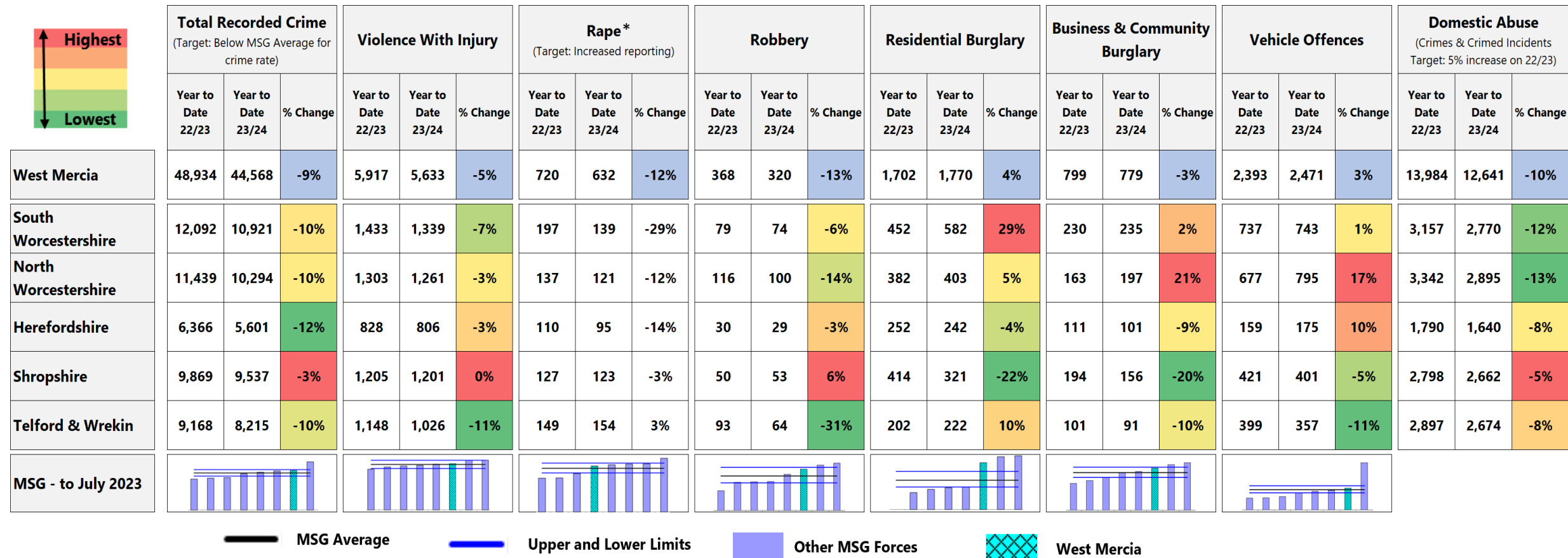

Force KPIs - Key Crimes - Summary

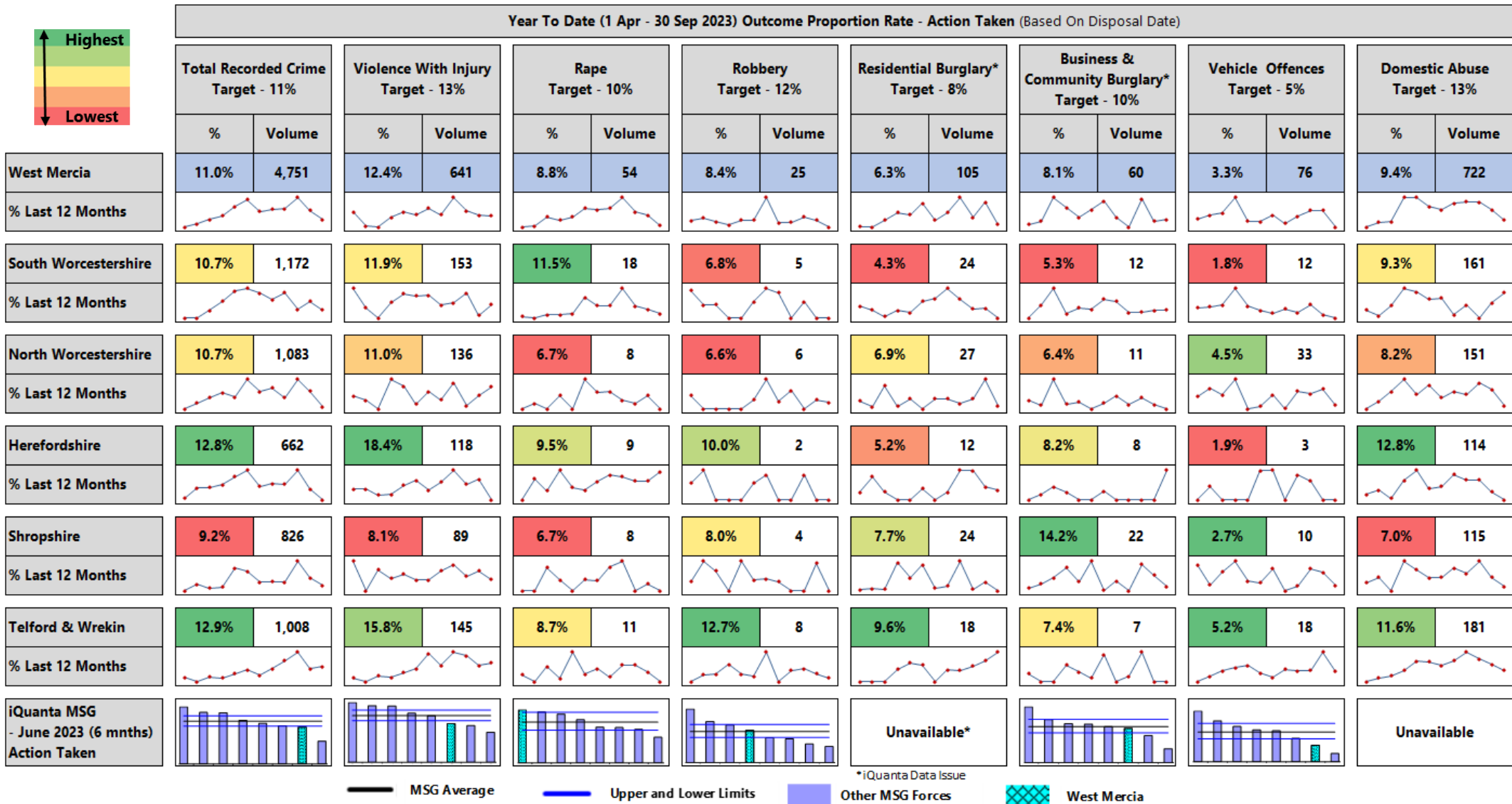

iQuanta – A ratio is calculated by taking the outcome volumes divided by crimes recorded in the given time period.
ForceSight – This uses an outcomes average and doesn't take into account crime volumes.

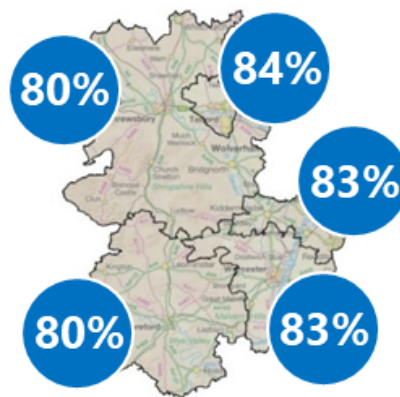
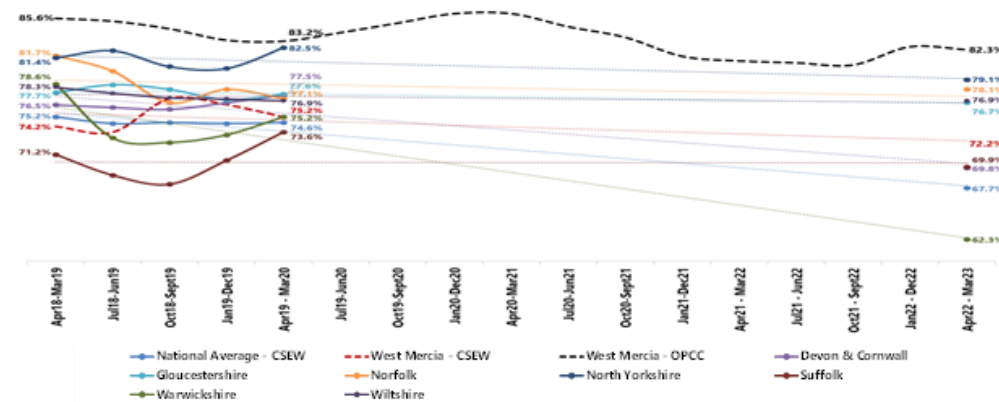

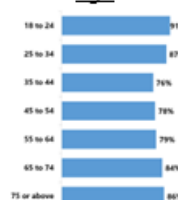

**Trend Data****Public Confidence Headlines**

- As at end June 23, with a figure of **82%**, the force remains **markedly below the target of 88%** while confidence has remained the same since last quarter.
- From the period ending March 2021, there remains a **statistically significant decline in public confidence** – decreasing from 86%.
- CSEW data shows that between the year ending March 2020 and March 2023, **all MSG forces have experienced decreases in public confidence, with the exception of Norfolk** (1% increase to 78.1%) **and Wiltshire** (no change – 76.9%). **West Mercia experienced