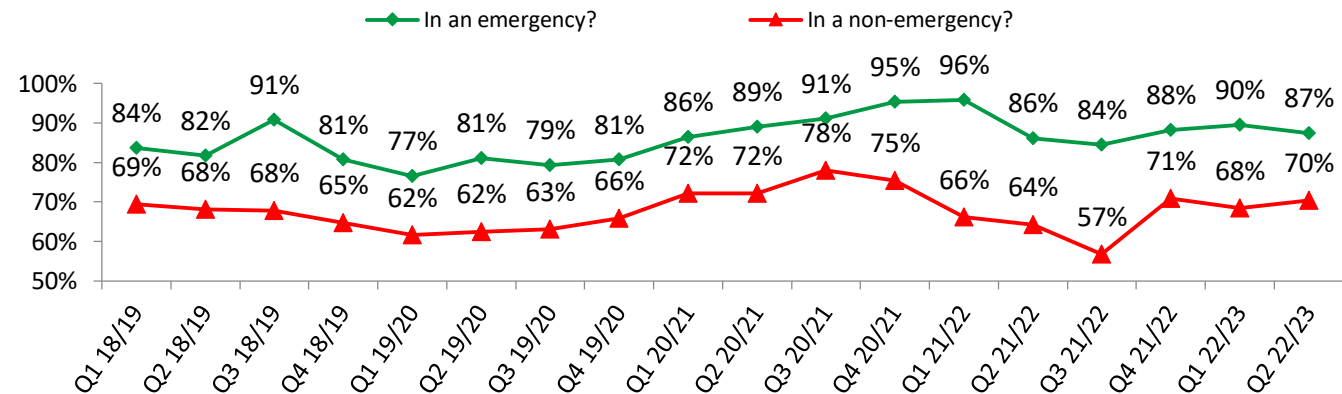

Trend over time - % Confidence in accessing police services

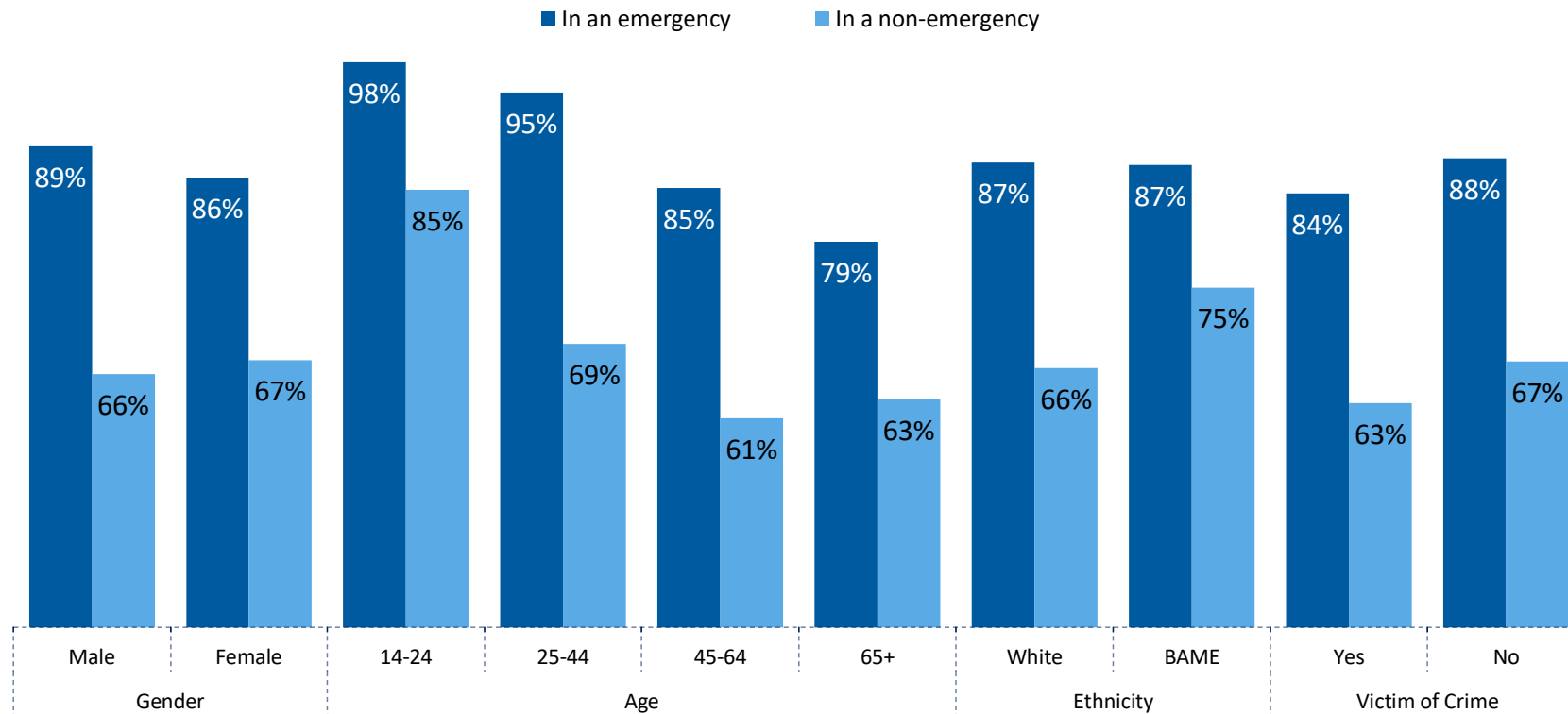


Q6 How confident are you, if at all, that you could easily speak to or access police services in your local area if you (or someone else) needed help in an emergency / non-emergency?

