The purpose of this product is to provide a quarterly update to current and emerging performance issues relating to West Mercia.



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
- Year To Date runs to last day of the previous month.
- Forces are ordered lowest to highest crimes per 1000 population left to right.

Key crimes - OC1-8 (minus 5) - Action Taken

Disposal dates can be added retrospectively, therefore previous months data will be refreshed and will most likely differ from previous reports.

PEEL Spotlight Report – West Mercia is in line with the national proportion rate (2022/2023) for 'Offences Brought to Justice' at 11%. However there has been a dramatic decrease for this grouping since 2015 nationally.

Please note 'Offences Brought to Justice' includes OC5 – Offender has died, OC9 – Prosecution Not In the Public Interest (CPS) and OC22 – Diversionary, educational or intervention activity, in addition to 'Action Taken'.



- * National methodology used. This incorporates burglary of a shed or other out building not connected to the main property in to Residential Burglary instead of Business & Community Burglary inline with national reporting practises.
- MSG analysis for Action Taken is currently under development therefore OC1&1A is shown above. Forces are ordered best to worse left to right.
- Outcome rates have been calculated using LPA Geography **not** OIC Command.
- Action Taken = Charge/Summons, Caution, Taken Into Consideration, Penalty Notice for Disorder, Cannabis Warning, Community Resolution.






Public Confidence Headlines

- As at end March 23, with a figure of **82%**, the force remains **significantly below the target of 88%**, while confidence has decreased slightly since last quarter (from 83%) (this decrease is not statistically significant).
- From the period ending March 2021, there remains a **statistically significant decline in public confidence** decreasing from 86%.




Public Confidence: Drivers


- From the **period ending June 2021**, there has been a **statistically significant decline in all drivers**.
- The **decline is most marked with the drivers**: 'police can be relied upon to be there when you need them' and 'police have a good reputation amongst local people' **both falling by 8%**.
- The **drivers have remained unchanged since last quarter**, with exception of [police] 'take people's concerns seriously', which has increased slightly (although this increase is not statistically significant).



2. Public Contact and Call Handling - Emergency Response Times by Grade

Due to SAAB being unable to back record convert data, analysis and insight is only available from March 2022 onwards.





Key Points

- 74% of Grade 1 incidents were attended within 20 minutes. This is 16 percentage points below the target and is a decrease of 3 percentage points compared to the previous month.
- **79%** of **Grade 2** incidents were attended within 2 hours. This is a **decrease** of **2 percent points** compared to the previous month.


What does this mean?


- Grade 2 'Dispatch time' has remained similar to the previous month, recording the third lowest time since recording began in March 2022.
- 'Officer Time' made up the highest proportion of Grade 2 incident response time for the third time since recording began in March 2022.
- It is almost certain that the decrease in Grade 2 incidents high 'dispatch time' is driven by the training and grading changes made on 03 April 2023. This is an improvement.

Target:

- Grade 1 90% attendance within target of 20 mins.
- Grade 2 Reduction in dispatch time.

Target has been reviewed and agreed by the subject lead in June 2022.








999 Performance Target Answering 90% of calls in 10 secs

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


Key points

- In June 2023 the OCC observed a 10.3% increase in 999 call demand compared to May 2023 and a 37.5% increase compared to June last year.
- 21,372 calls received; the highest level ever recorded by the force in one month. This was driven by national issues with Android phones causing accidental dials, a Knife Incident at Telford Train Station on 14 June, a Staffordshire 999 fault on 16 June and national 999 outage on the 25 June.
- 76% of 999 calls were answered within 10 seconds a decrease of 10 percentage points against performance in the previous month and substantially below the target.
- 20 calls were passed onto buddy forces 8 more than the previous month. Note that Buddy call data has a one month lag.
- Capacity of the OCC call handlers was exceeded throughout last month. PSL was continually reviewed and contingencies put in place.
- There remains a concern that a technical fault is negatively impacting performance and remains under investigation by Digital Services.



2. Public Contact and Call Handling 101 Median Wait Time



Key points

- June 2023 median wait time was 2 minute 57 seconds, a 45 second increase on the previous month.
- It is highly probable that this is driven by the increased demand for 999 and 101 calls and the decrease in call handler resource as 999 calls will take precedence.

2. Public Contact and Call Handling 101 Answered by Interval

Data relates to answered calls.

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Key points


- 38% of 101 calls were answered in 30 seconds or less last month. This is a decrease of 6 percentage points compared to previous month.
- 30% of 101 calls were answered in within 5 minutes. This
 was a decrease of 7 percentage points compared to the
 previous month.
- 30% of 101 calls were answered in over 7 minutes. This was an increase of 7 percentage points compared to the previous month.
- 101 demand increased by 5.5% compared to the previous month and by 8.3% compared to June 2022.
- Decreases in performance are driven by the substantially high number of 999 calls leading to exceeding the capacity of OCC call handlers.



3. Road Safety – Killed and Seriously Injured

 KSI casualties have increased 44% (12) from the previous month however are within the upper and lower thresholds.


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
- KSI collisions have increased 60% (12) from last month however are within the upper and lower threshold.
- YTM 2023/2024 Fatal Casualties have increased by 38%
 (3) compared to YTM 2022/2023.
- YTM 2023/2024 Serious Casualties have decreased by 30% (24) compared to YTM 2022/2023.
- YTM 2023/2024 45% (5) of fatalities are motorcyclists.

What does this mean?

- 28% (9) of collisions involved a motorcyclist, of which 4 occurred in Shropshire and 2 in North Worcestershire and Herefordshire in the previous month.
- The **Department for Transport's** latest report in March 2023 on **road usage** shows that, generally, **national road usage** is in line with **pre Covid-19 levels.**
- Therefore it is **probable** that the **increase** in **fuel costs** are continuing to **not impact on road usage.**





What does this mean?

- North Worcestershire saw the only increase 8% (39), driven by an increases in Domestic Abuse Investigation 29% (41) and Stalking 51% (21).
- Herefordshire saw the largest decrease of 9% (25) last month, driven by decreases in Domestic Abuse Investigations, 16% (16) and Public Fear, Alarm and Distress 92% (11).
- 18% (372) of crimes relate to Stalking and Harassment, a decrease of 7% (28) from the previous month. Decreases were recorded in all LPAs except North Worcestershire.