a 3% decrease in overall public confidence**, falling to 72.2%; this is a smaller decrease when compared to that seen nationally (7% fall to 67.7%). Conversely, Warwickshire and Devon & Cornwall experienced more marked decreases relative to the national average (13% decrease to 62.3% and 8% decrease to 69.8%, respectively).

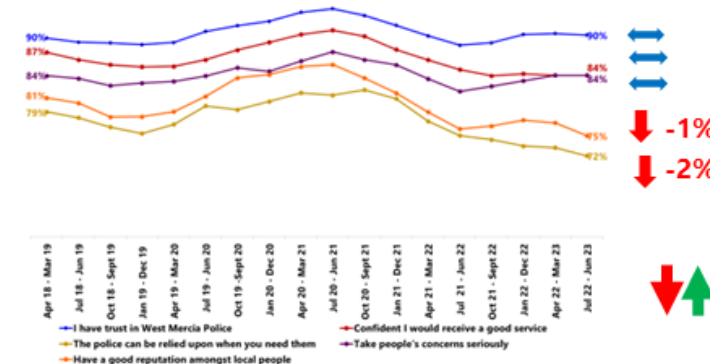

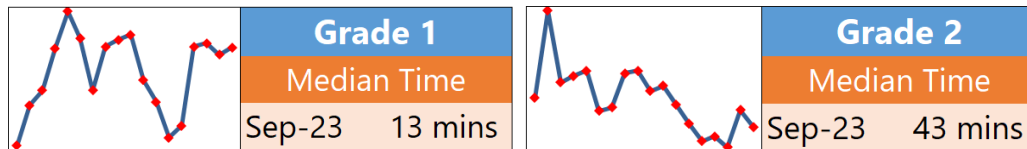
Public Confidence: Drivers

- From the **period ending June 2021**, there has been a **statistically significant decline in all drivers**.
- The **decline is most marked with the drivers: 'police can be relied upon to be there when you need them' and 'police have a good reputation amongst local people' – both falling by 9% and 11%, respectively.**
- The **drivers have remained unchanged since last quarter**, with exception of [police] 'can be relied upon when you need them' and 'have a good reputation amongst local people', which have decreased by 1% and 2%, respectively. These decreases were not statistically significant.