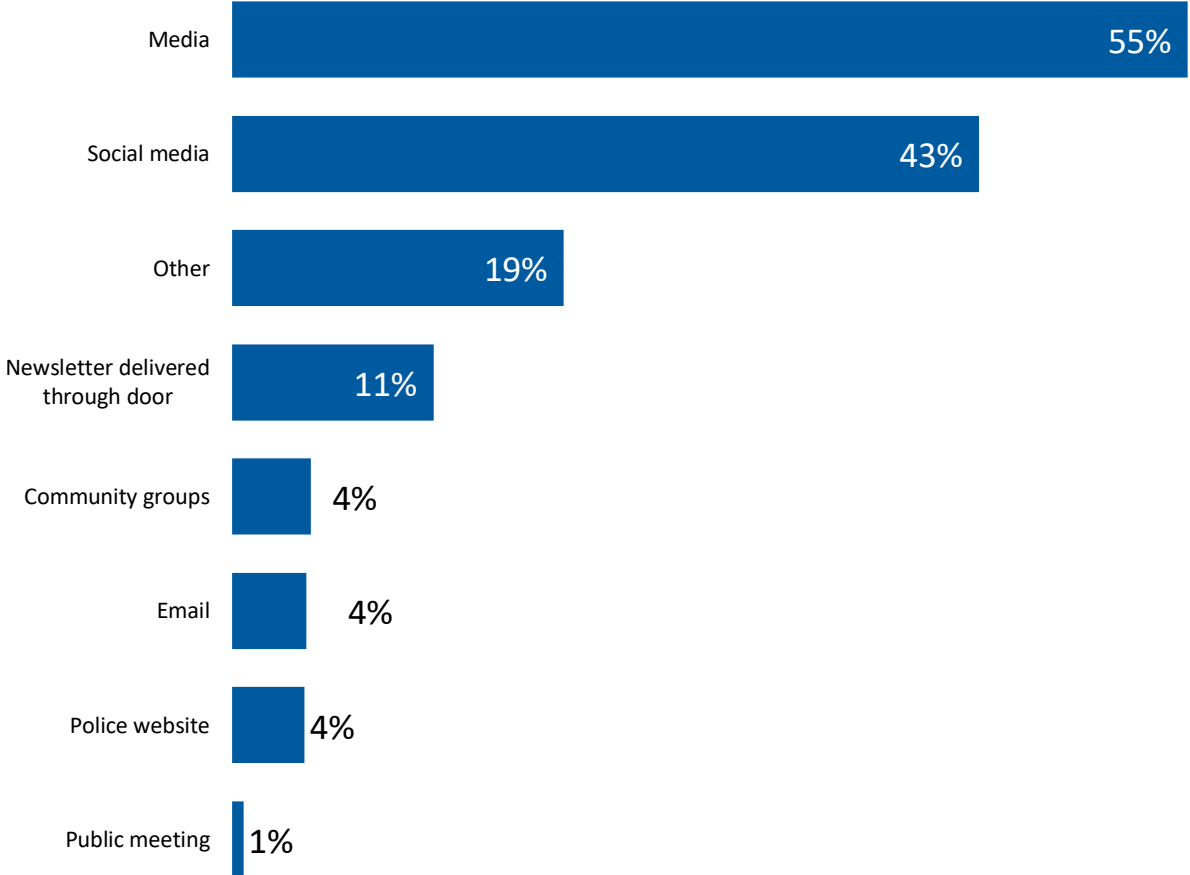

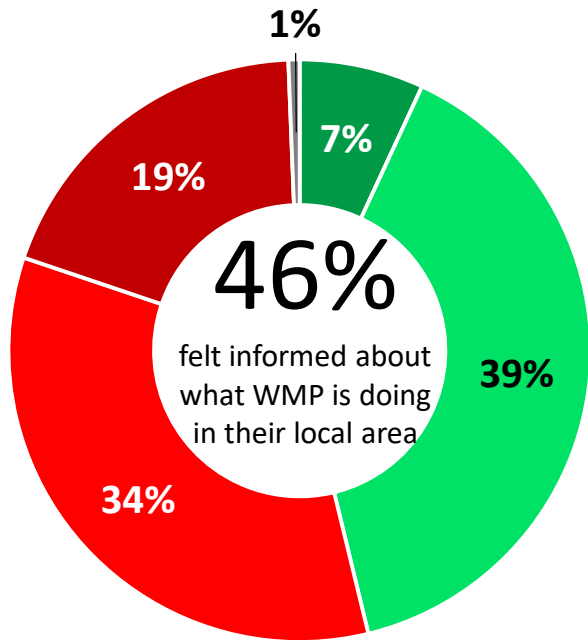

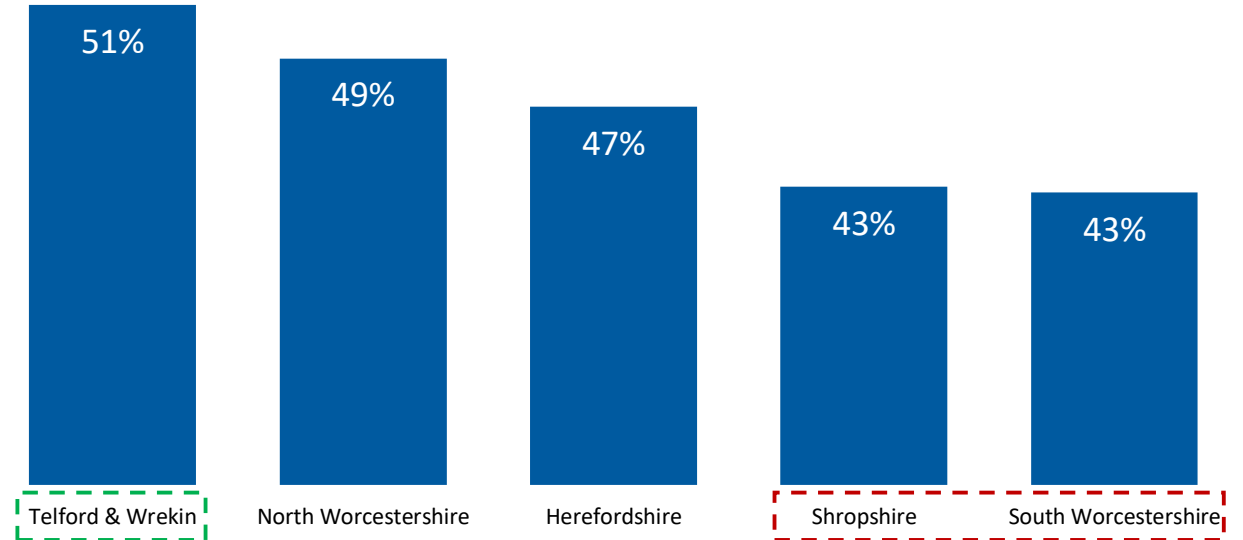

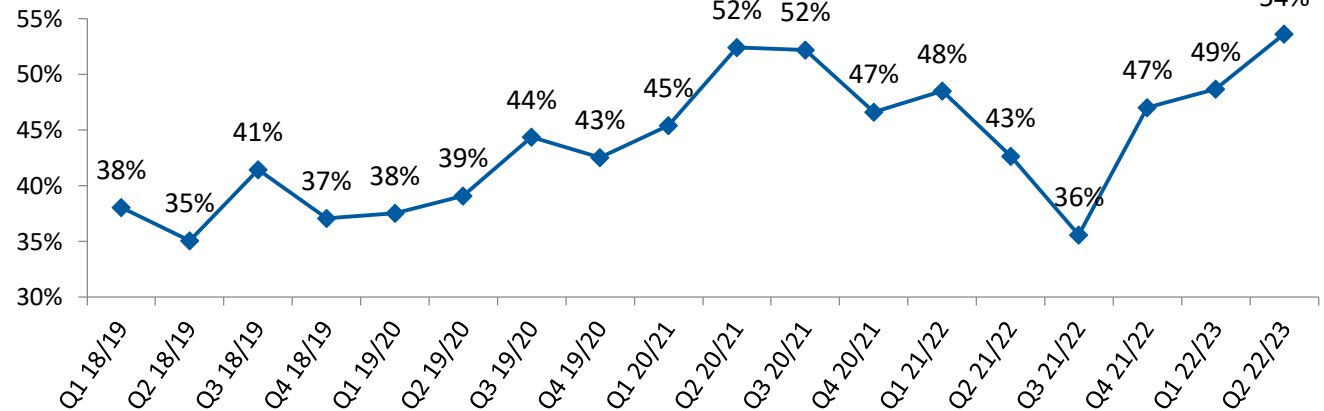

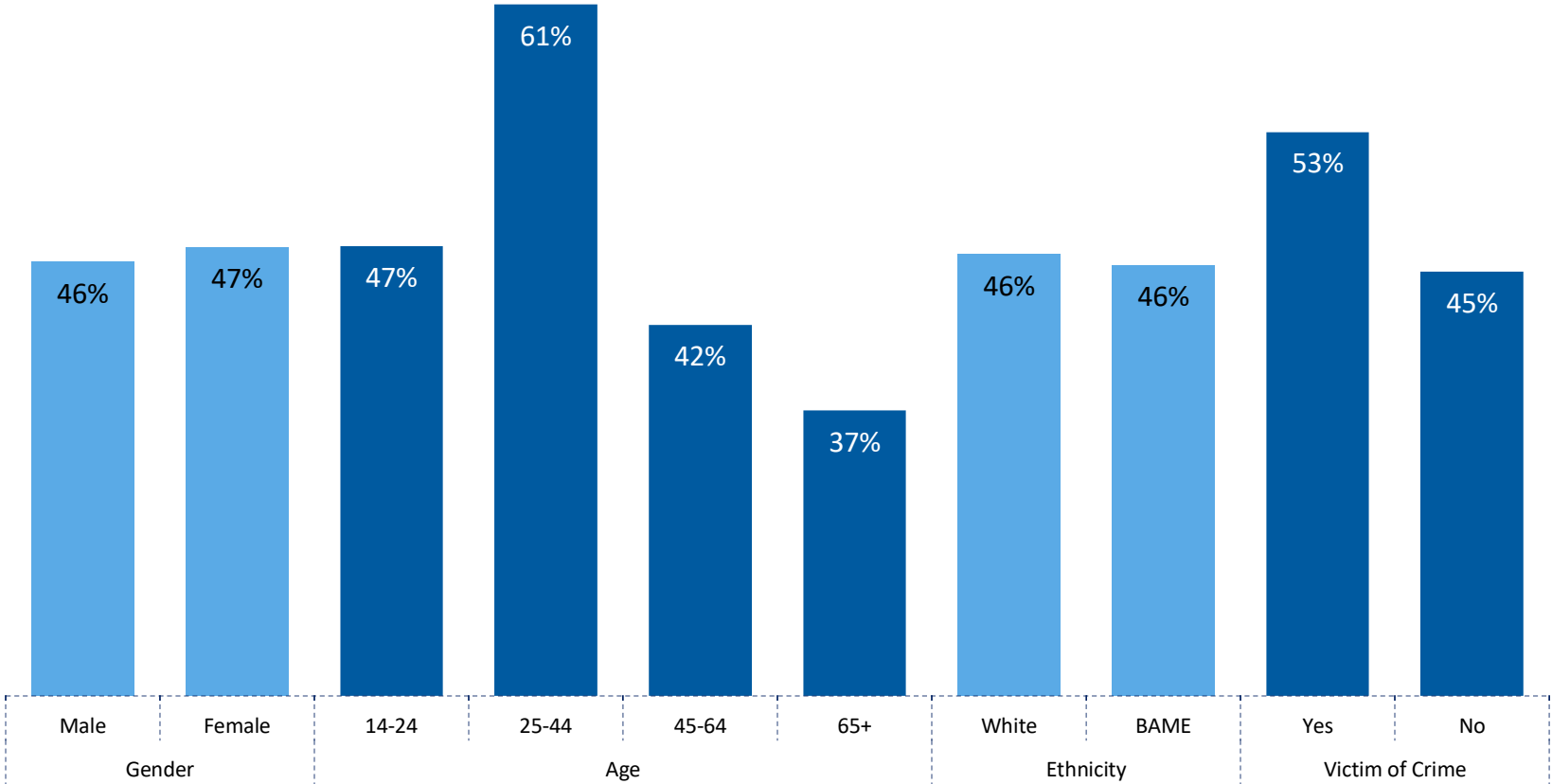


Trend over time - % Informed

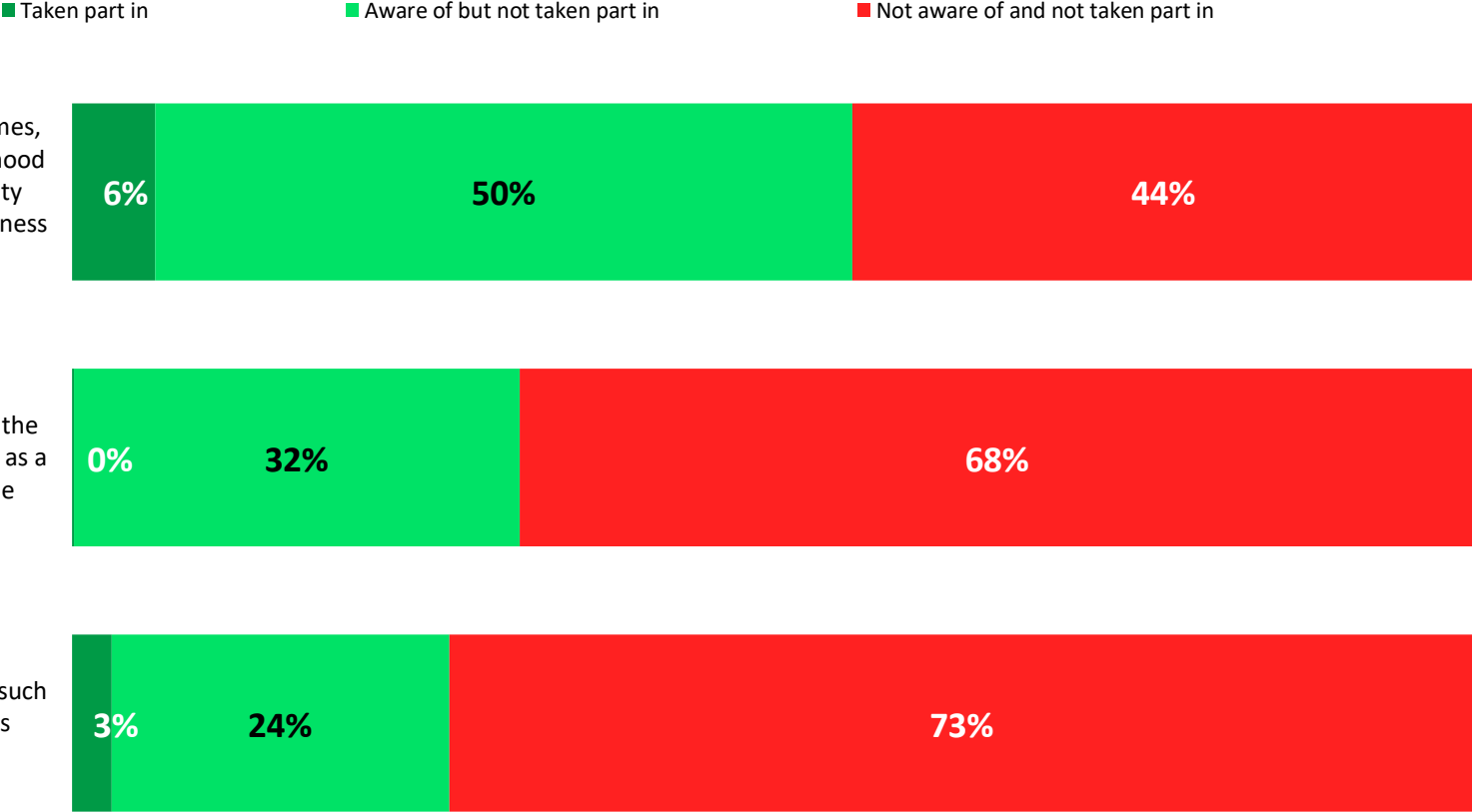

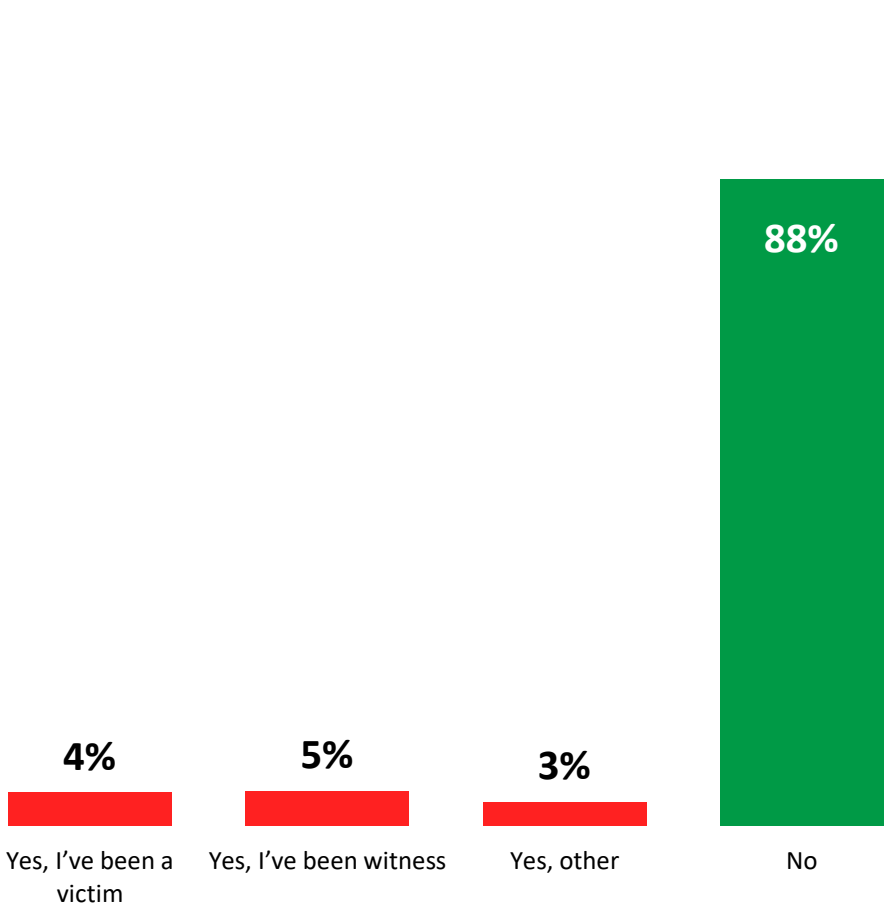

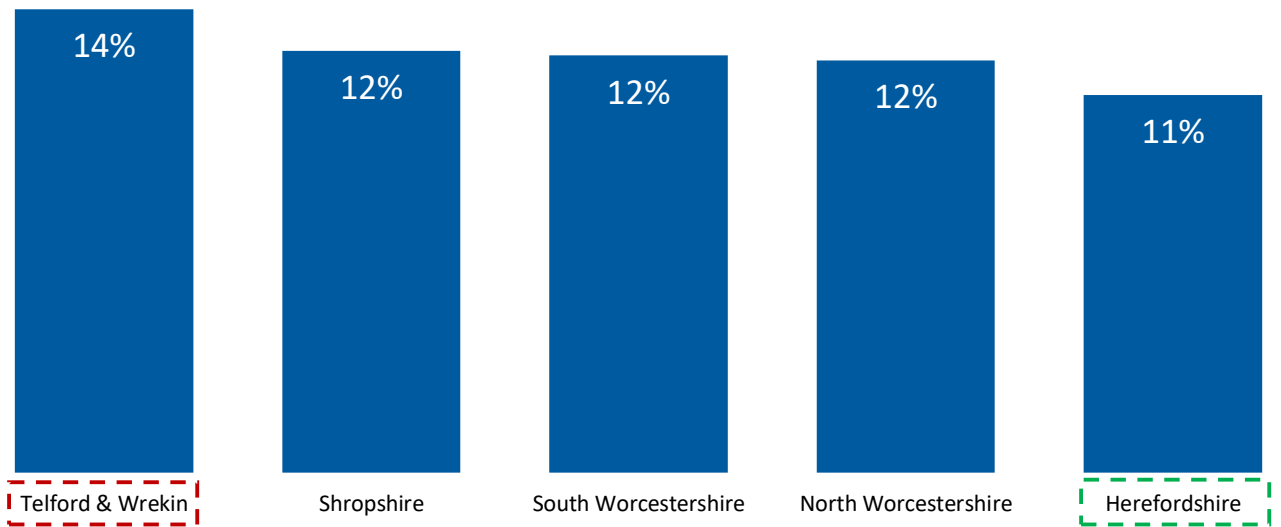

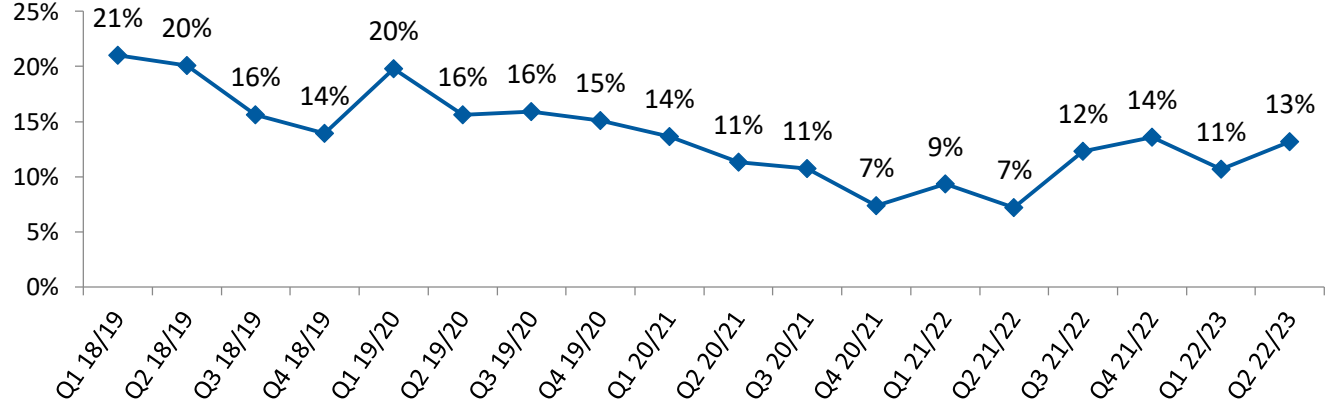

LPA Comparisons - % that had been either a victim of a crime, witness to a crime or other