2. Public Contact and Call Handling - Emergency Response Times by Grade



Key Points

- **73% of Grade 1 incidents were attended within 20 minutes.** This is **16 percentage points** below the **target** and is a **decrease of 2 percentage points** compared to the same month last year.
- **75% of Grade 2 incidents were attended within 2 hours.** This is an **increase of 8 percent points** compared to the same month last year.
- The **target** remains **under review** in line with the **grading changes** made on **03 April 2023**.

What does this mean?

- **Grade 2 'Dispatch time'** has **remained consistent** following the large decrease with the **grading changes** made on **03 April 2023**.
- **'Dispatch Time'** has made up the **highest proportion** of **Grade 2 incident response time** for the **first time** since the **grading changes** made on **03 April 2023**.
- It is **almost certain** that the **decrease** in **Grade 2 incidents high 'dispatch time'** is **driven** by the **training** and **grading changes** made on **03 April 2023**. This is an **improvement**.

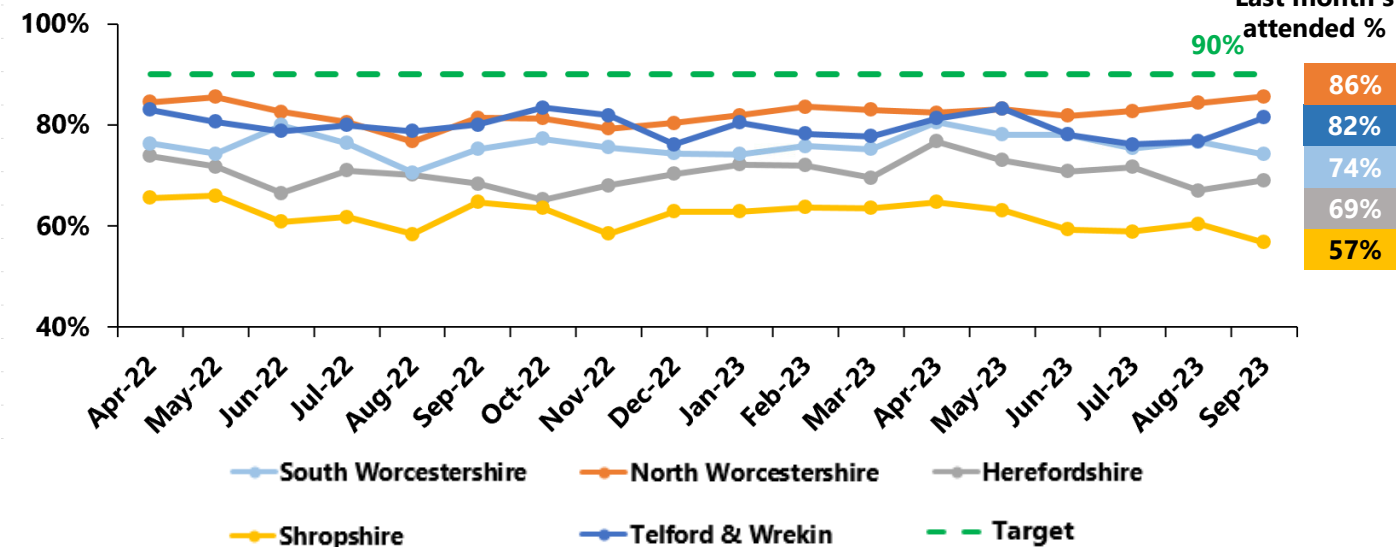

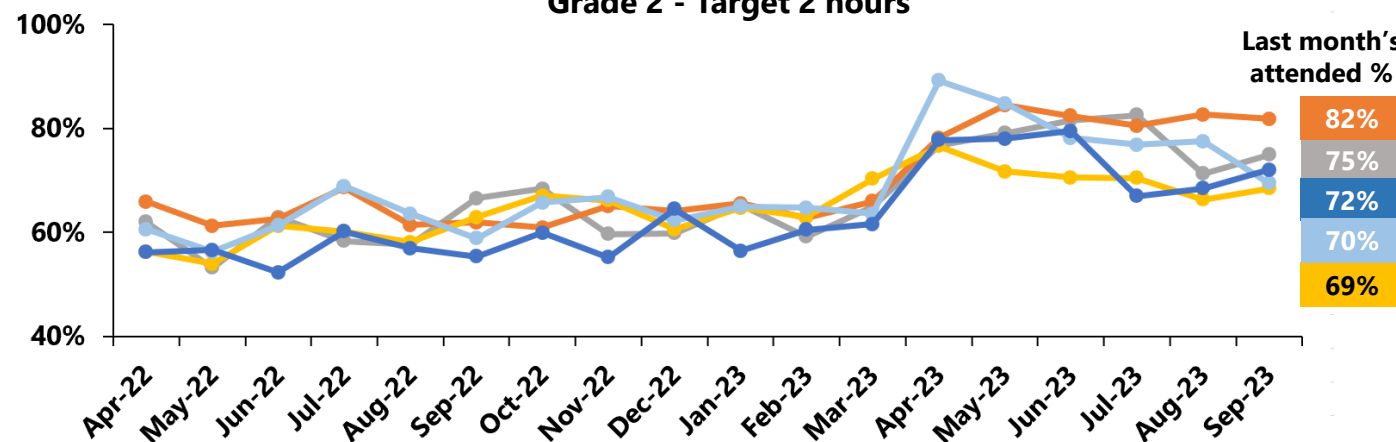

West Mercia Attended with target % Grade 2 - Target 2 hours



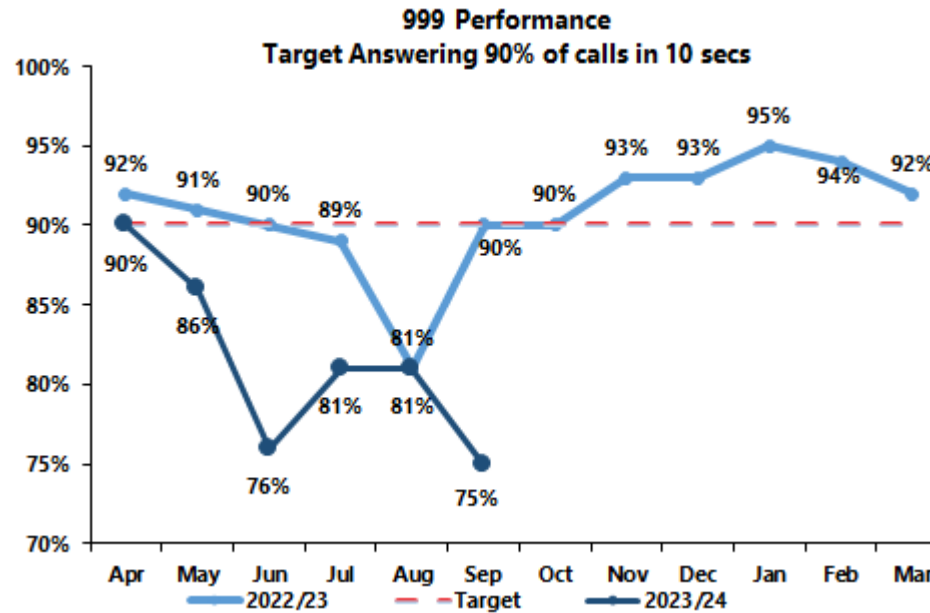

2. Public Contact and Call Handling

999 Performance – Internal Data

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Key points

- In **September 2023** the OCC observed a **0.3% decrease** in **999 call demand** compared to **the previous month** and an **increase of 18.5%** compared to **September last year**.
- **75% of 999 calls were answered within 10 seconds** – a **decrease of 6 percentage points** against performance in the previous month and substantially below the target.
- **6 calls** were passed onto **buddy forces** – 23 less than the previous month. Note that Buddy call data has a one month lag and therefore relates to August 2023.
- Average 999 **talk time increased 2 seconds** from the previous month to **04:37**.
- **Warm weather** drove an **increase in demand** between **1 to 16 September**.
- **SAFE issues** were recorded between **9 to 12 September** including a **loss of system**. The outage **affected telephony** driving the decrease in performance.

2. Public Contact and Call Handling

Key points

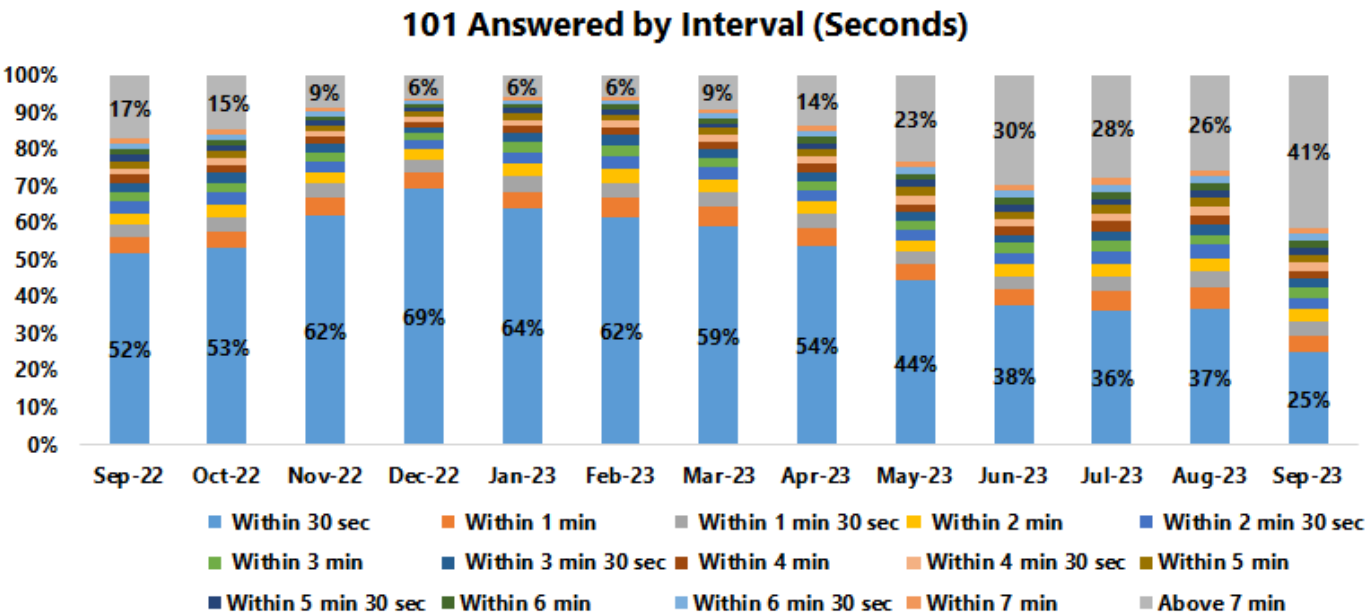
- **25% of 101 calls** were answered in **30 seconds or less** last month. This is a **decrease of 12 percentage points** compared to previous month.
- **51% of 101 calls** were answered in **within 5 minutes**. This was a **decrease of 16 percentage points** compared to the previous month.
- **41% of 101 calls** were answered in **over 7 minutes**. This was an **increase of 15 percentage points** compared to the previous month.
- **101 demand decreased by 2.6%** compared to the previous month.
- **999 demand** increases and **SAFE outage** have likely had an **impact on 101 call handling** including wrap up due to paper records. The back record conversion from this also created additional demand.