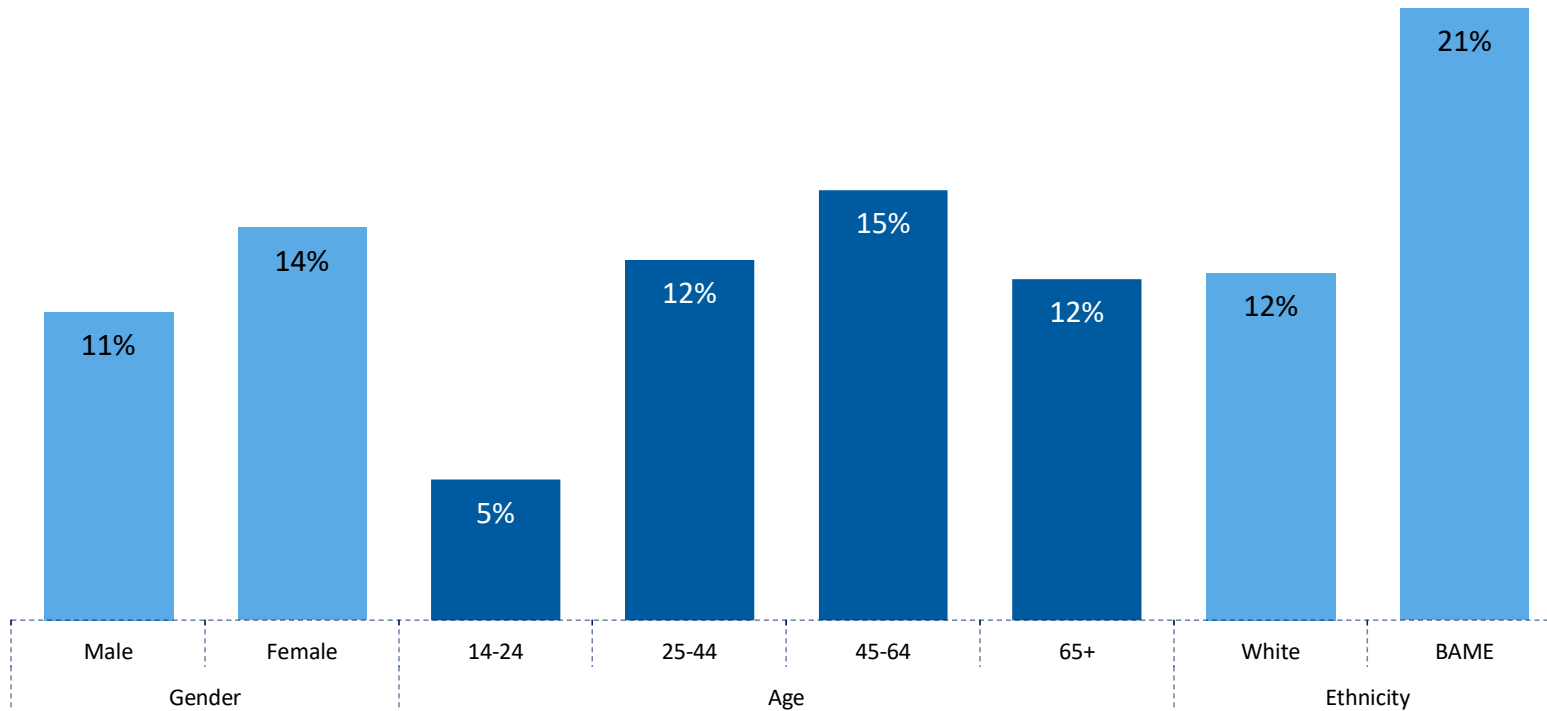

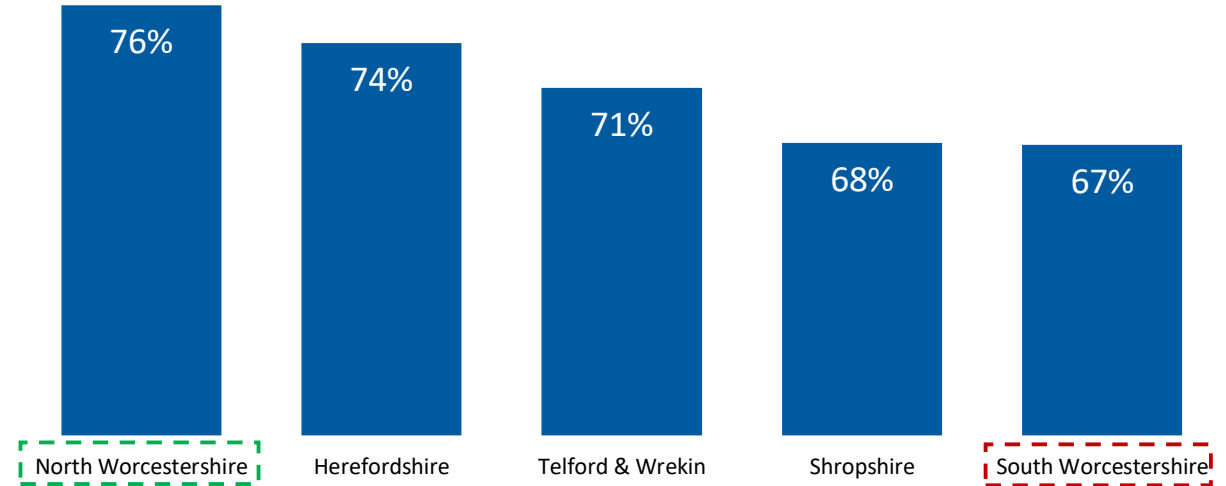

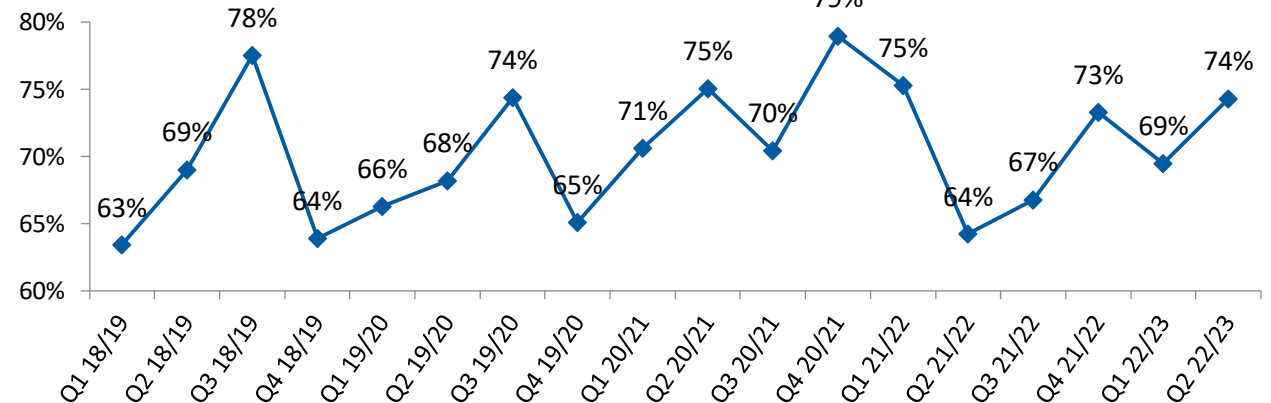

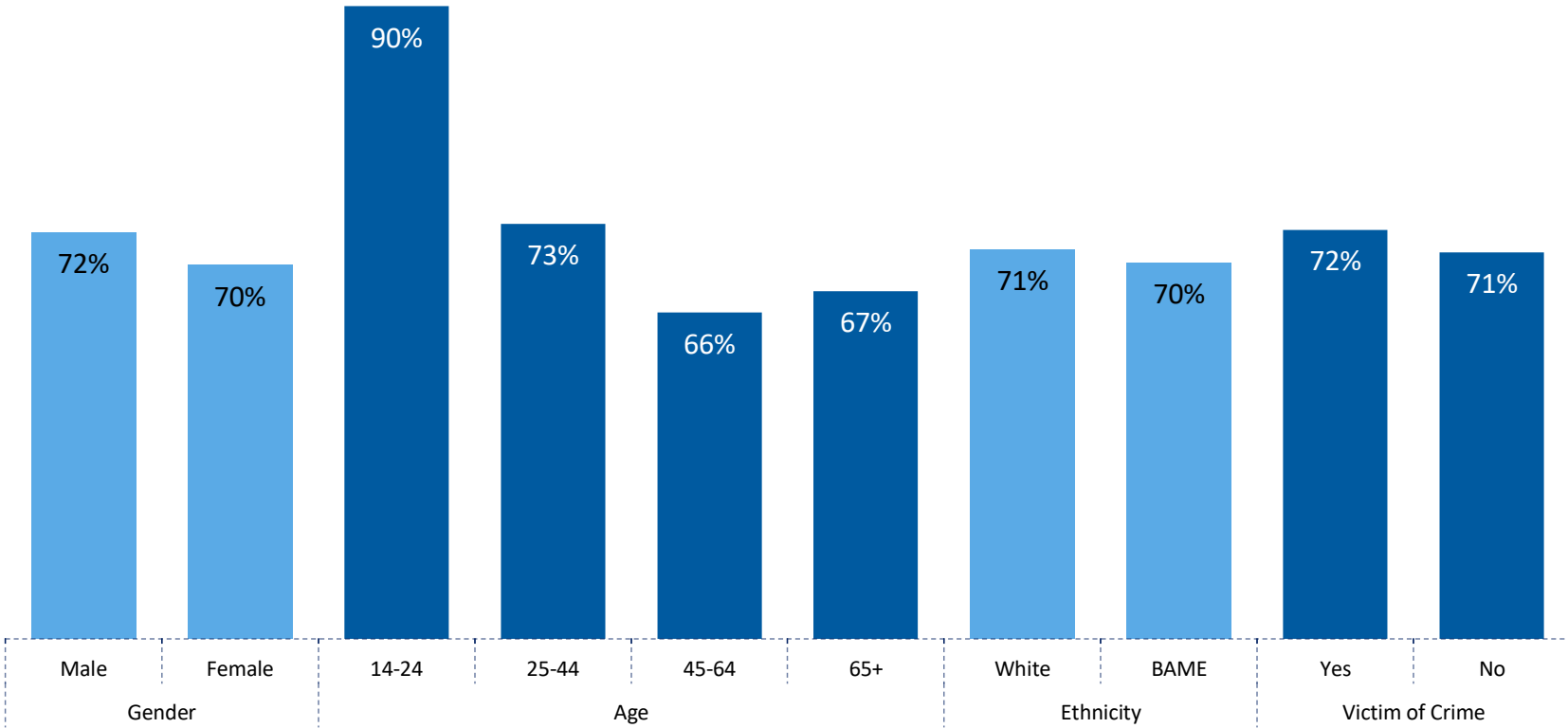

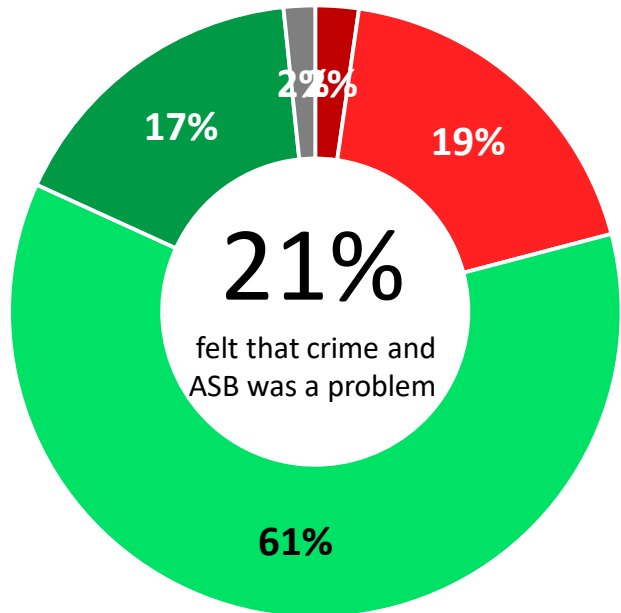

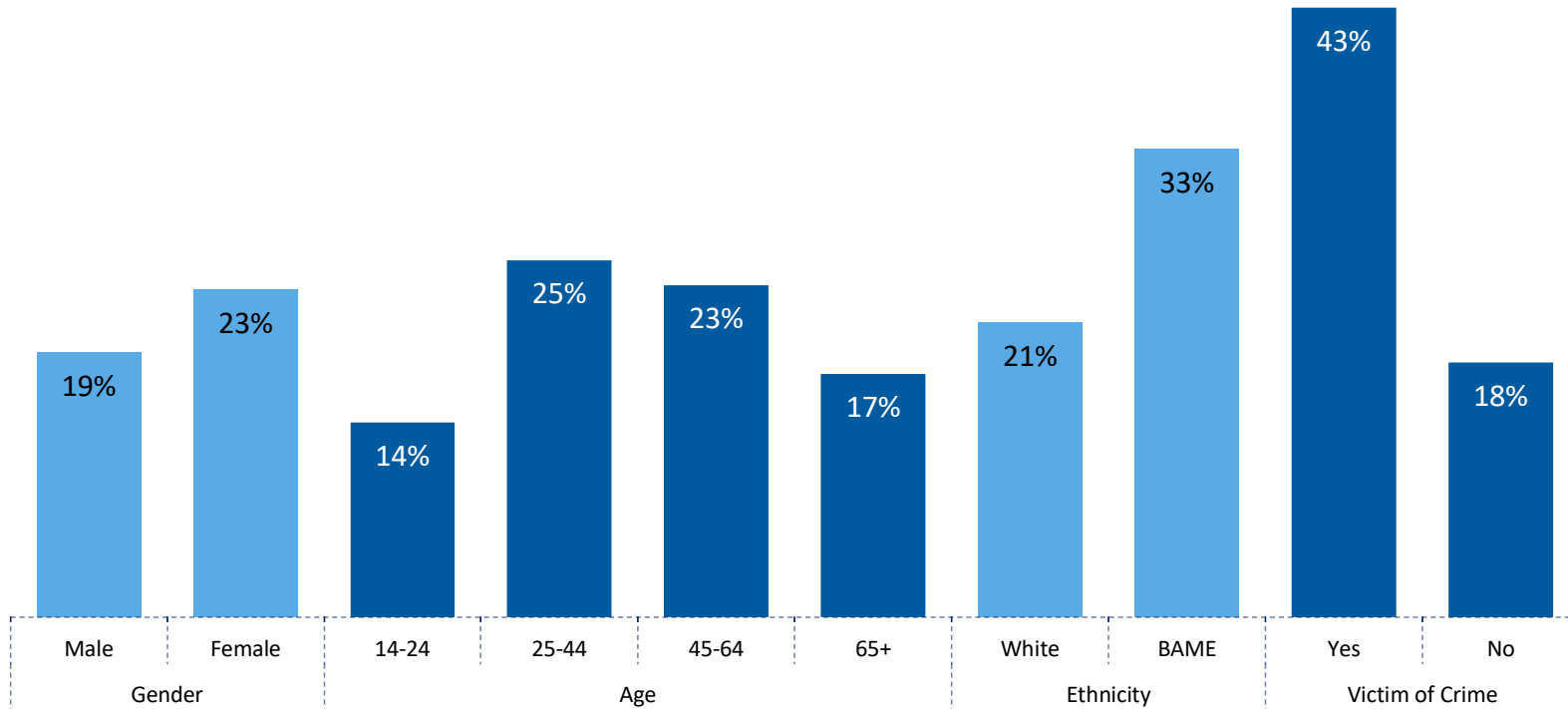


Trend over time - % A very / quite a big problem

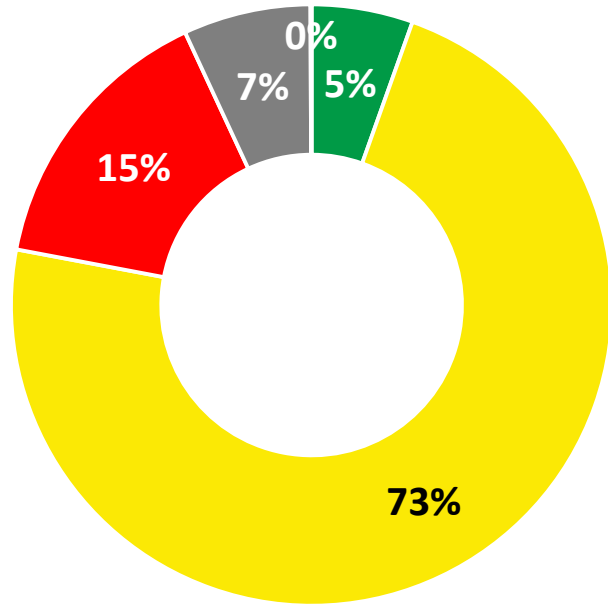

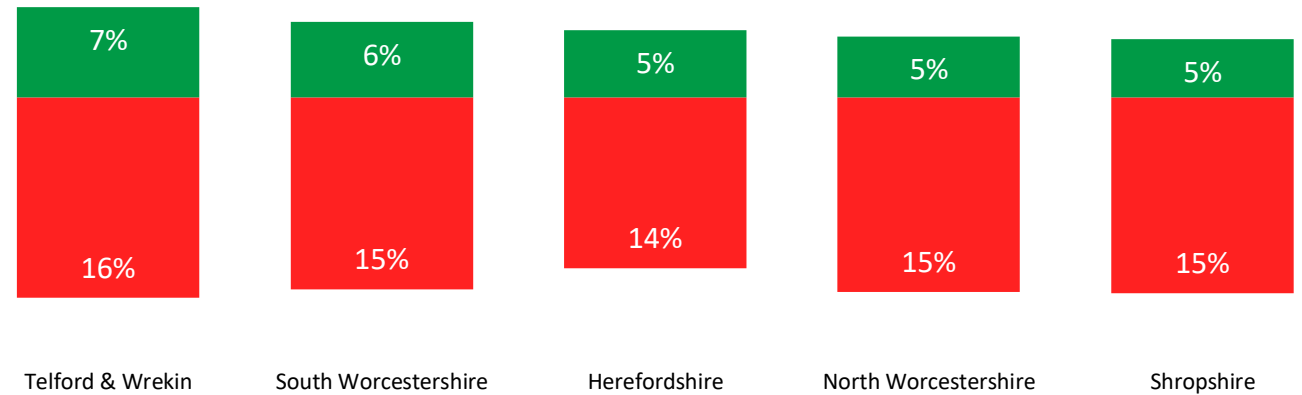

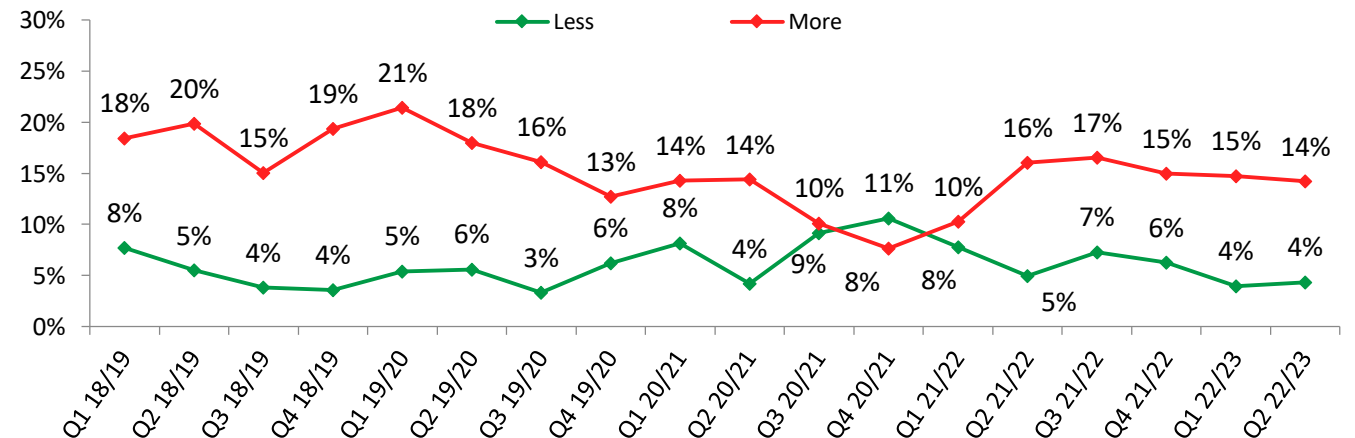

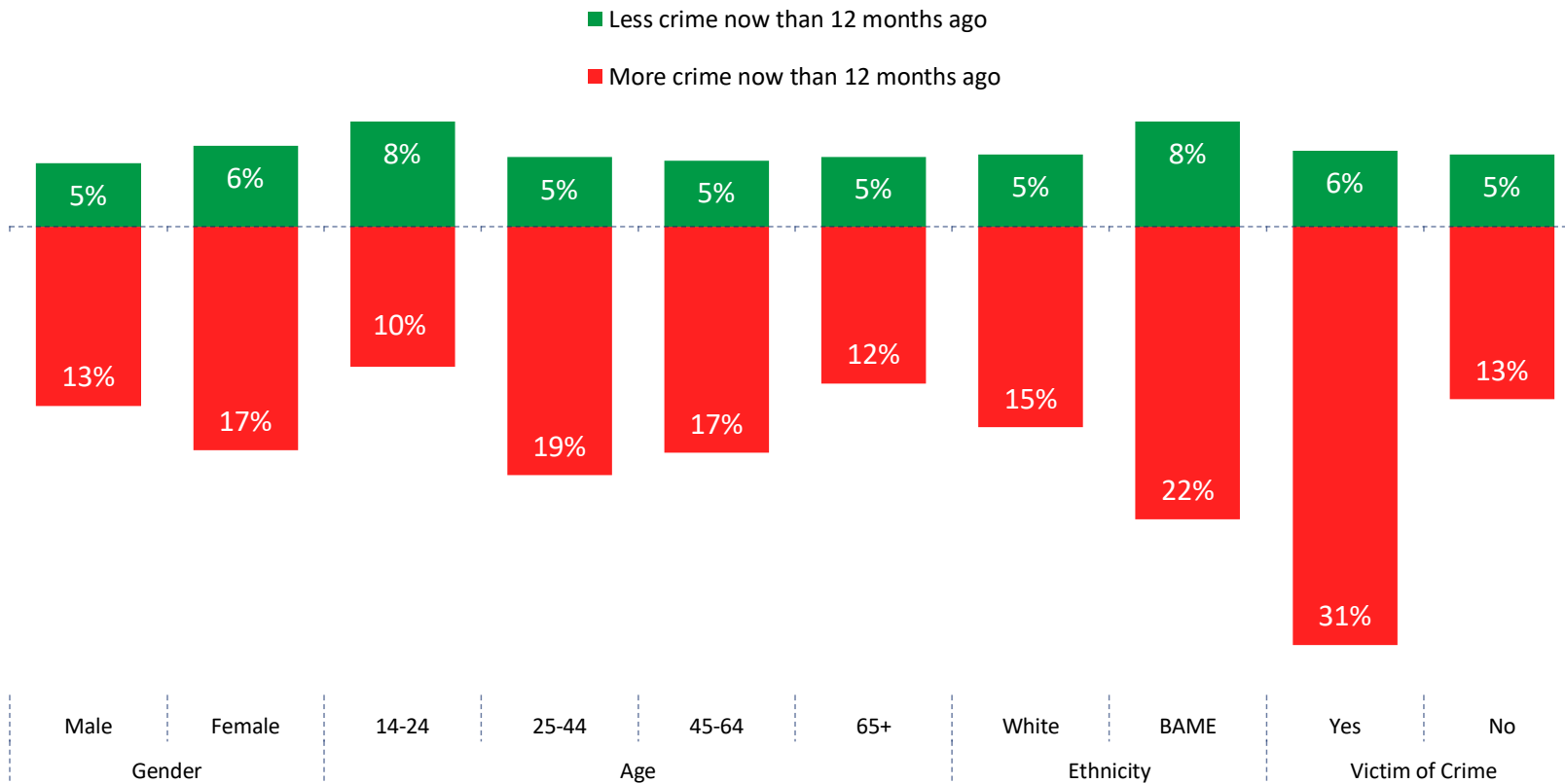

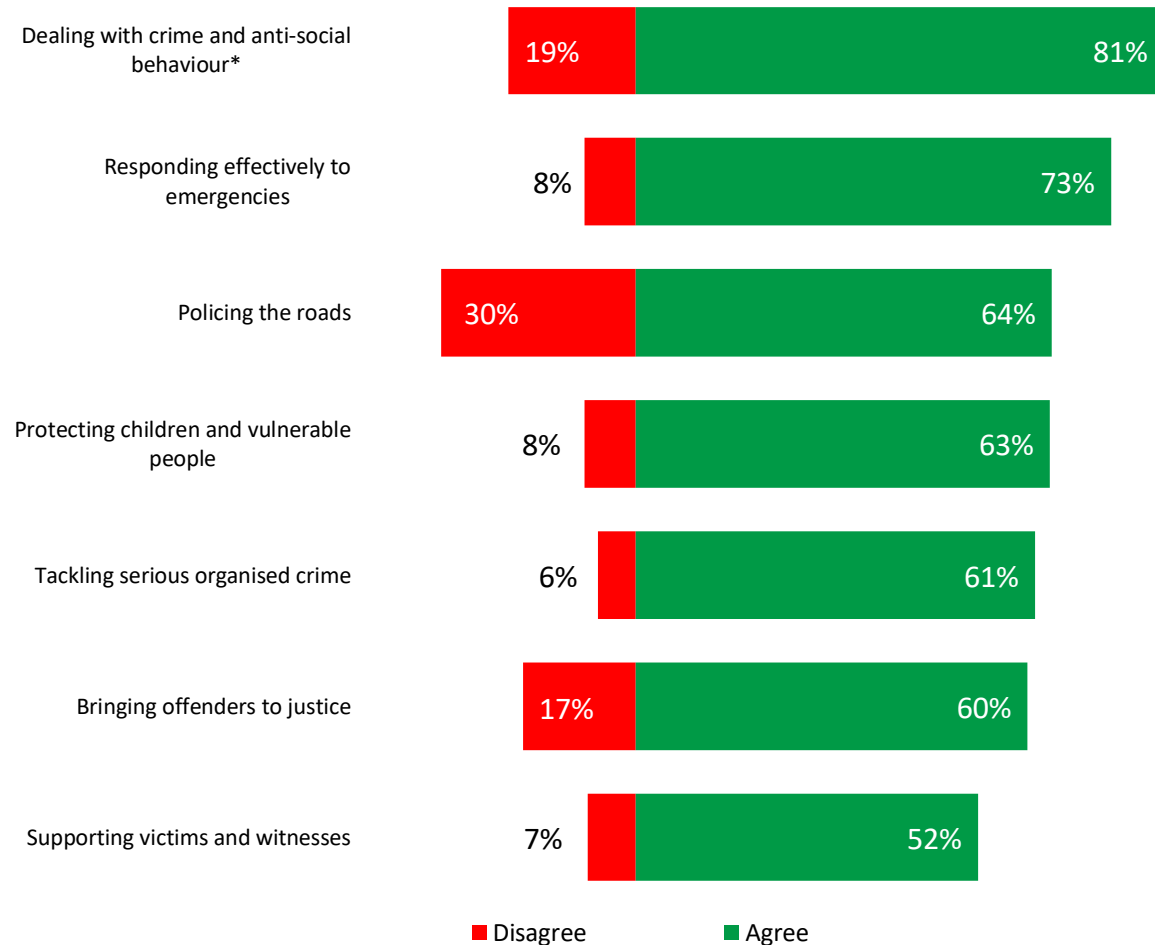

Key Insights

- Just under three-quarters agreed WMP are responding effectively to emergencies
- Around a fifth disagree that WMP are dealing with crime and ASB and bringing offenders to justice
- A third disagreed that WMP are policing the roads
- Agreement towards statements generally declined the older the respondent was
- BAME respondents tended to be more agreeable towards these statements compared to white respondents

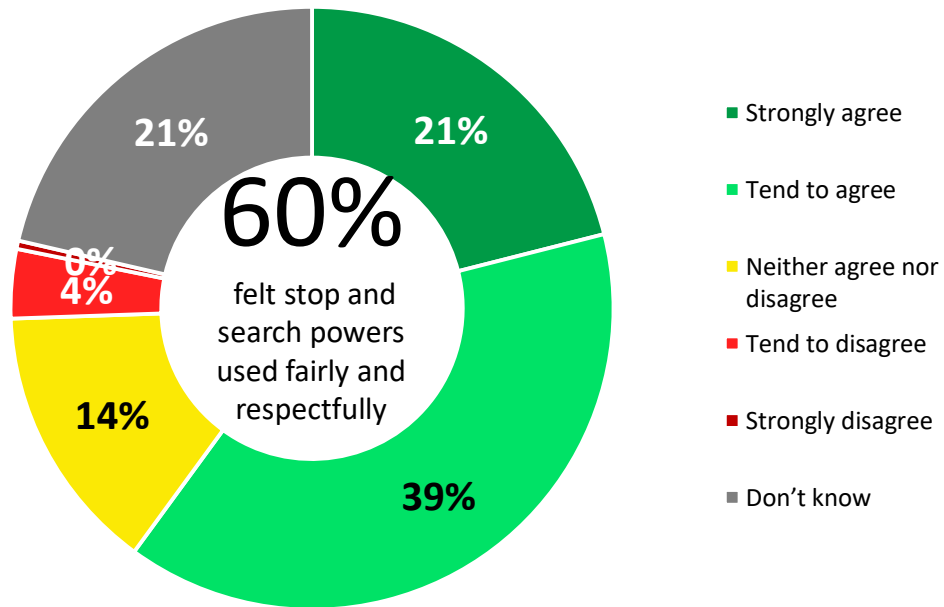

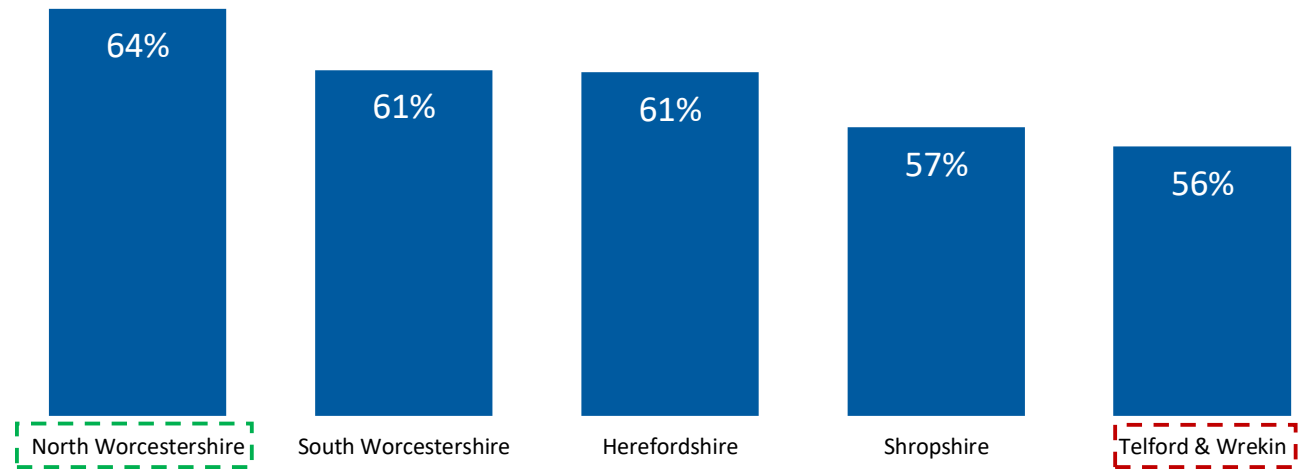

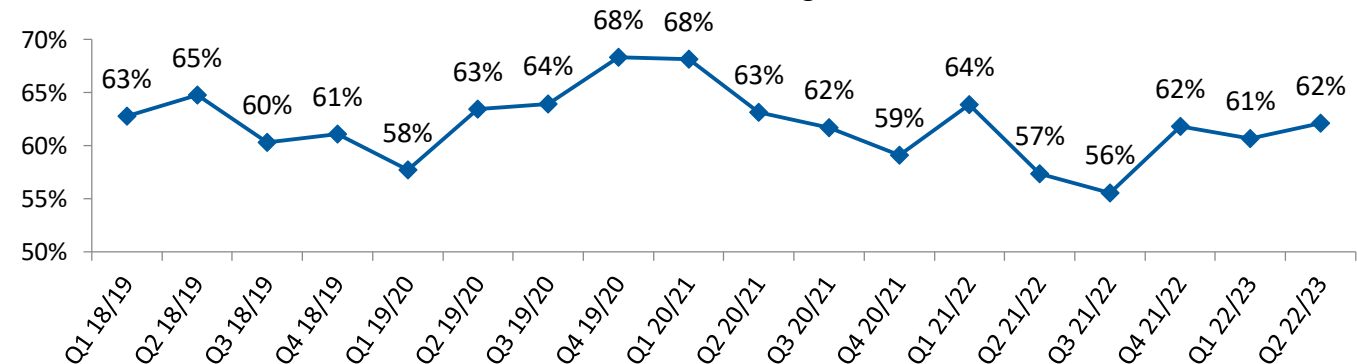
Three-fifths confident WMP use their stop and search power fairly and respectfully



LPA Comparisons - % strongly / tend to agree

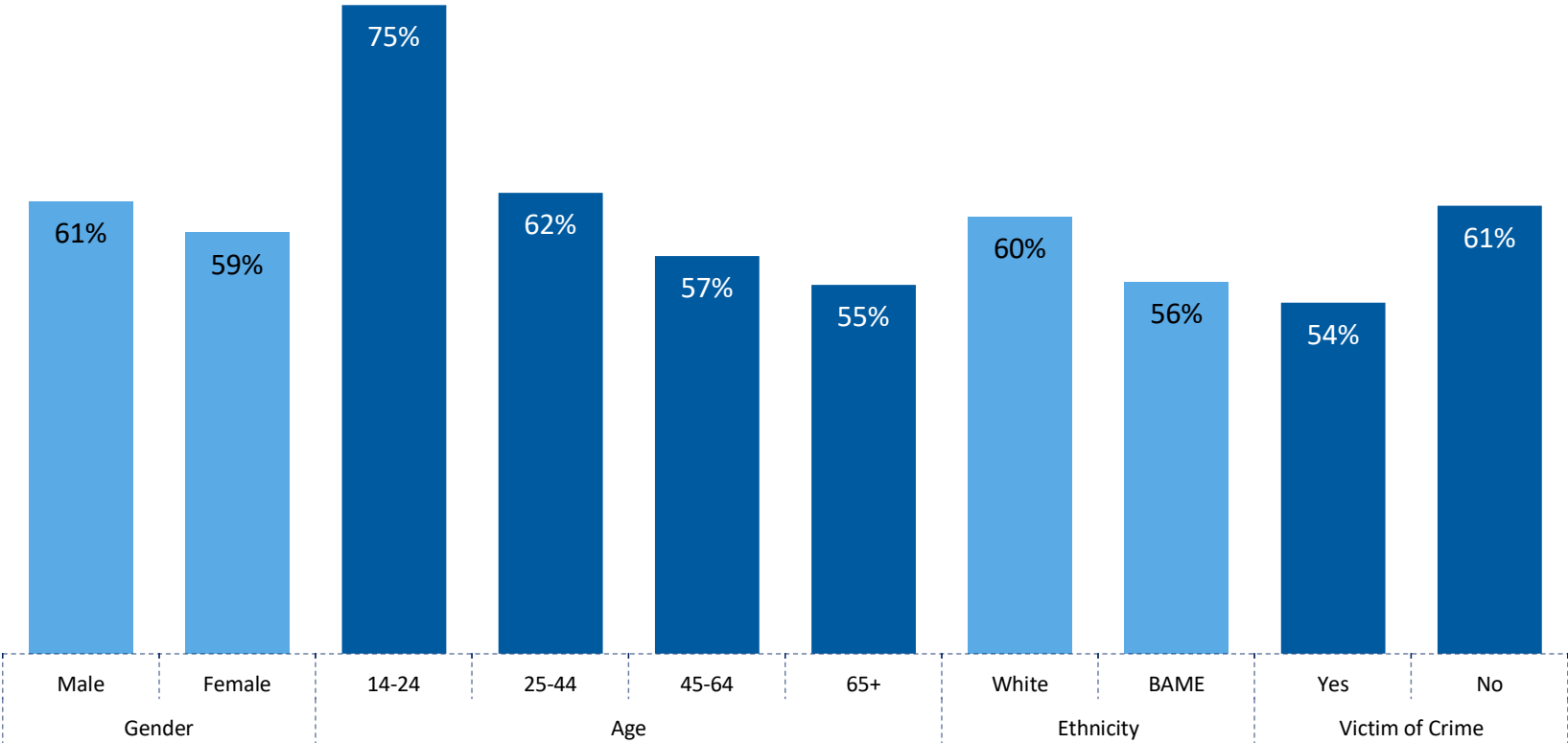


Trend over time - % Agree

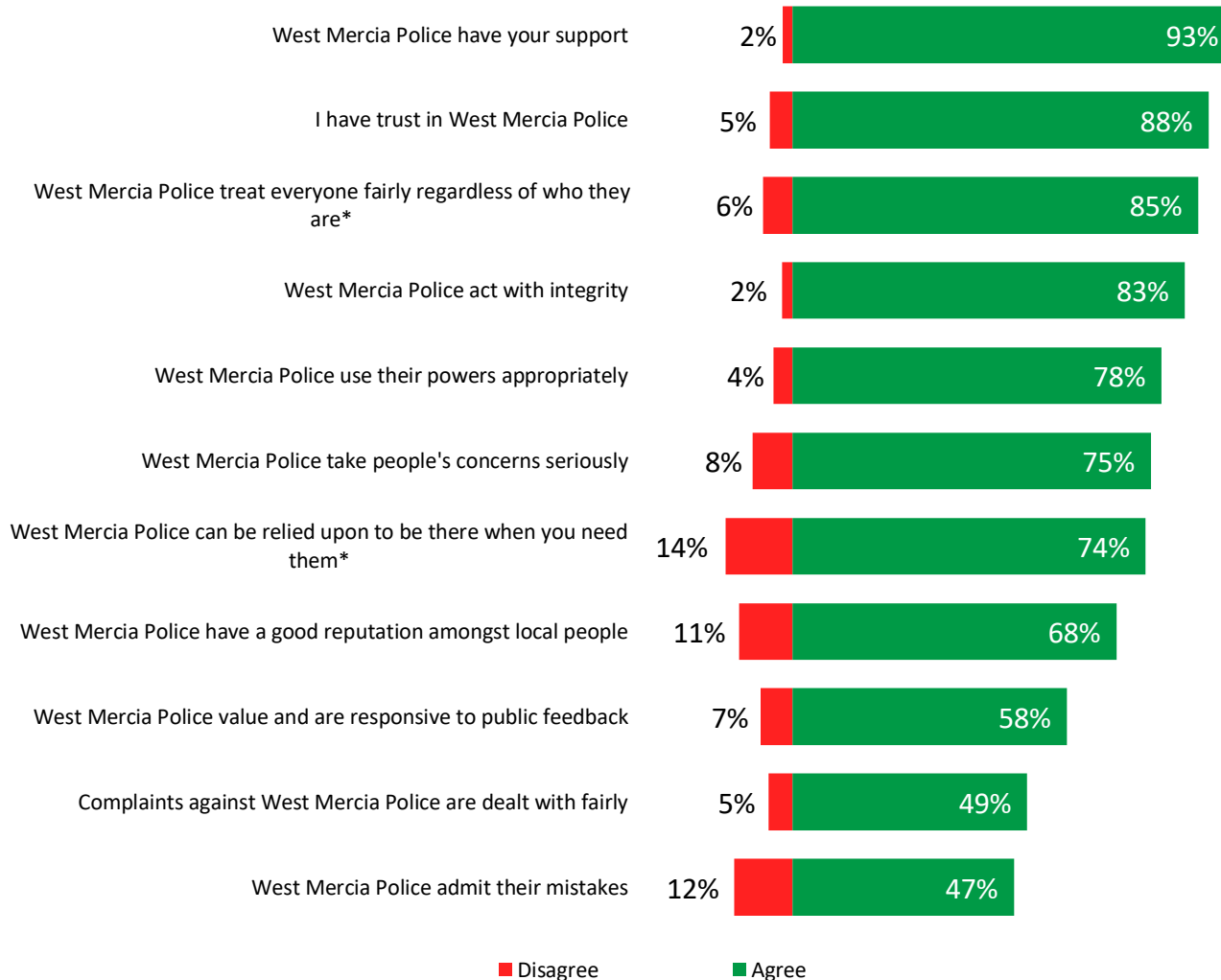

BAME respondents less confident the police use their stop and search power fairly and respectfully compared to white respondents

Key Insights

Over 9 out of every 10 residents say that WMP have their support

Over 8 in 10 say they have trust in WMP, they believe WMP treat everyone fairly regardless of who they are and that WMP act with integrity

More than a tenth disagreed WMP can be relied upon to be there when needed, have a good reputation amongst local people and admit their mistakes

Less than half felt complaints against WMP are dealt with fairly and that WMP admit their mistakes

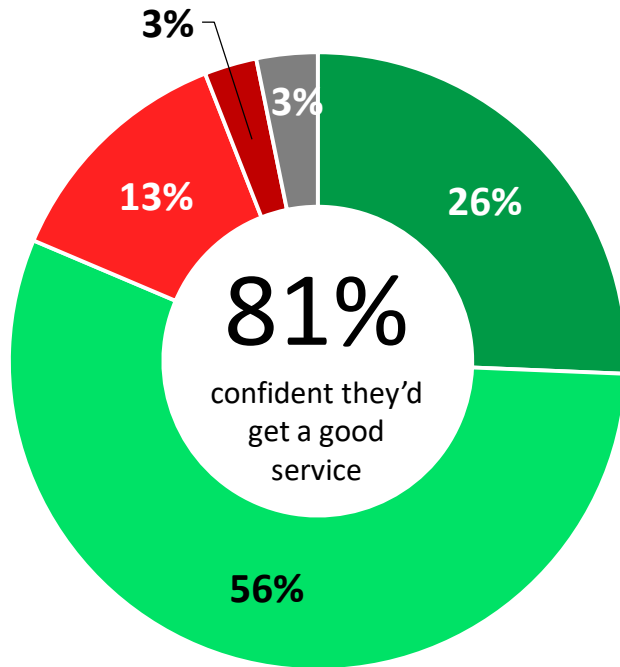

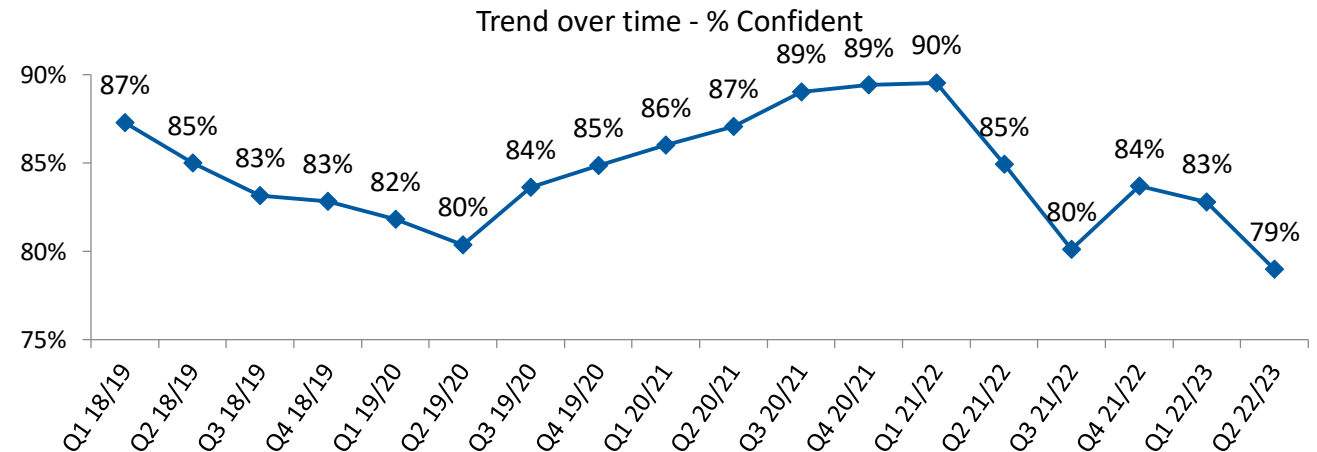
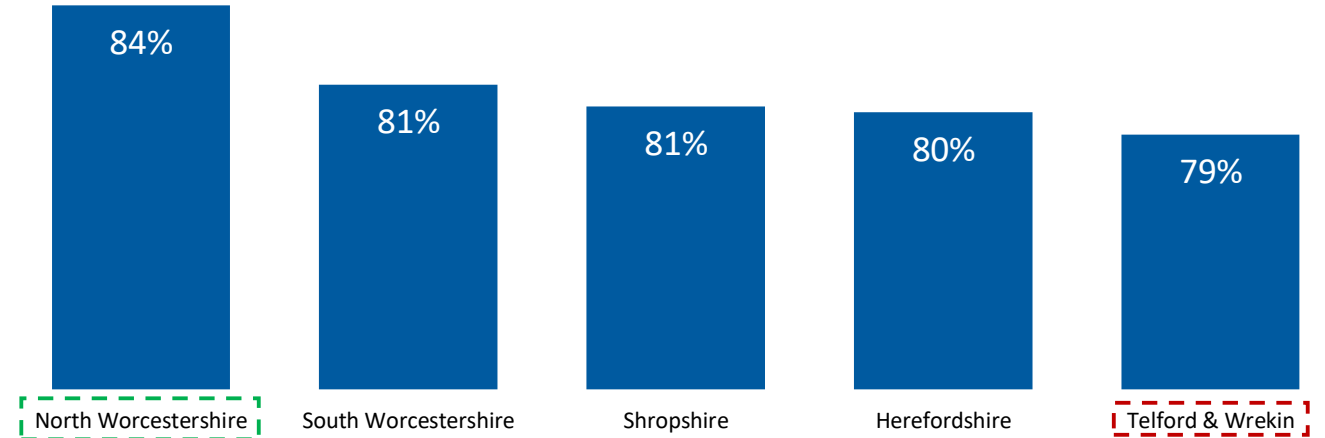