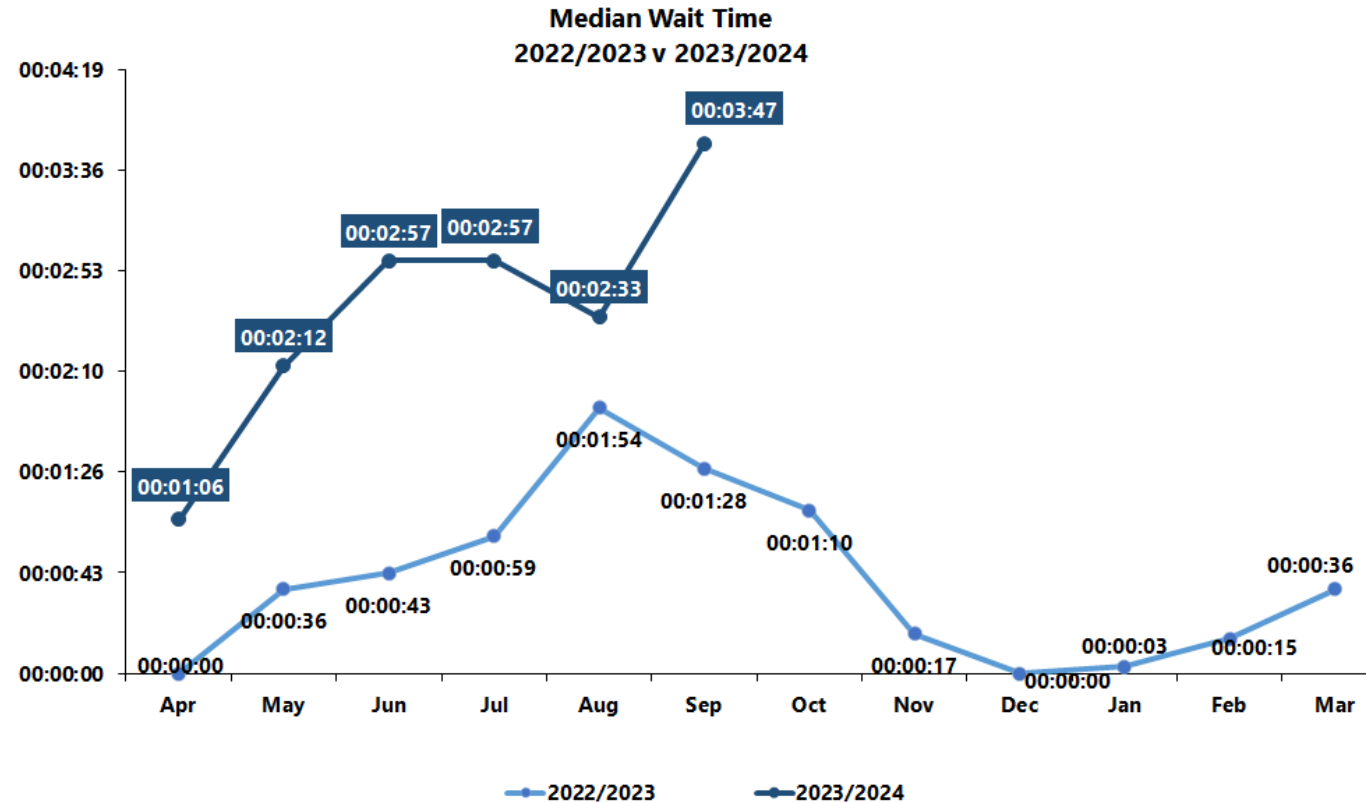

- **September 2023 median wait time** was **3 minute 57 seconds**, a **1 minute 14 second increase** on the previous month.
- It is **highly probable** that this is driven by the **outage issues** that affected **999 calls** which negatively impacts 101 calls.