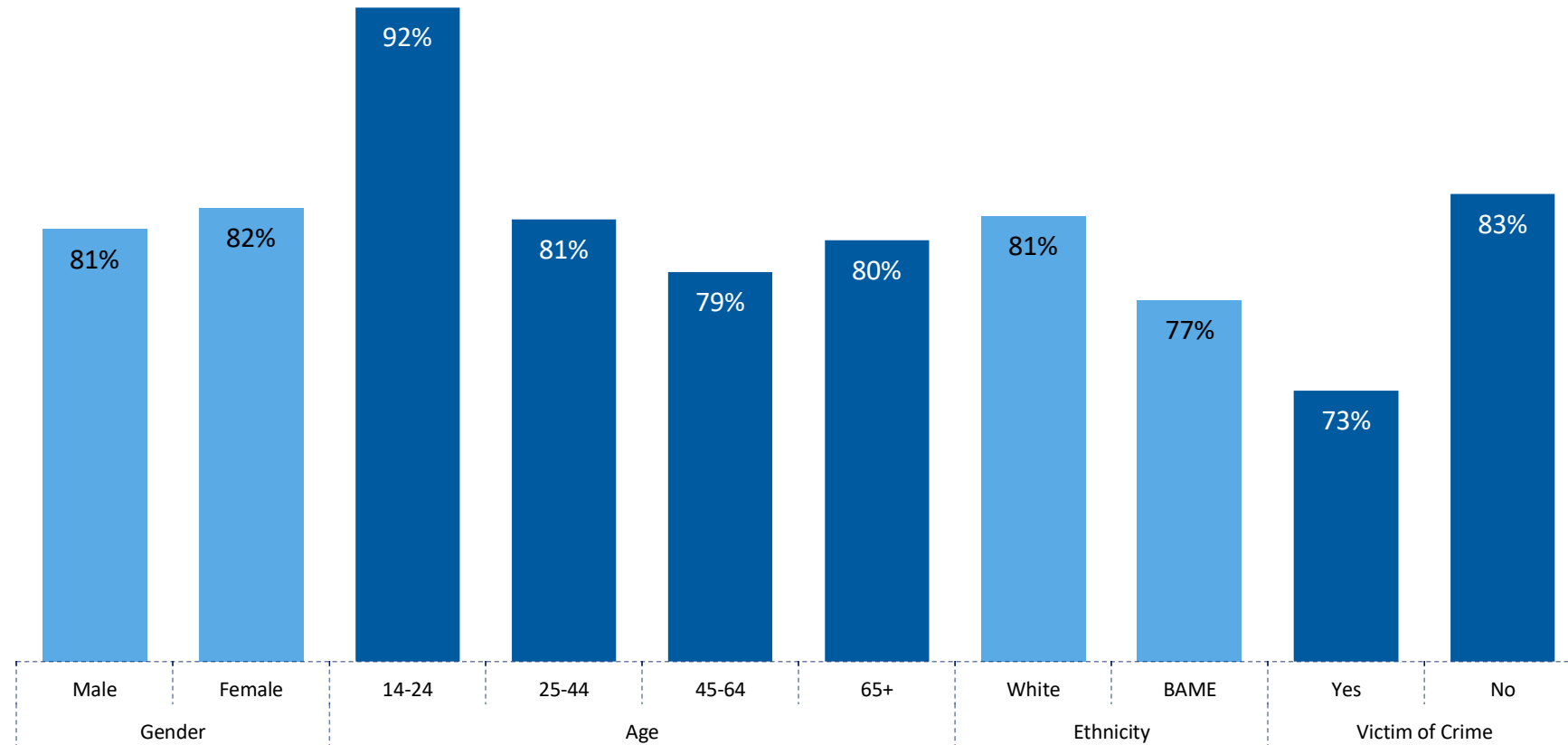

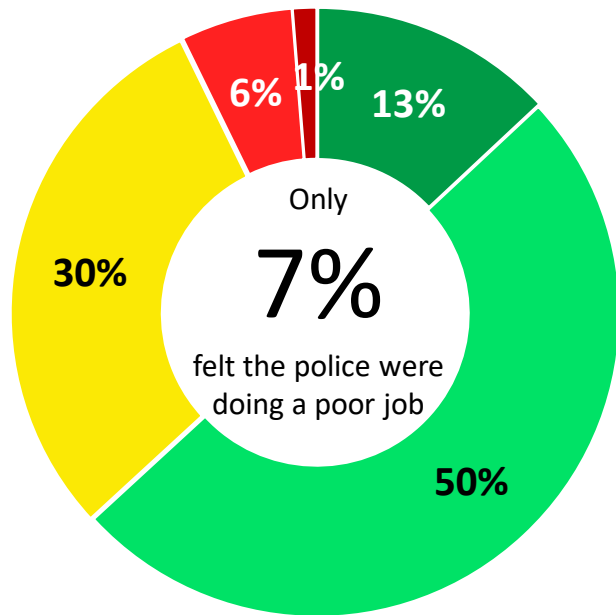

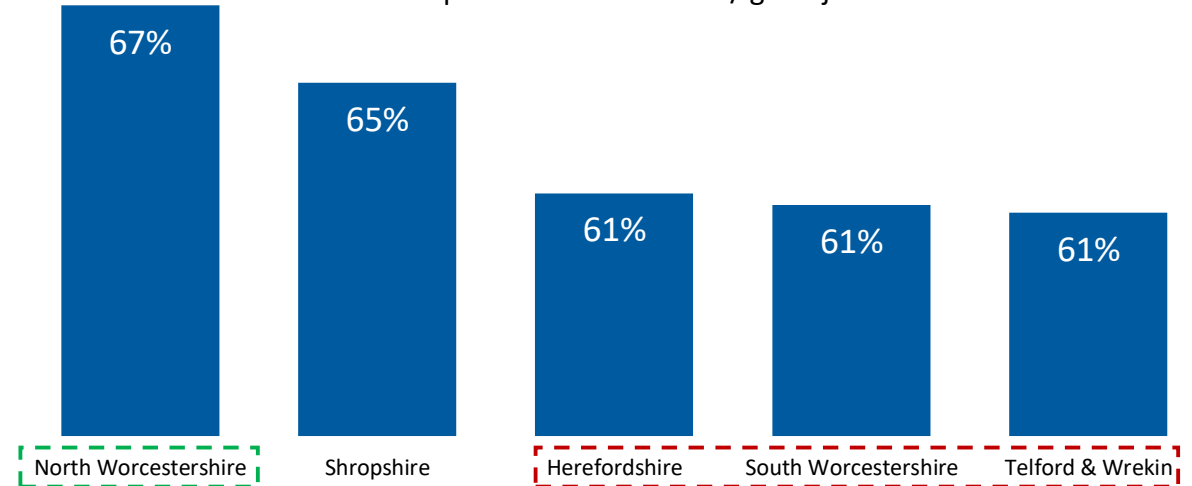

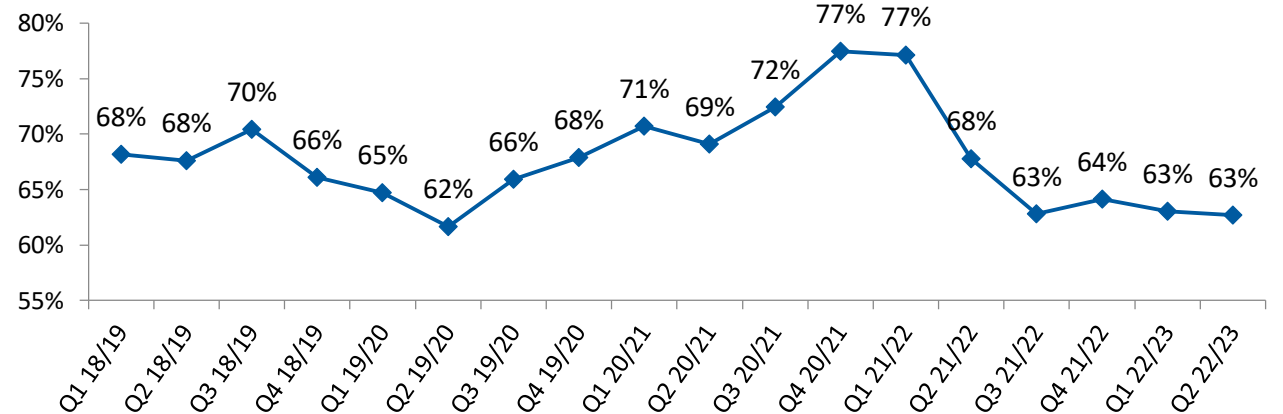

Trend over time - % Excellent / good job



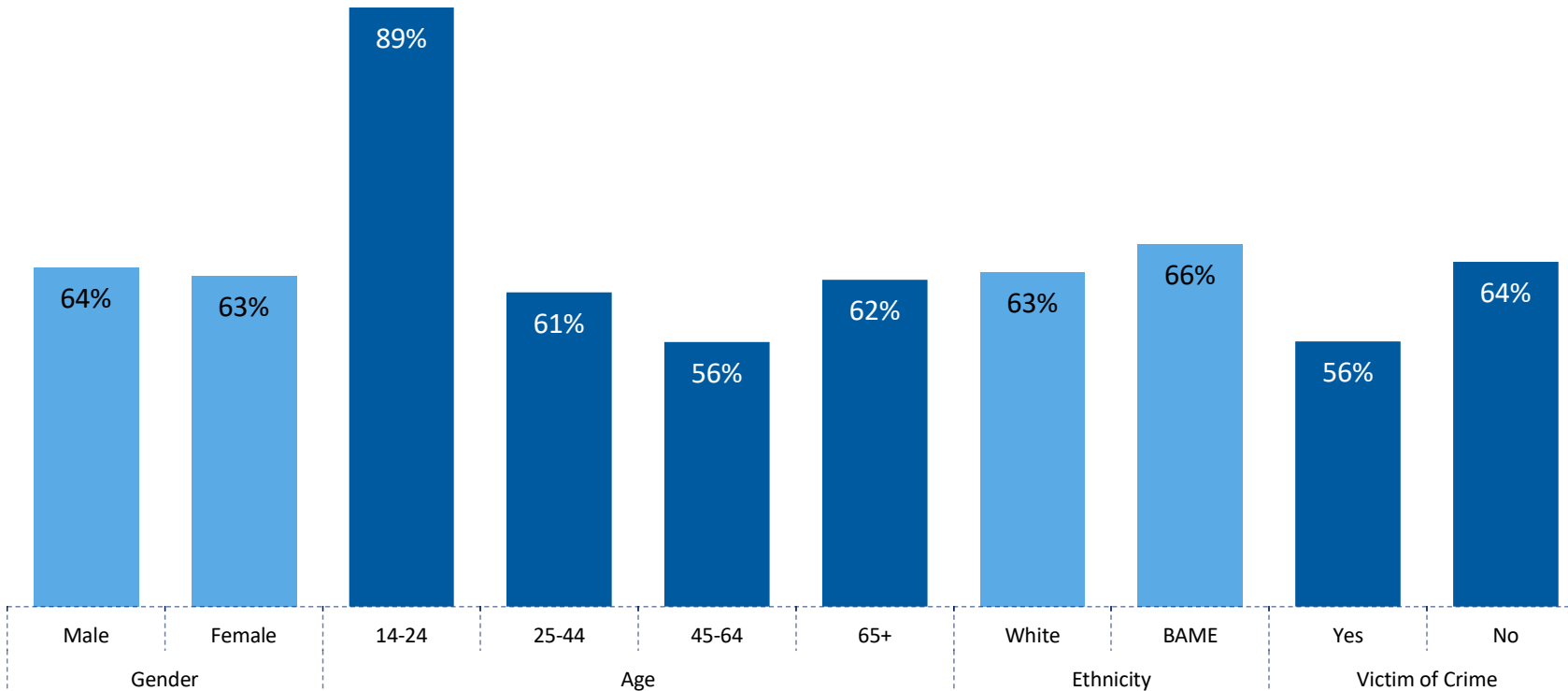
Q20 In general, how good a job do you think West Mercia Police are doing in your local area?

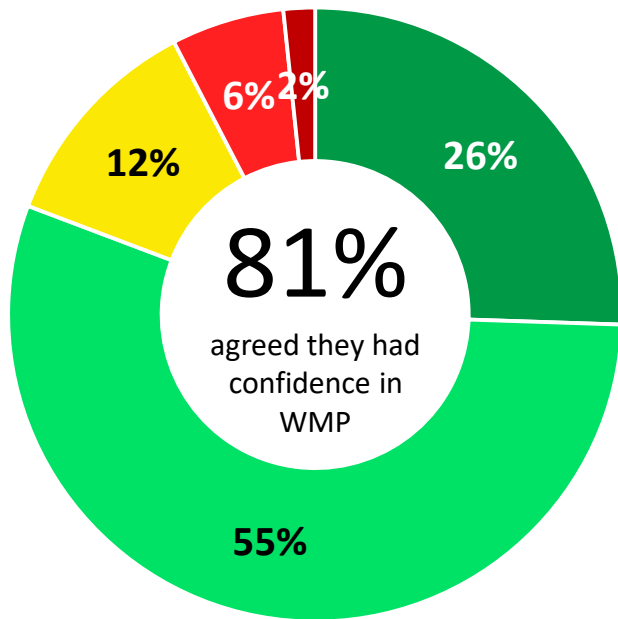

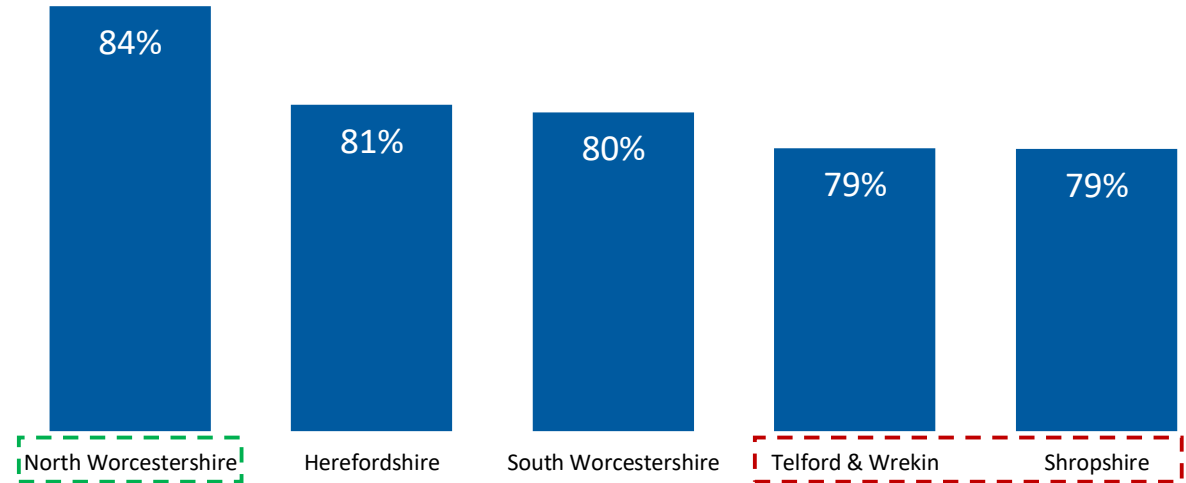

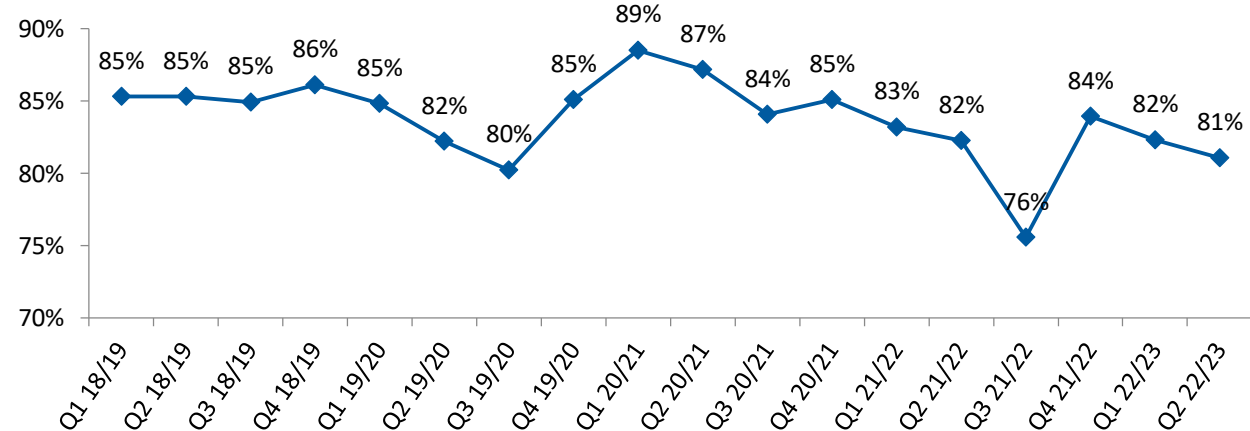

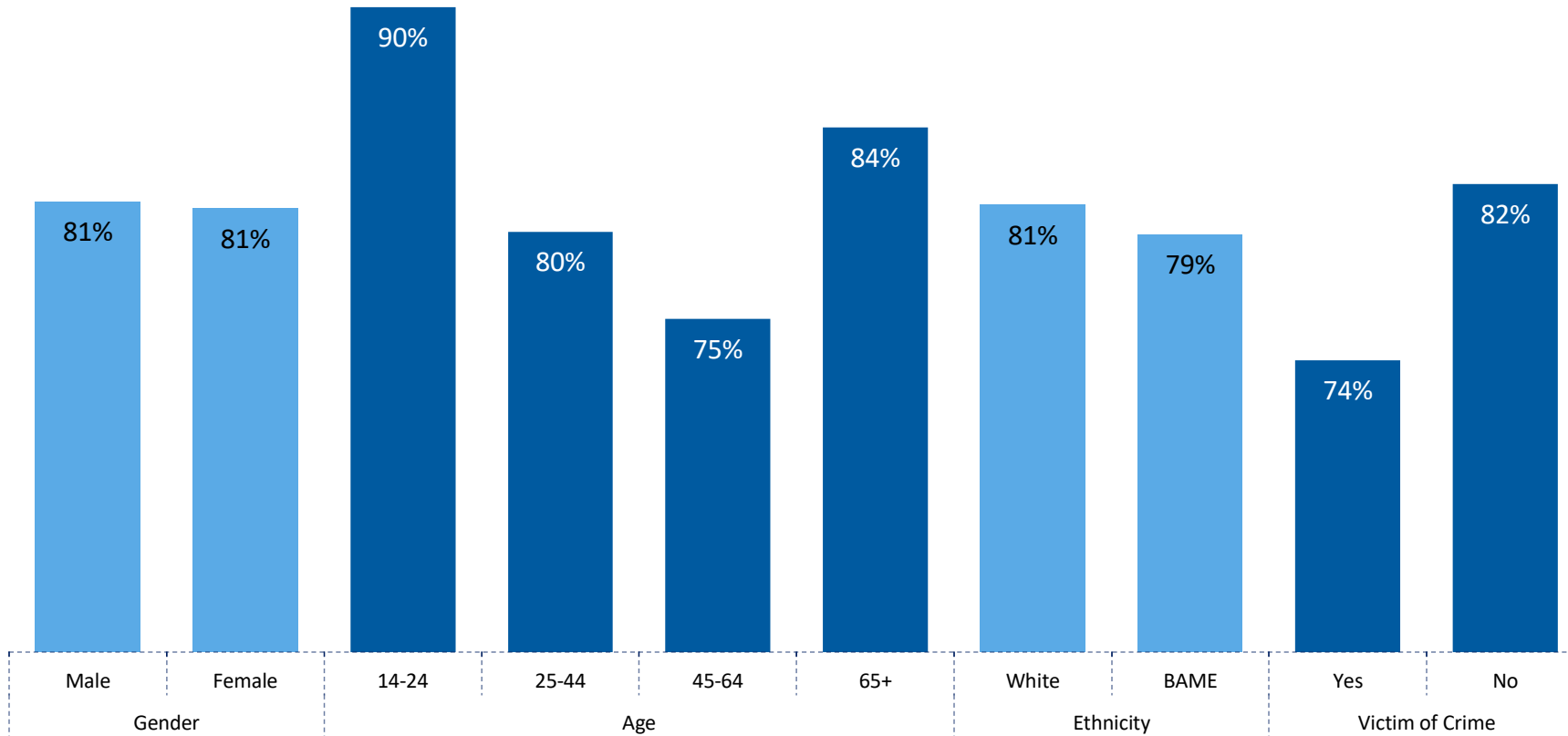

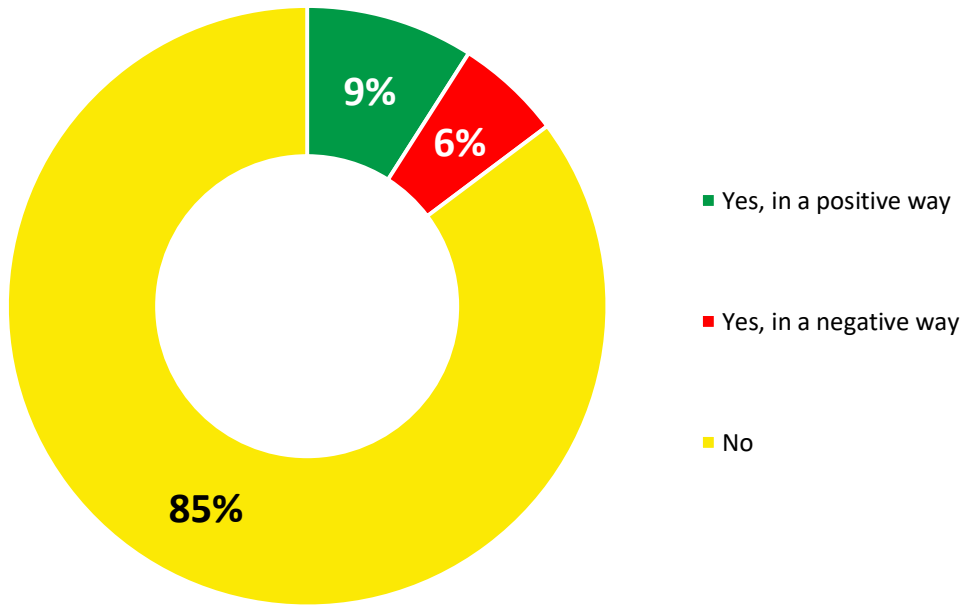

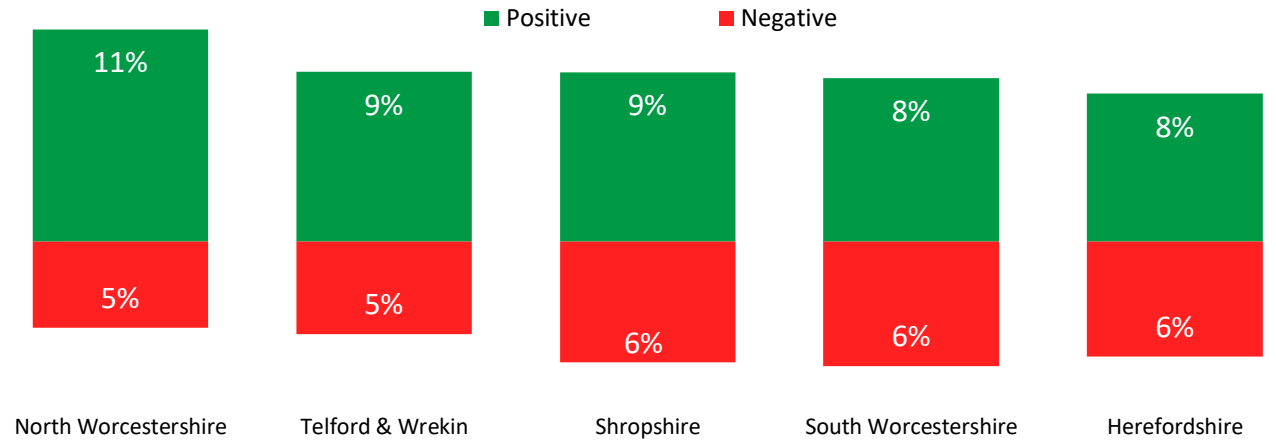

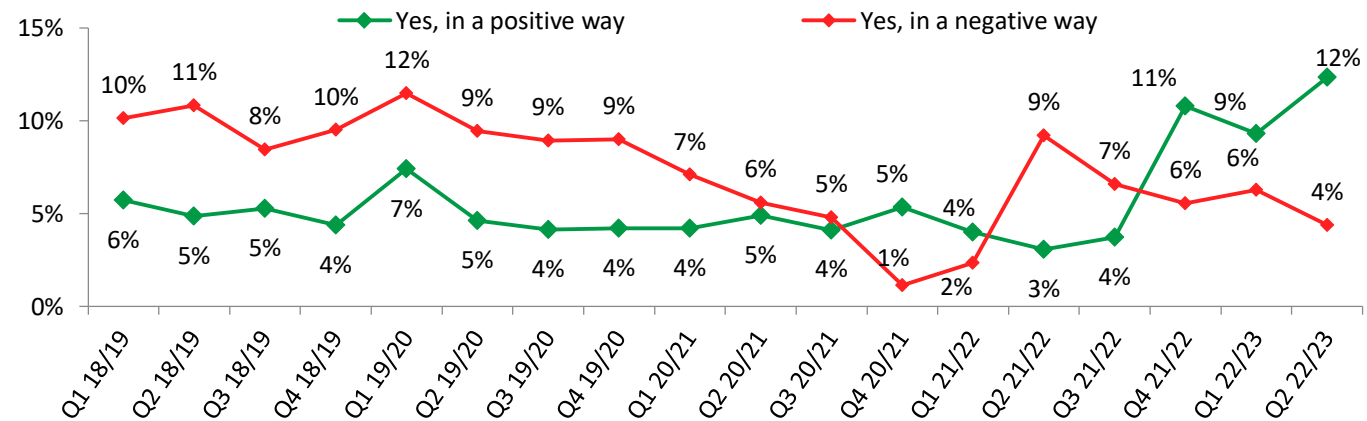

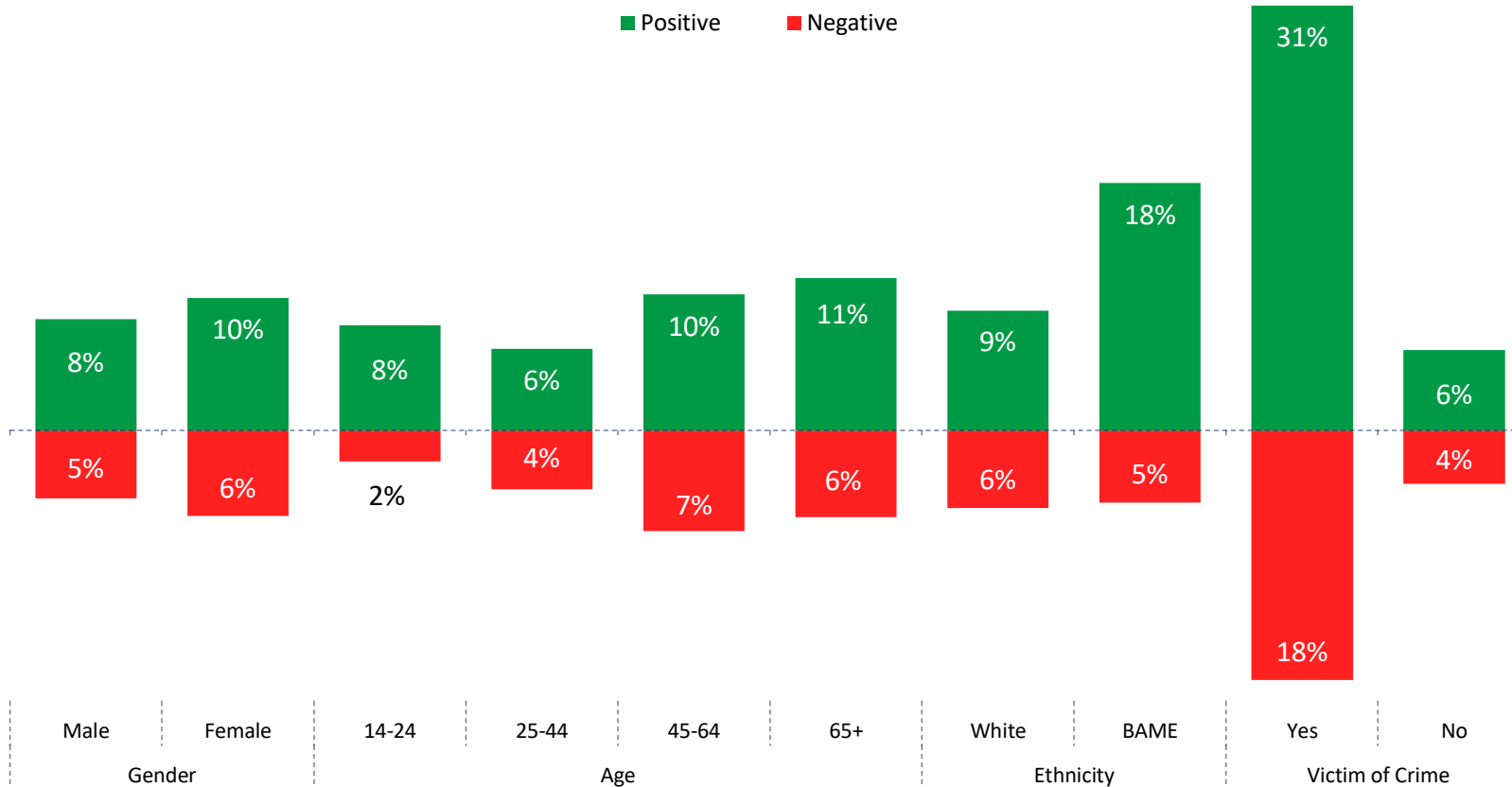


Trend over time - % Negative v % Positive

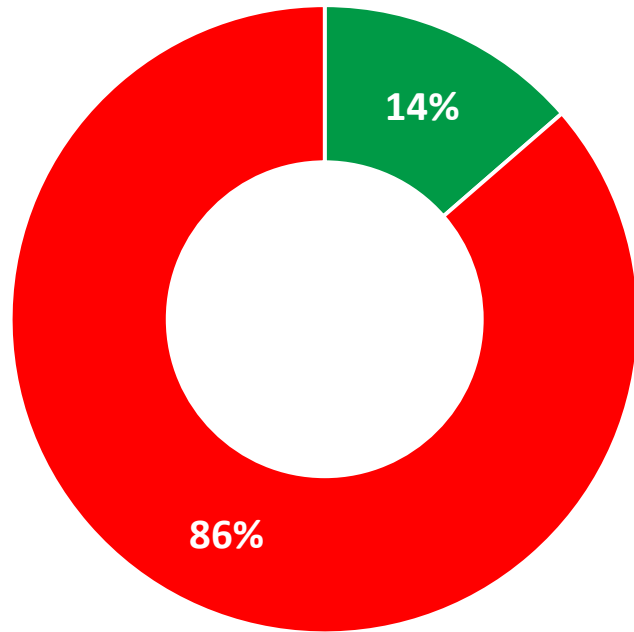

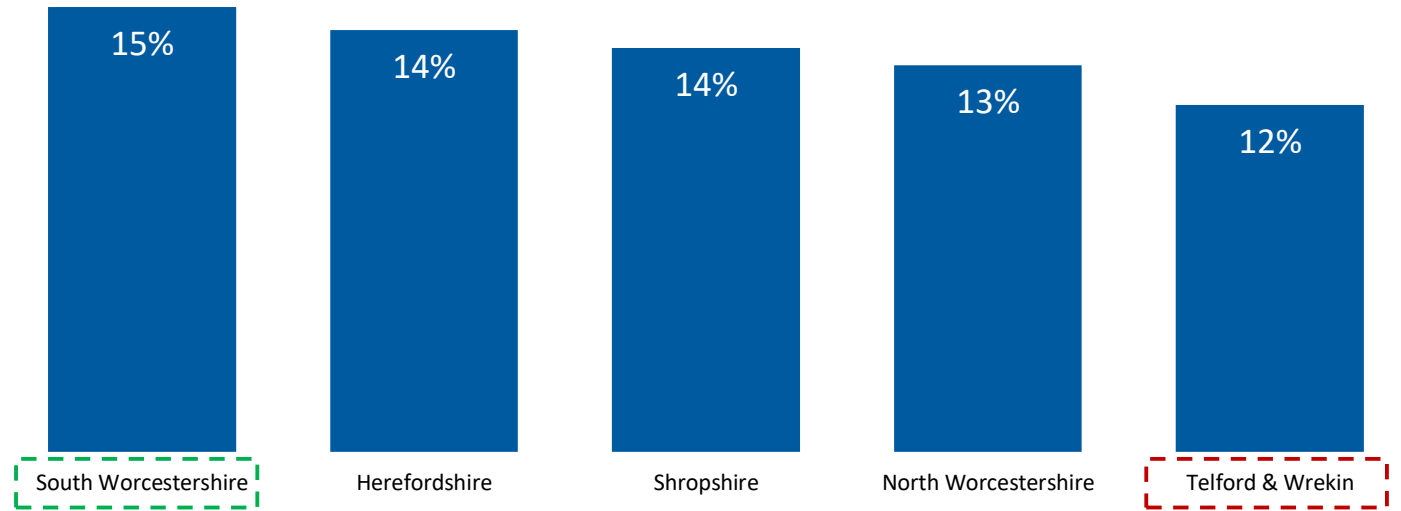

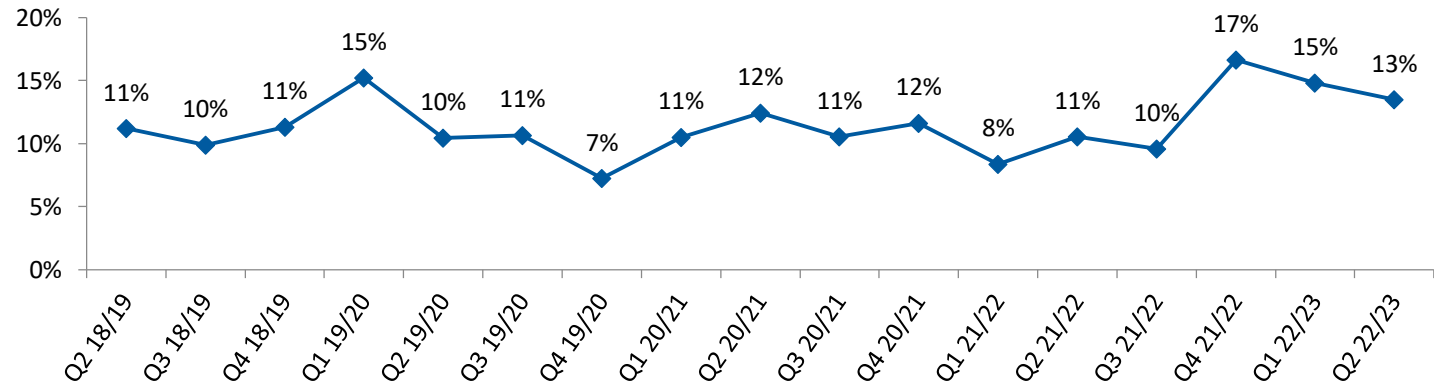

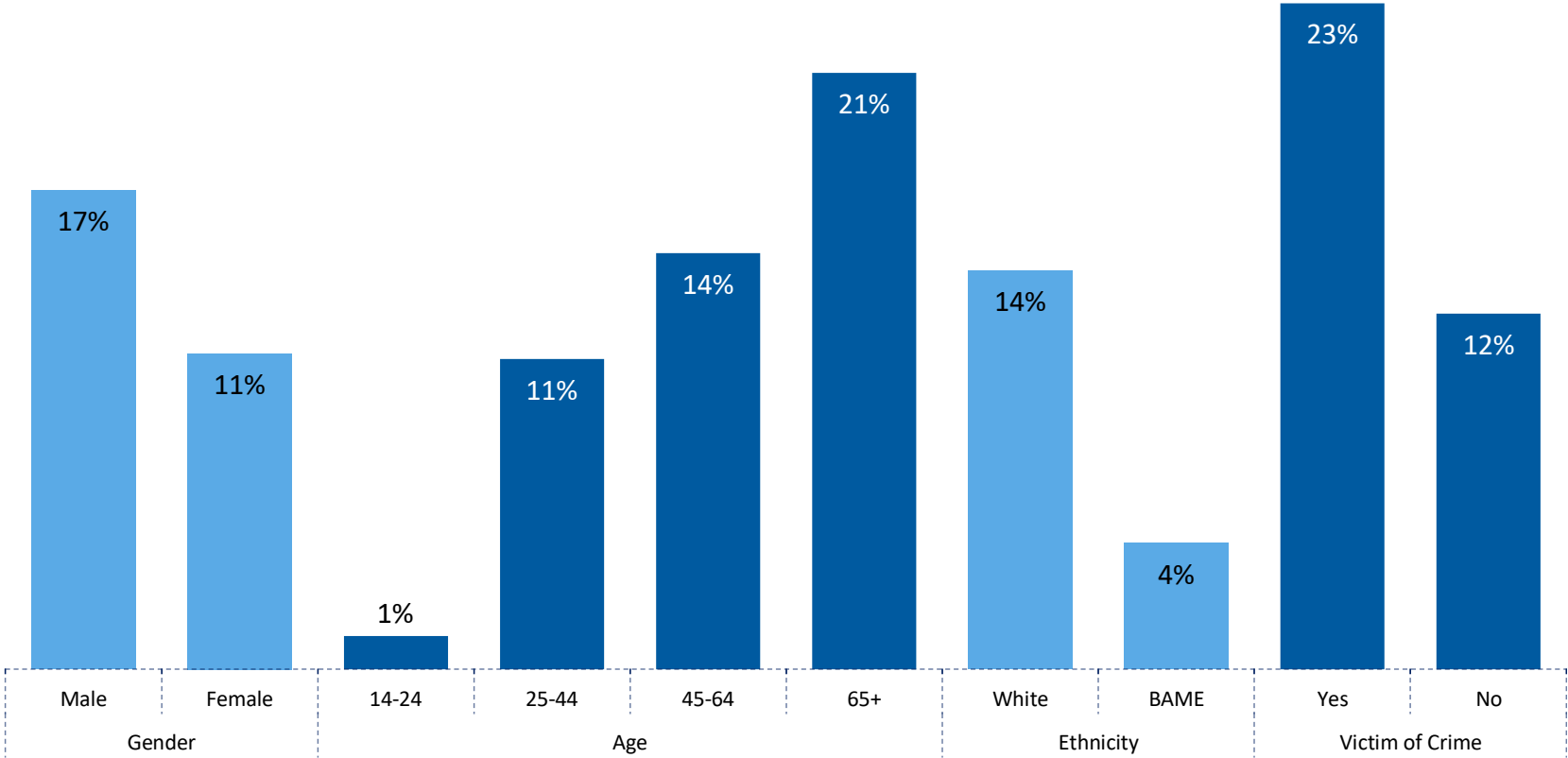


Trend over time - % Yes

Key Insights

Higher awareness found in South Worcestershire; least awareness in Telford & Wrekin

Males more likely to be aware of the PCC compared to females

Awareness lower amongst BAME respondents when compared to White respondents

The older the respondent the more likely they were to be aware of the PCC

Perceptions surveys typically record awareness of 8-15% based on previous research conducted by SMSR.