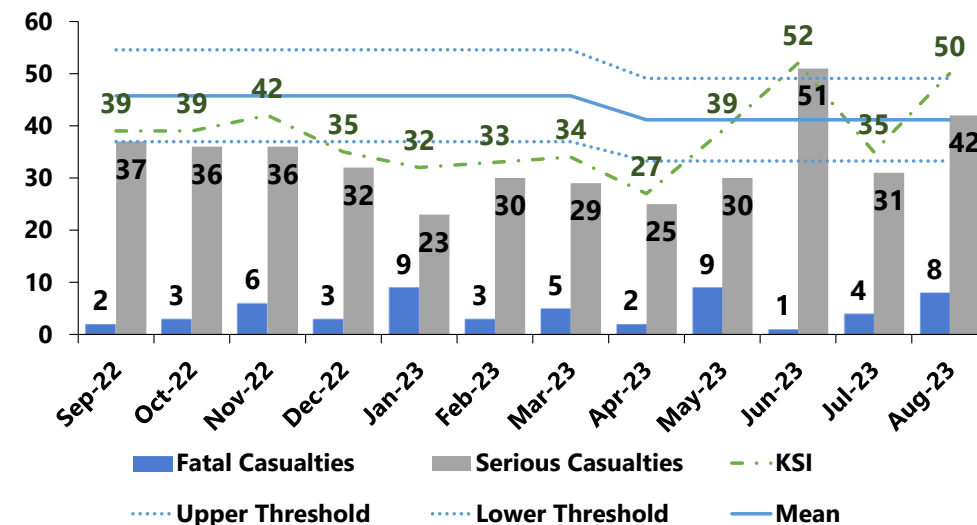
Key Points

- YTD 2023/24 Fatal Casualties have **increased** by 26% (5) compared to YTD 2022/23.
- YTD 2023/24 Fatal Collisions have **increased** by 10% (2) compared to YTD 2022/23.
- YTD 2023/24 Serious Casualties have **decreased** by 19% (42) compared to YTD 2022/23.
- YTD 2023/24 Serious Collisions have **decreased** by 24% (45) compared to YTD 2022/23.
- YTD 2023/24 46% (11) of fatalities are **motorcyclists**.

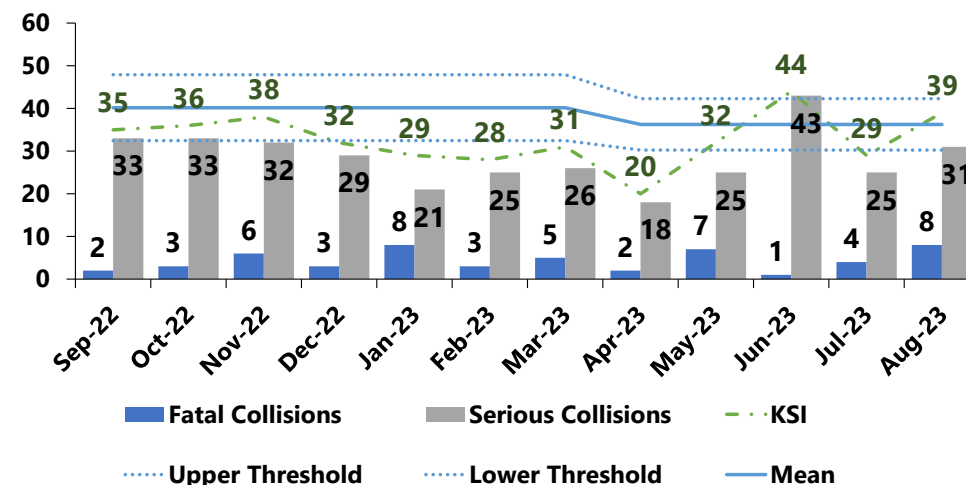
What does this mean?

- **38% (15) of collisions** involved a **motorcyclist**, of which **5** occurred in **South Worcestershire**, **4** in **Shropshire**, **3** in **Herefordshire**, **2** in **North Worcestershire** and **1** in **Telford & Wrekin** in **August 2023**.
 - There were **no repeat locations**.
 - **5 collisions** occurred on a **Monday** and **5** on a **Wednesday**.
- The **Department for Transport's** latest report in March 2023 on **road usage** shows that, generally, **national road usage** is in line with **pre Covid-19 levels**.
- Therefore, it is **probable** that the **increase in fuel costs** are continuing to **not impact on road usage**.

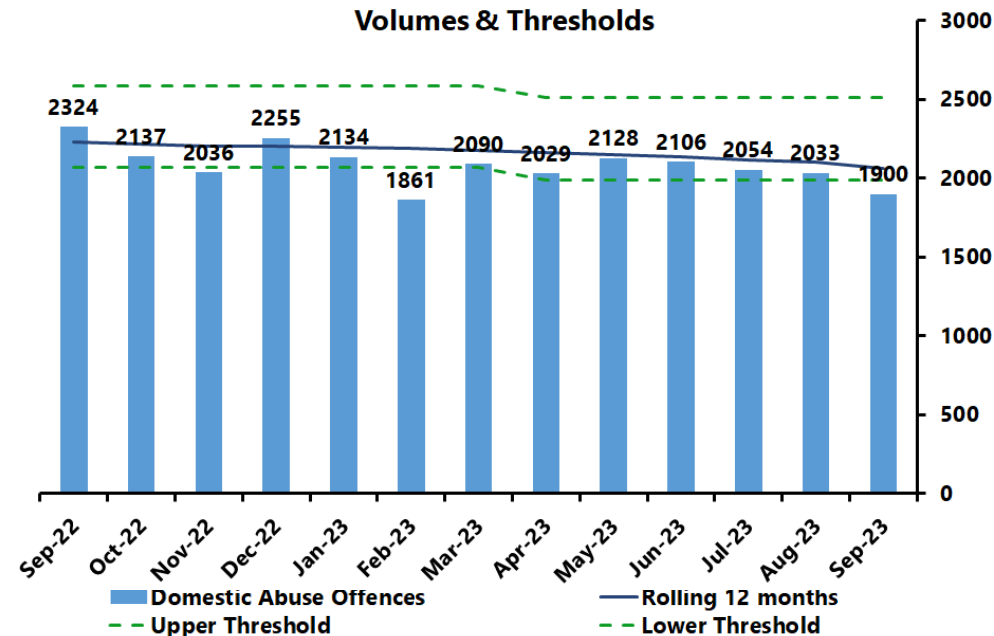
What does this mean?