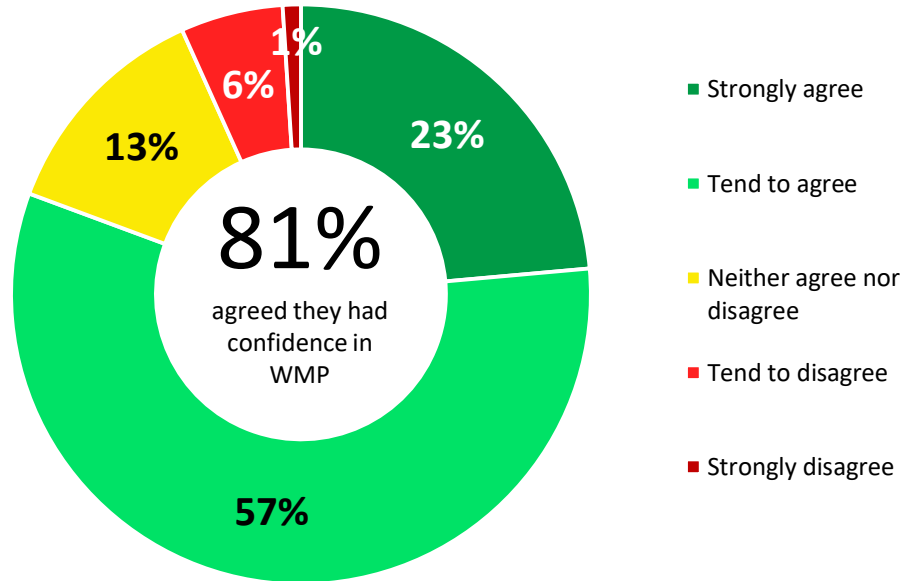

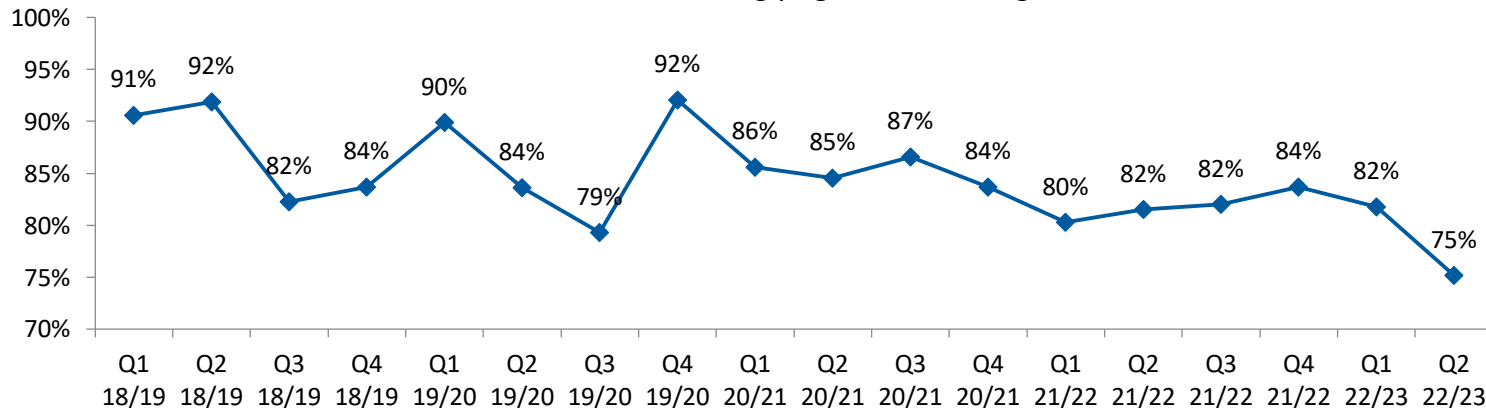

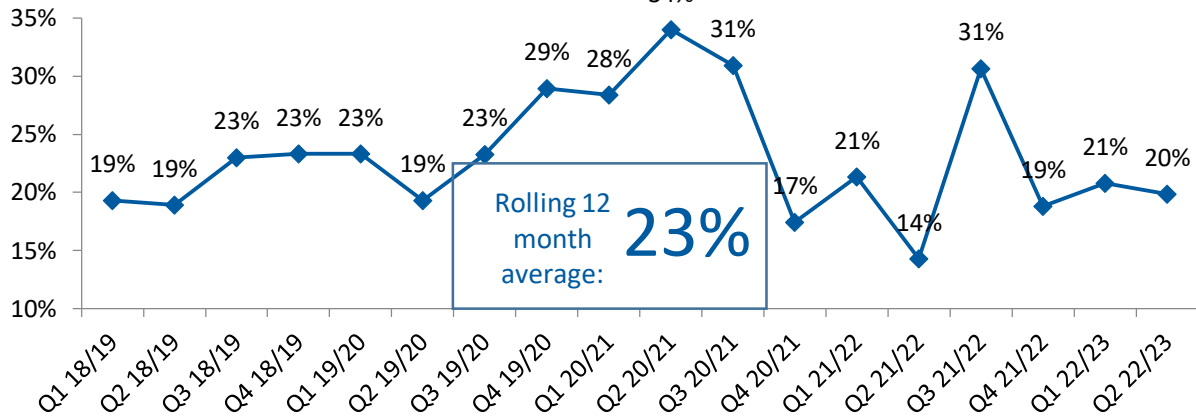

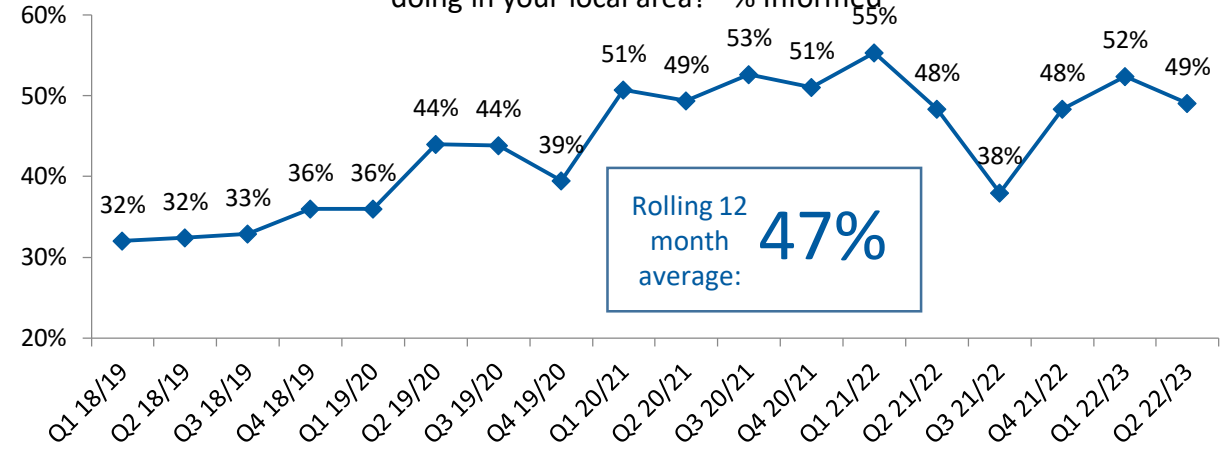

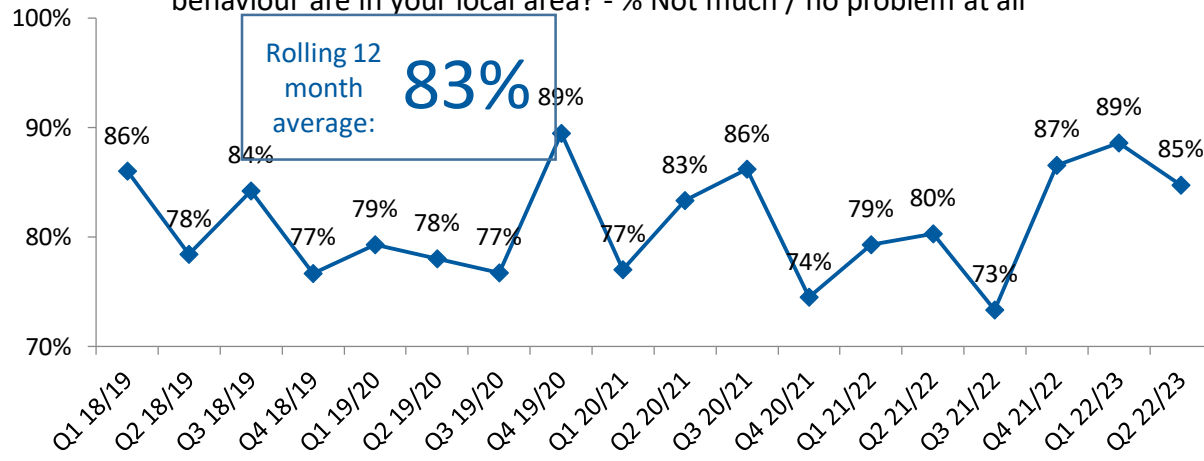

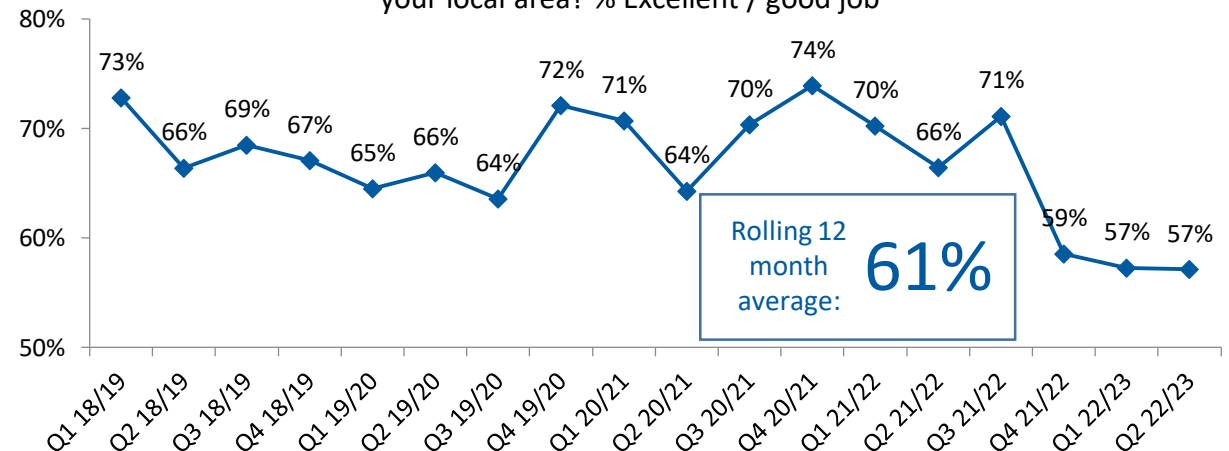

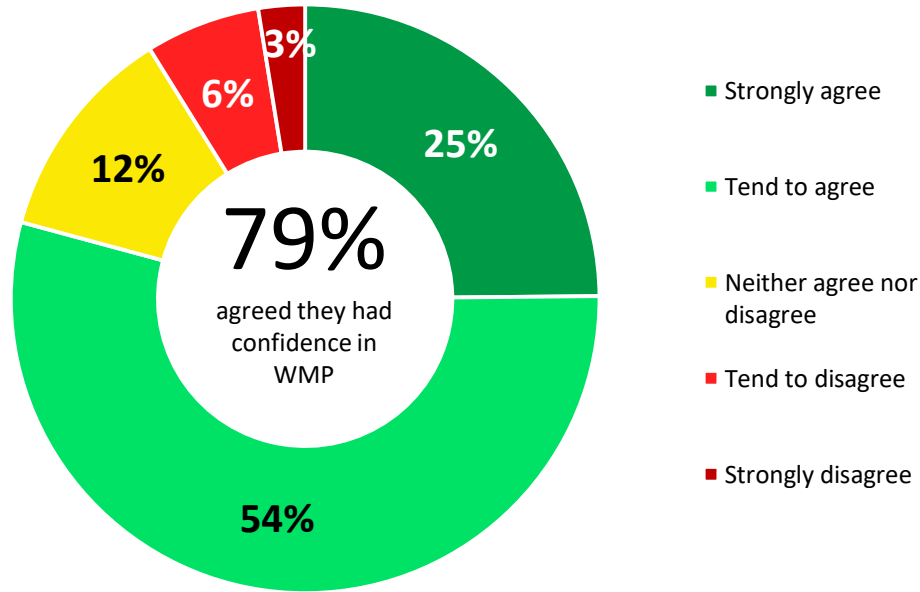

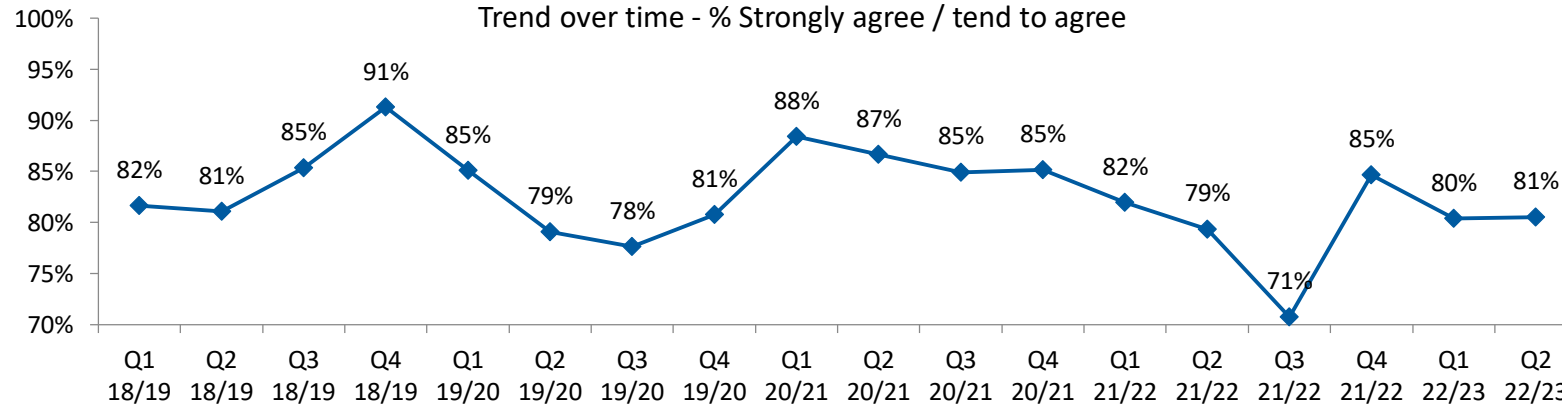

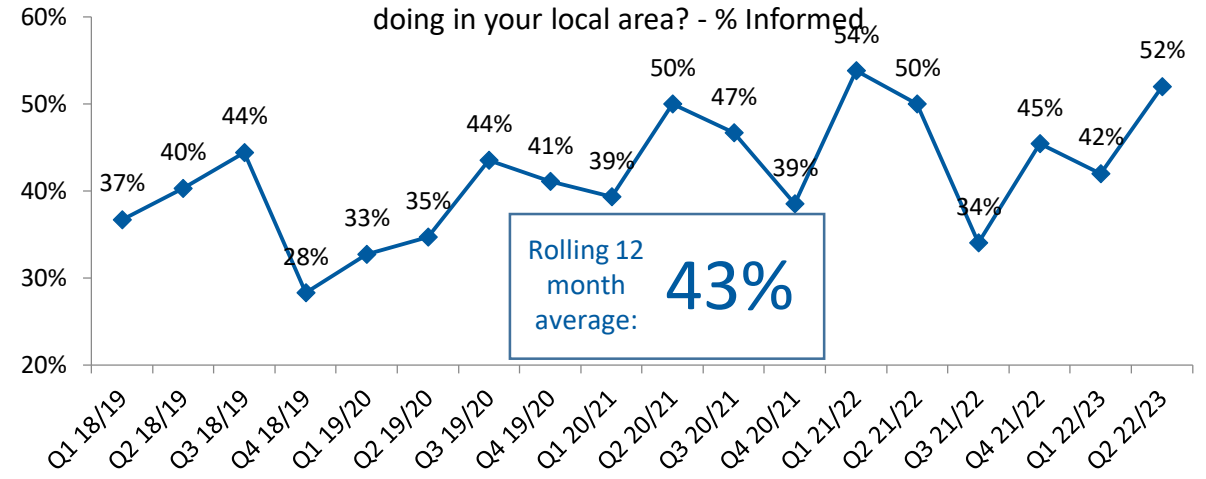

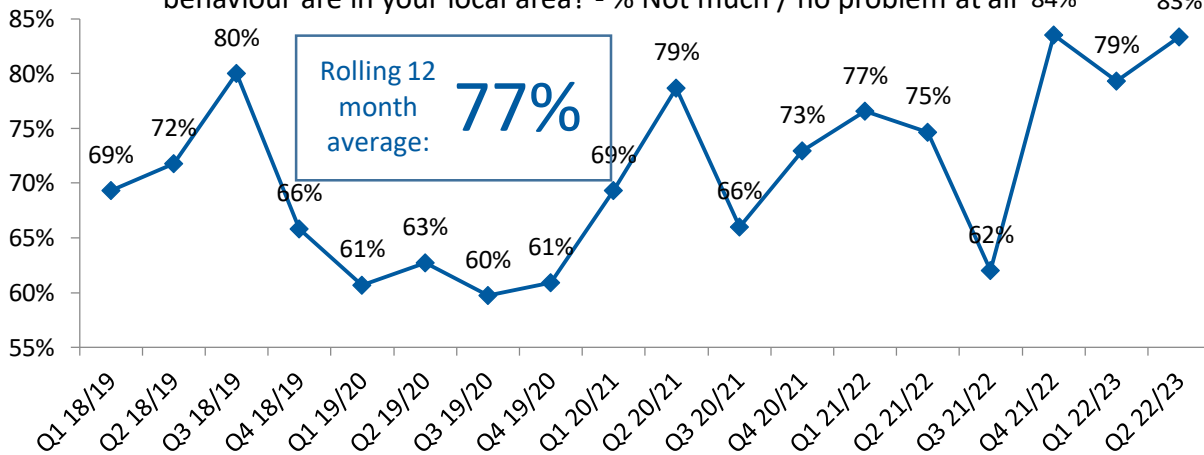
Thinking about your local area. How often would you say you see a police officer or Police Community Support Officer (PCSO)? - % At least weekly



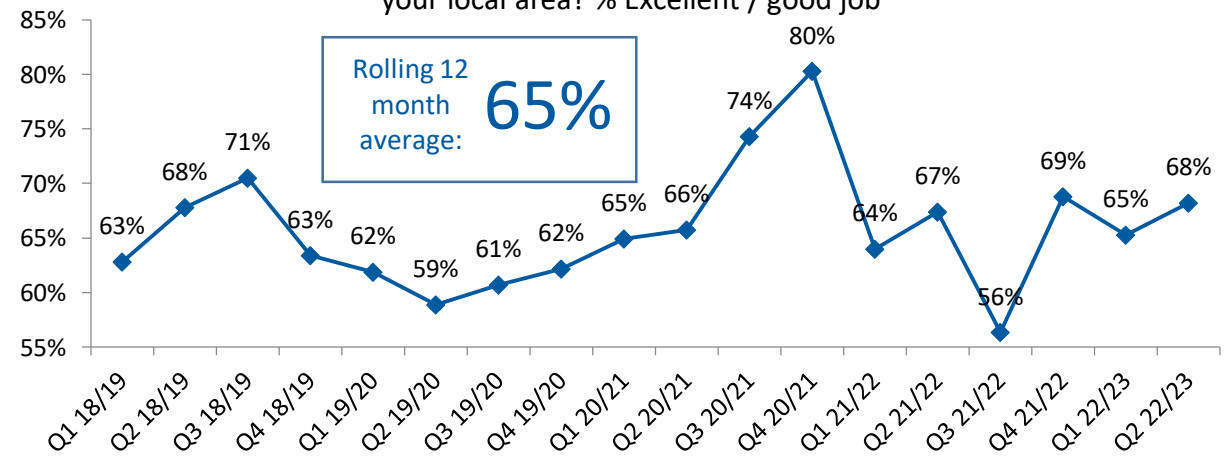

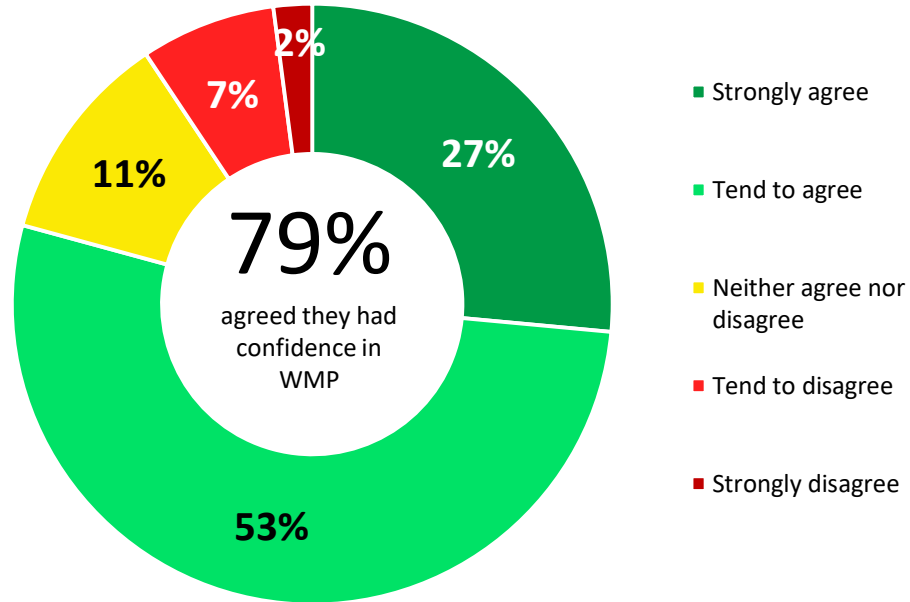

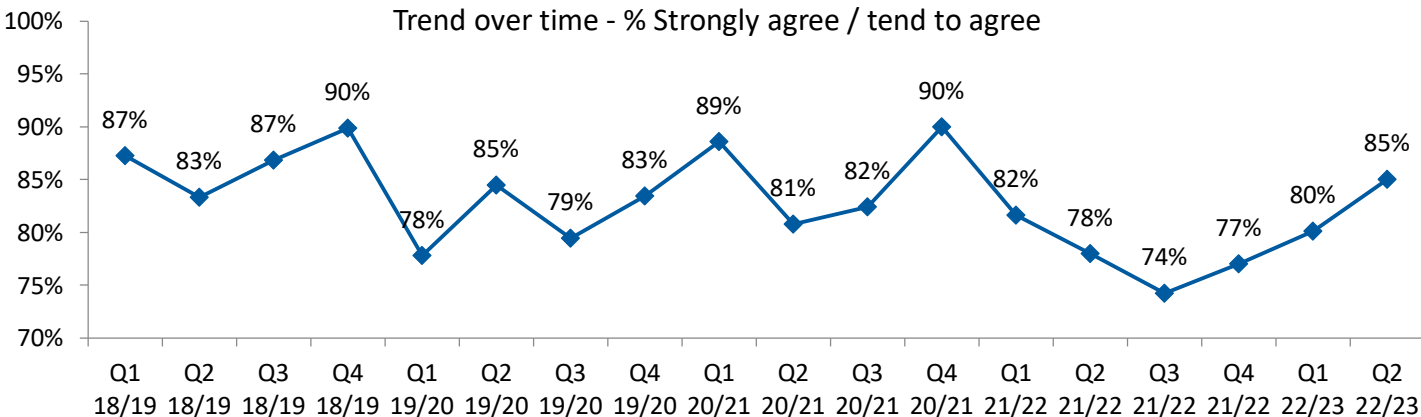

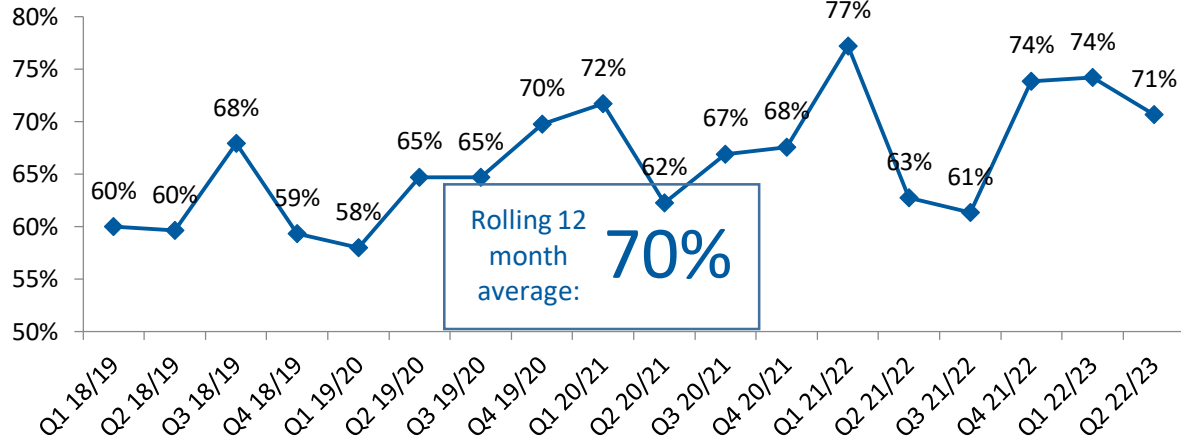
Thinking about your local area. How often would you say you see a police officer or Police Community Support Officer (PCSO)? - % At least weekly



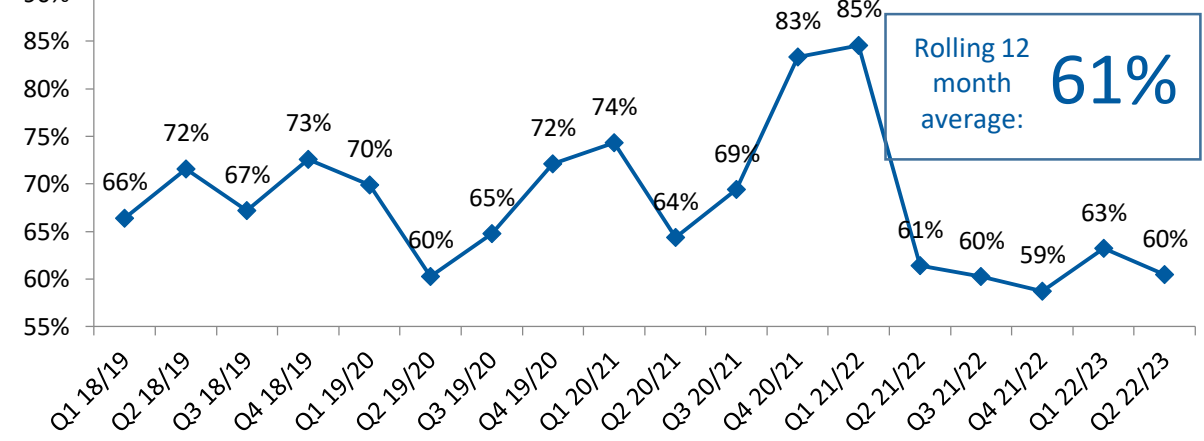

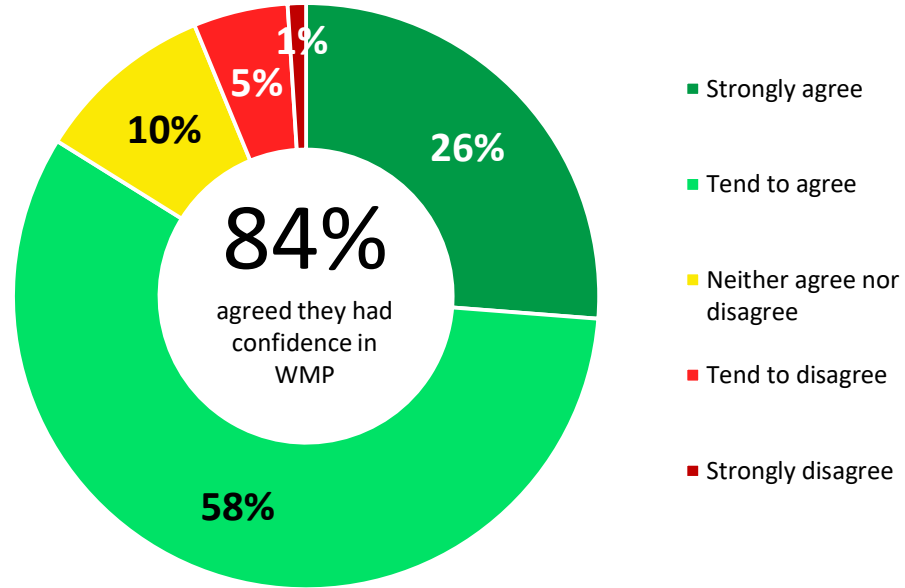

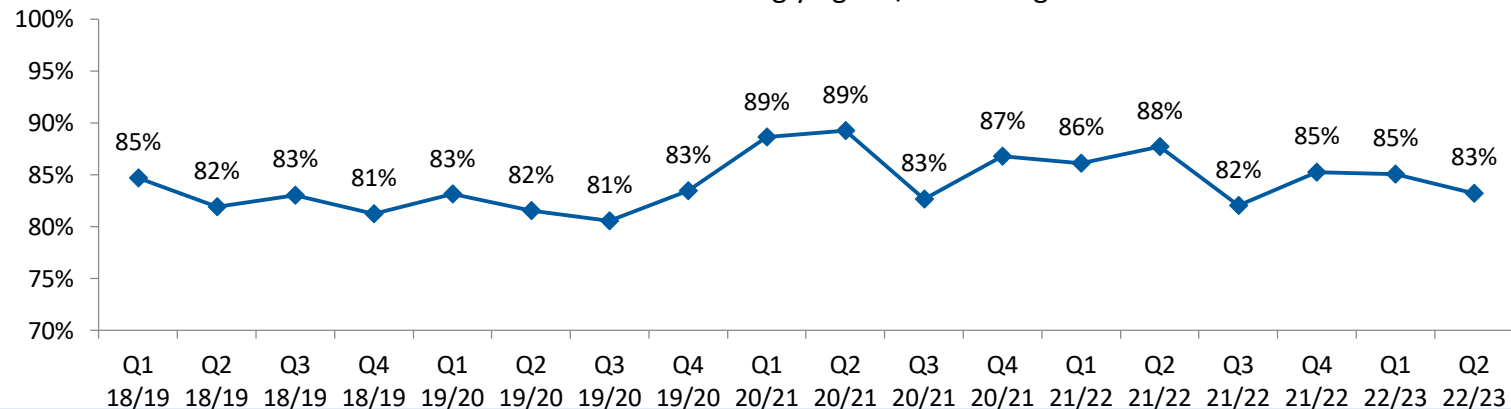

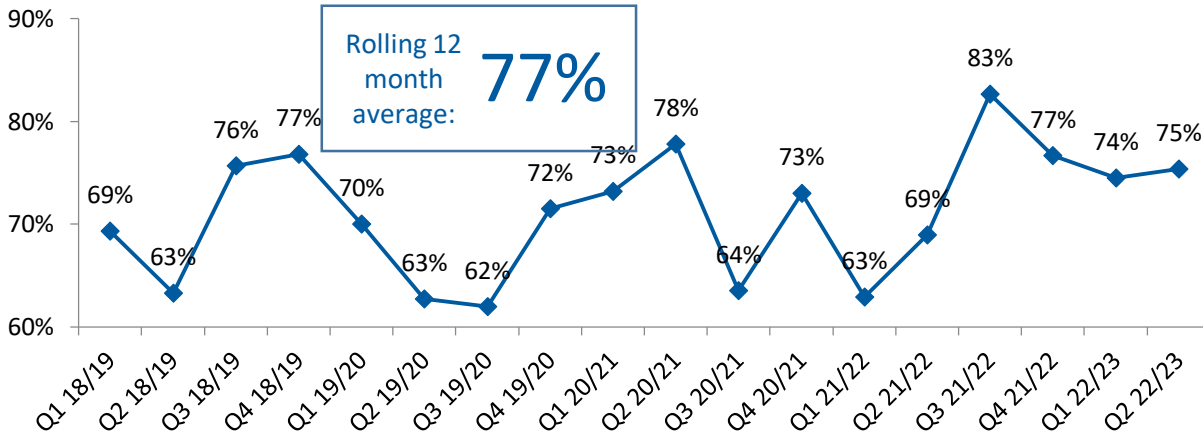
Thinking about your local area. How often would you say you see a police officer or Police Community Support Officer (PCSO)? - % At least weekly



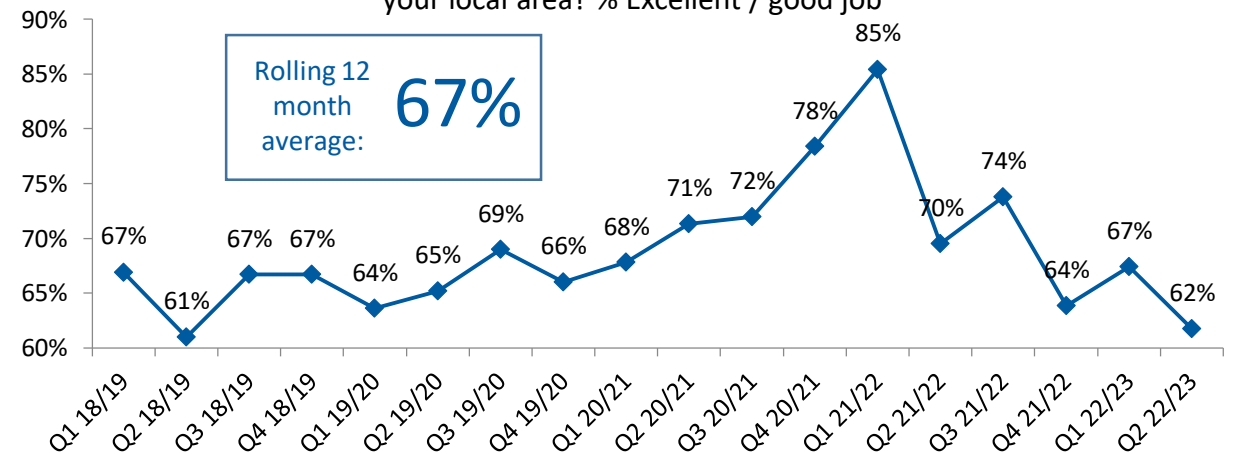

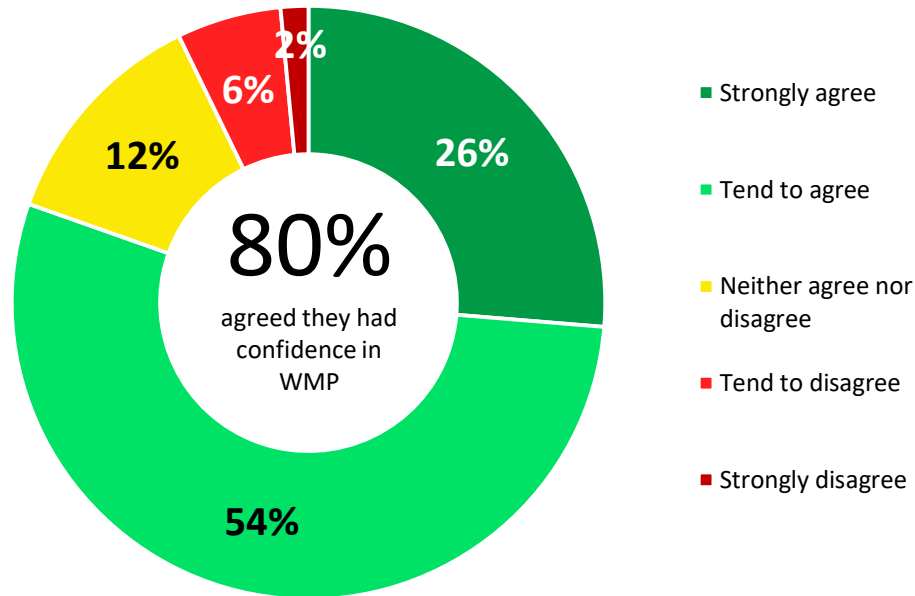

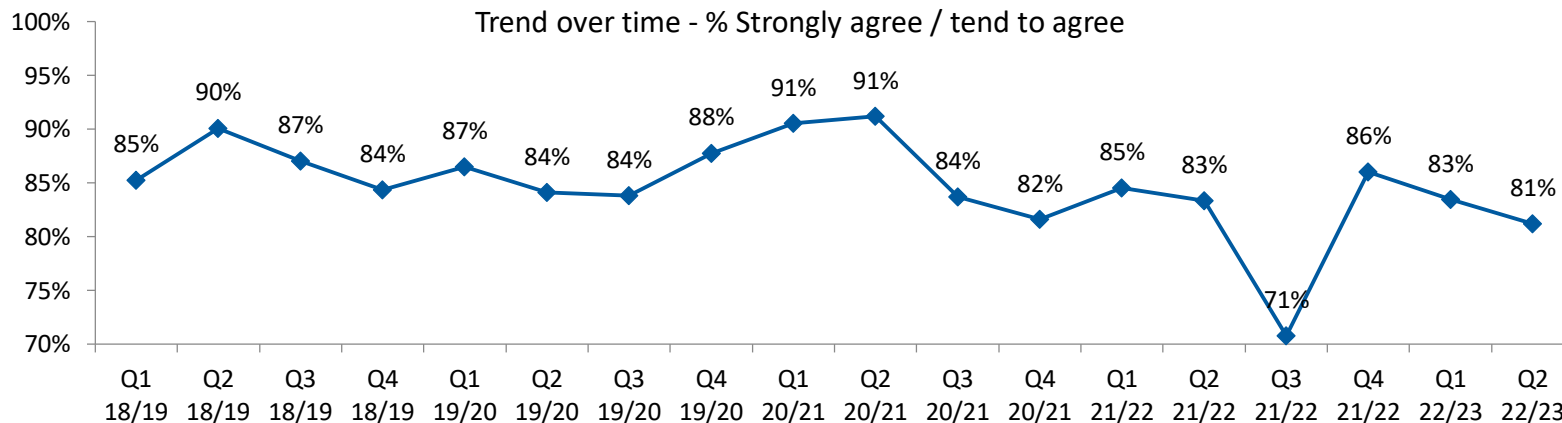

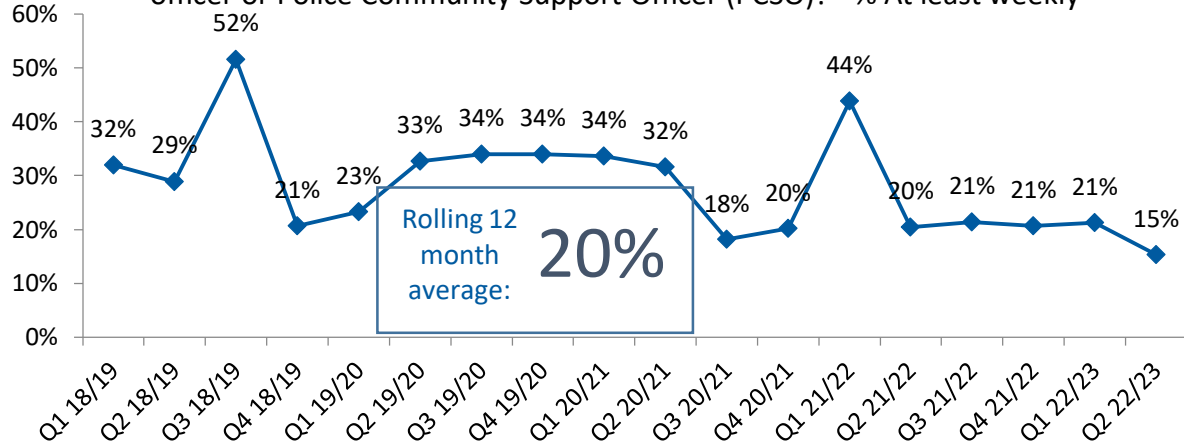

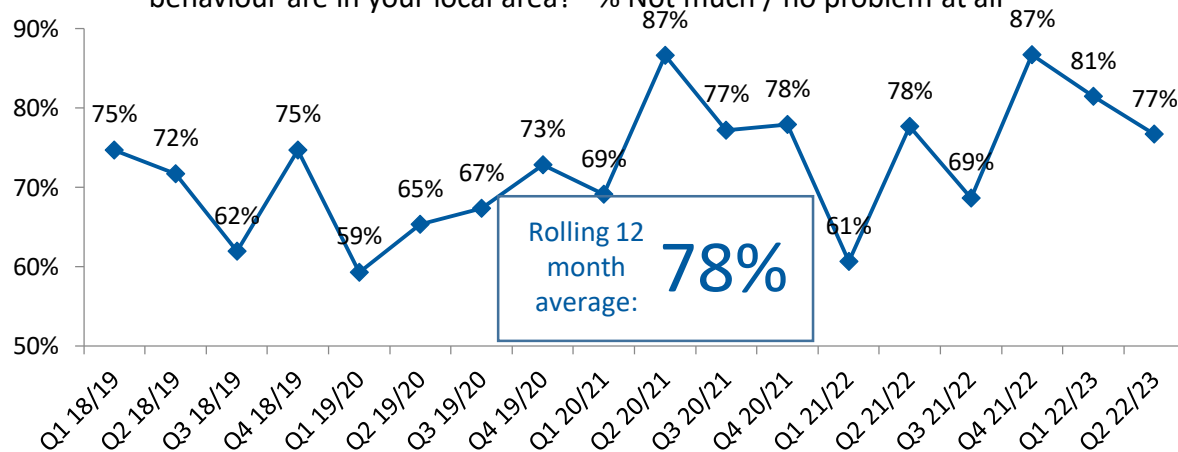
Thinking about your local area. How often would you say you see a police officer or Police Community Support Officer (PCSO)? - % At least weekly



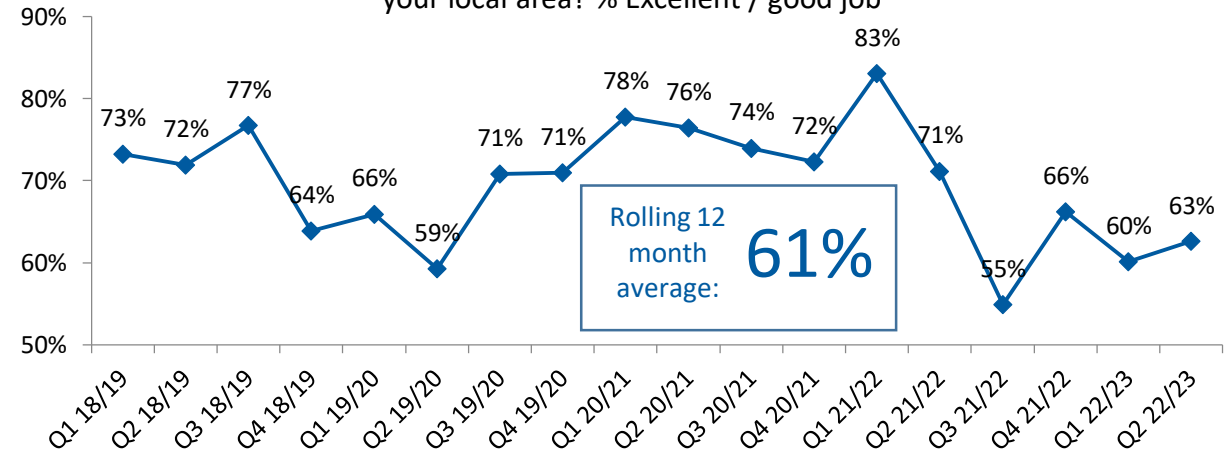

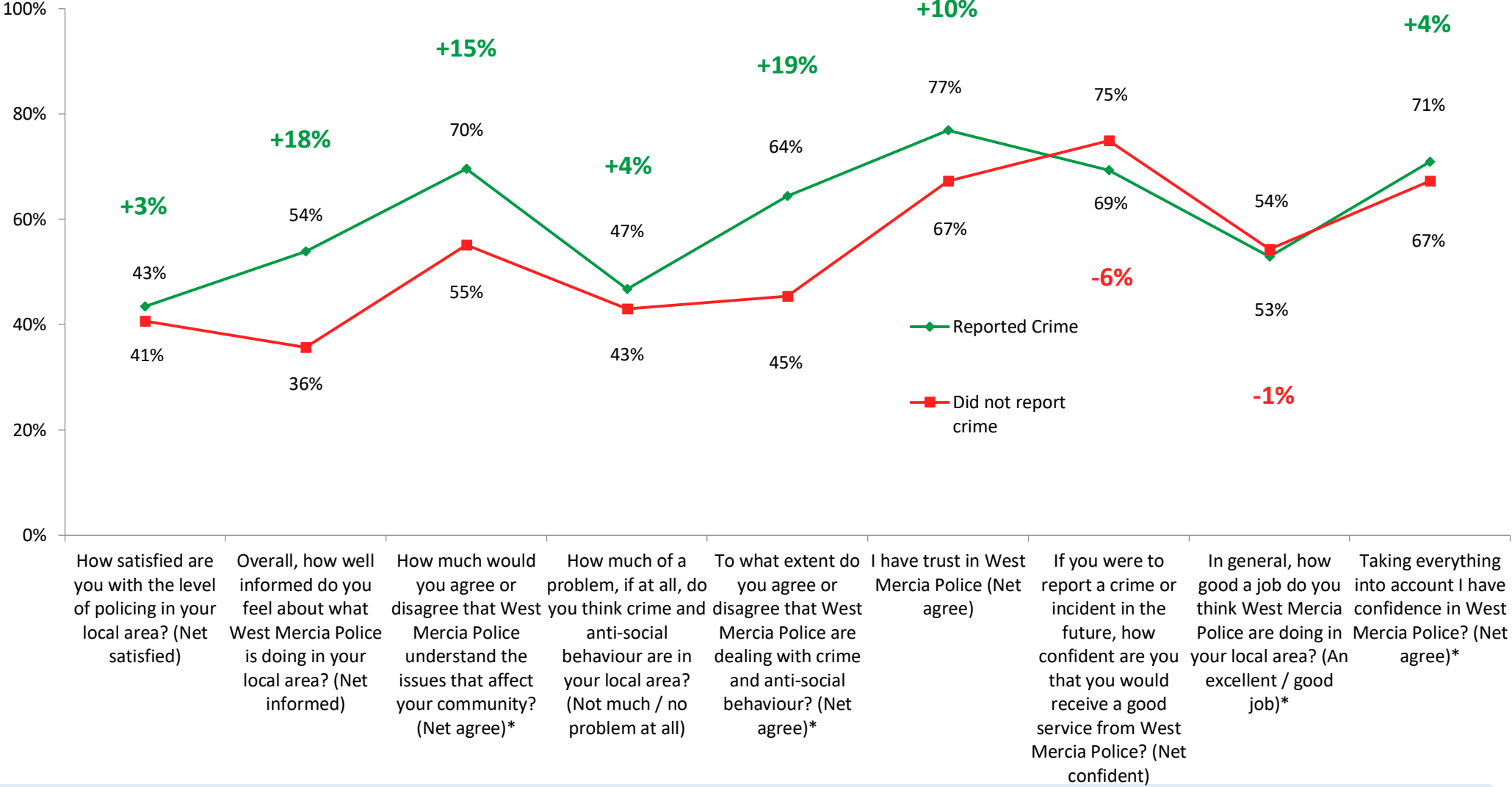