- **Decreases** are recorded in all LPAs except **South Worcestershire** which saw an **increase** of **8% (65)**.
- **North Worcestershire** saw the largest **decrease** of **14% (65)** last month, driven by decreases in **Assault without Injury, 29% (22)** and **Other Criminal Damage 100% (9)**; the third consecutive month of decrease.
- **20% (372)** of crimes relate to **Stalking and Harassment**, an **increase of 5% (19)** from the previous month. This was driven by an increase of **41% (13)** in **Herefordshire**.
- **40% (2)** of all **homicides in 2023/2024** relate to **Domestic Abuse**, as at the end of September 2023.
- The **12-month rolling average** has **decreased** through the 2023/2024 year with volumes having **decreased** for the **last 4 months**.

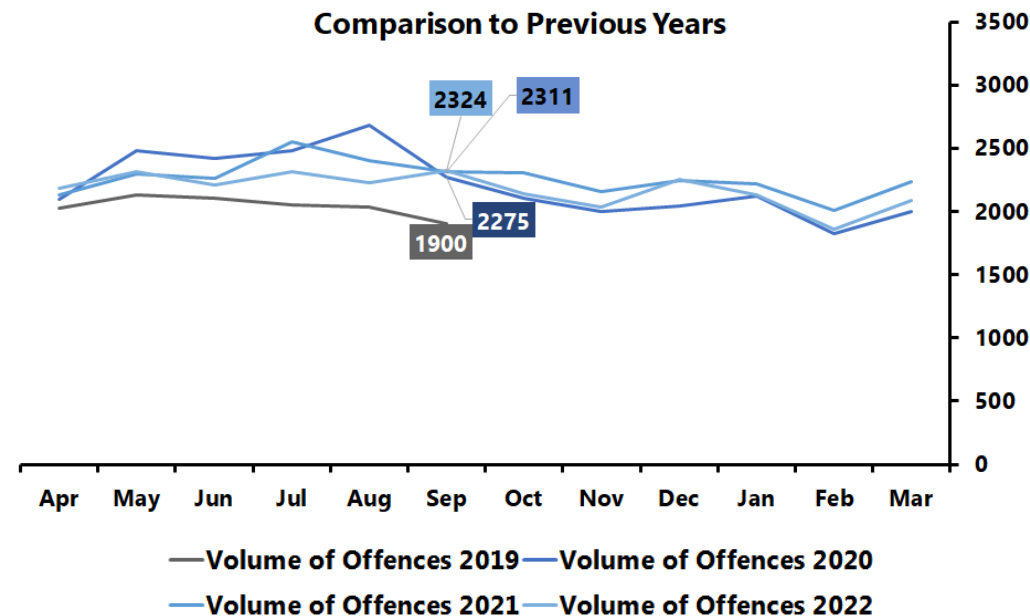
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Domestic Abuse Crimes & Crimed Incidents -

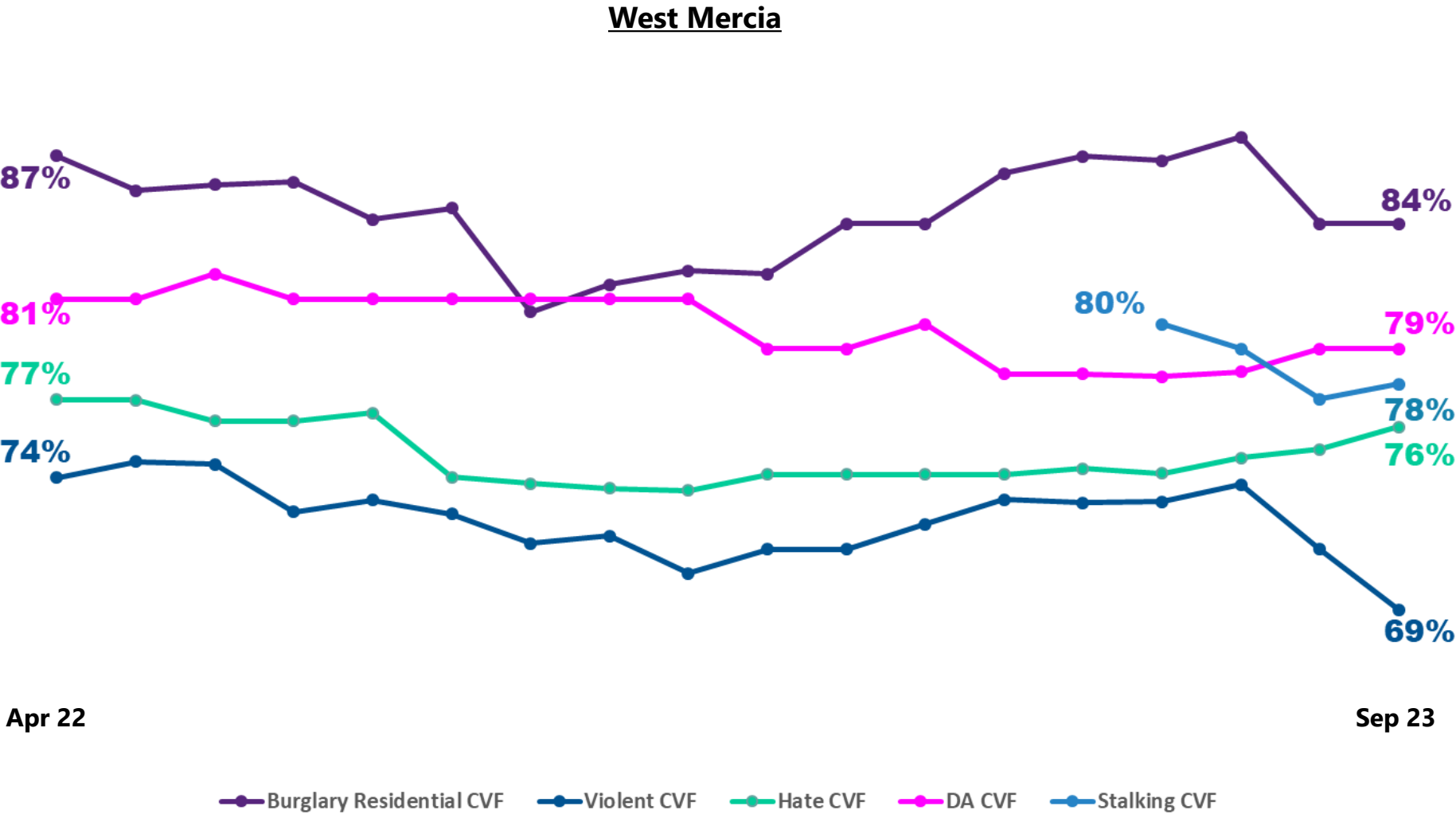

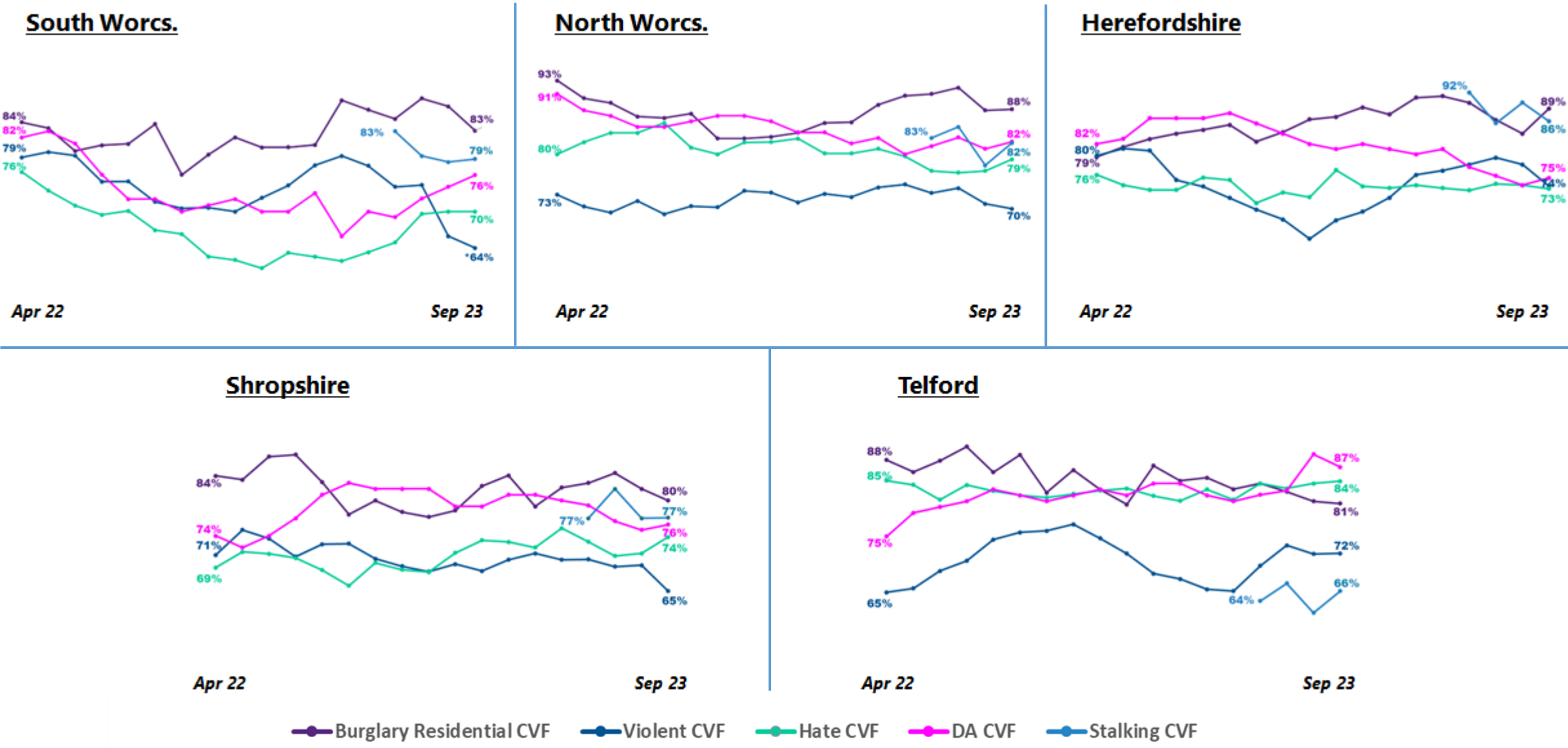
